and the prime accused, for a stay on trial.

"Employment generation could have never taken place in Bihar under people who made aspirants part with their land in the name of providing jobs," said the PM.

In contrast, he pointed out, "lakhs of youths in Bihar" have got loans under the Mudra Yojana promoting self-employment, and his government has also launched other schemes like Rs 15,000 assistance to youth getting their first jobs in the private sector.

"The scheme will be rolled out on August 1 and the Centre will be bearing an expenditure of Rs one lakh crore for the same," said Modi.

He also raised slogans in Hindi, roughly translating "we will build a new Bihar with the NDA in power once again" and "the resolve of Bihar is unshaken, to remain with the NDA always".

Modi alleged that under the RJD-Congress rule, the poor could not afford pucca houses and the relatively better off "feared getting their homes whitewashed or distempered, as this could attract the attention of marauding gangs involved in kidnapping for ransom". In contrast, he said, over the past 11 years, "four crore houses have been built across the country under the PM Awas Yojana, of which 50 lakh are in Bihar. This figure surpasses the total population of countries like Norway, New Zealand and Singapore". "In Motihari alone, the around three lakh families have got pucca houses and the figure continues to grow. Today, more than 12,000 families have got keys to their new houses and 40,000 families have received funds in their bank accounts to build pucca houses", said the PM, whose speech was preceded by launch of development projects worth more than Rs 7,000 crore.

Besides the Bihar CM, who is a key NDA partner, the PM shared the stage with Governor Arif Mohammed Khan, besides Union ministers belonging to the state, including Chirag Paswan, Jitan Ram Manjhi, Rajiv Ranjan Singh alias Lalan, Nityanand Rai and Ramnath Thakur.

Bovine smuggling bids foiled; 4 arrested, 16 bovines rescued

RAJOURI/UDHAMPUR: In a strong action against bovine smuggling, Rajouri Police foiled a bovine smuggling attempt during routine naka checking at Khalsa Chowk rajouri.

A police team from Police Station Rajouri intercepted two vehicles-bearing regis tration numbers JK11B 9450 driven by Mohd Hafiez S/O Mohd Hanif R/O Ari Mendhar and JK11F 5651 driven by Mohd Irfan S/O Mohd Rafiq R/O Kangota Khawas Rajouri.

During Checking, total of 10 bovine animals were found being transported with out any valid permission or documentation. The animals were loaded in a highly cruel manner.

Woman arrested for assault on GMC doctors; strike called off **STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: The two-day strike by junior doctors at Government Medical College (GMC) Jammu, which had crippled emergency and outpatient services, was called off on Friday following the arrest of a woman involved in a violent assault on a female postgraduate doctor inside the hospital's emergency wing.

The incident, captured on CCTV and widely circulated, occurred on July 16 short after the death of a 65-year-old critically ill patient, referred from PGIME Chandigarh, who was suffering from a brain hemorrhage and succumbed to respi ratory arrest Moments after the announcement of his death, a group of attendants reportedly stormed the emergency area. In the footage, a woman can be seen verbally abusing and physically attacking two female doctors, including kicking one in the abdomen The injured doctor, a first-year postgraduate, was admitted with internal bleeding Her condition is now reported to be stable. The violent attack sparked widespread outrage across the medical community and led to an immediate strike by junior doctors, who demanded the attacker's arrest and called for urgent enhancements in hospital security. "We called off the strike around 2:00 PM today after being informed that the assailant has been arrested. This is a crucial step toward justice," said Dr. Sandeep Singh, President of the Resident Doctors' Association (RDA), GMC Jammu "However, for long-term safety, we will be approaching the DIG Jammu with support from our Principal. We are pressing for comprehensive security measures throughout the hospital-not just in the emergency ward." Medical associations across the region have reiterated demands for stringent safe y protocols, including permanent police presence in sensitive hospital zones and strict enforcement of legal provisions protecting healthcare workers. While normal services have resumed, the episode has once again underscored the vulnerability of frontline medical professionals and reignited calls for systemic reform to ensure their safety.

ACB arrests JDA...

a discreet verification was conducted, which corroborates the demand of bribe by the public servant concerned and accordingly, a case FIR No. 14/2025 U/S 7 of Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 was registered in Police Station ACB Jammu and investigation taken up. Moreover, search is being conducted in the residential house of the accused situated in Flore Haramkund Gajansoo, Tehsil Marh, District Jammu in presence of independent witness and Magistrate, official said adding that further investigation of the instant case is going on.

ANTF Kashmir seizes large cache of poppy straw STATE TIMES NEWS

BUDGAM: In a significant development in the ongoing fight against drug trafficking, the Anti-Narcotics Task Force (ANTF), Kashmir has successful ly recovered a substantial quantity of illicit contraband, furthering its commitment to eradicating the drug menace from the UT.

Acting on specific intelligence inputs, a dedicated team of ANTF conducted meticulously planned operation at Mulashulla, District Budgam, leading to the recovery of huge quantity of poppy straw (locally known as fukki).

The contraband was concealed in a manner intended to avoid detection, but the swift and professional response of the ANTF personnel ensured its seizure. The accused identified as Mohammad Maqbool Ganaie son of Ghulam Hussain Ganaie resident of Mulashulla Beerwah Budgam was apprehended on the spot and taken into custody.

Accordingly, a case under sections of NDPS Act was registered at ANTF Kashmir, and investigation has been initiated to unearth the backward and forward linkages of the narcotic supply chain.
