#### **Power cuts increasing** farmers including Jammu's commitment to CSIR-IIIM, encouraged the on inauguration of Rakhi heritage of Jammu. public hardships: Balbir Task Force Meeting on Ease of Doing Business held in Srinagar, CCI Jammu president suggests major reforms

JAMMU: BJP senior leader and former Vice Chairman Balbir Ram Rattan has expressed deep concern over the increasing power cuts in Jammu. He stated that at a time when temperature and humidity are at their peak, regular and uninterrupted power supply has become a basic necessity for the people. He pointed out that despite assurances from the electricity department of 24-hour power supply in metered areas, there are frequent daily power cuts in the city and surrounding areas, causing significant difficulties for the general public, including students, traders, housewives, and senior citizens. Balbir said that in many areas, electricity goes out multiple times a day, and in rural areas, it remains unavailable for hours. This not only causes inconvenience in households but also severely impacts business activities. Children's online education. health-related needs of the elderly, and daily routines of life are being badly disrupted. He urged the administration to prioritize power supply during these harsh summer days and ensure a system that provides electricity without any interruptions. Balbir also suggested that the power department should be held accountable for such cuts. Balbir Ram was discussing the problems being faced by people due to power cuts during the summer season with a group of BJP senior activists.

SRINAGAR: A meeting of the Task Force constituted by the Government of India to review De-Regulation, Compliance Reduction, and Ease of Doing Business reforms was held in Srinagar. The meeting was chaired by Pathak, Special K.K. Cabinet Secretary, Secretariat, Government

During the meeting, prominent industrialist and CCI Jammu president Arun Gupta presented a detailed set of written suggestions highlighting the

need for practical implementation mechanisms and accountability to ensure real-time results of these reforms. He emphasized that a positive and responsible mindset among implementing authorities is essential to achieve the objectives of Ease of Doing Business. Gupta stressed that without fixing accountability for delays, the intended benefits of deregulation will remain on paper.

He raised concerns about the cumbersome process involved when running manufacturing units seek



to change their nature of business. Gupta pointed out that such units are often required to apply afresh for Change of Land Use (CLU), even when operating within commer-

cial zones, defeating the very purpose of simplification.

Further, he highlighted the difficulties faced by entrepreneurs in obtaining NOCs from various departments, despite the fact that the industrial land is developed and allotted by the Industries Department. He called for the removal of unnecessary departmental clearances, especially for green category units, and demanded that departments stick to their own mandates rather than imposing interdepartmental conditions.

instances where approval of house plans in JDA-developed colonies such as Gandhi Nagar faces delays due to demands for irrelevant NOCs, despite compliance with municipal bylaws. He emphasized that once land is approved by Housing and Urban Development departments, only the municipal corporation

A major concern raised was the limited validity of NOCs. Gupta urged that the Fire Department's

should have authority over

building plans.

NOC should be valid for at least five years instead of just one, while Pollution Control Board NOCs should have a 10-year validity. He also proposed relaxed norms for setting up industries in rural areas, such as permitting units on roads with 25-feet width instead of the current 40-feet requirement.

The meeting concluded with a consensus on the need for more streamlined, transparent, and industry-friendly regulations to boost investment and industrial growth in the region.
