He further alleged that about two years ago, blacktopping work was started on the Sunetar-Dhanu road, but was later dismantled by the department after it was found that the work was carried out without proper authorization on private land. Since then, no restoration has taken place.

Following the demonstration, a delegation of residents, social activists, and Panchayat members met a senior official in the district administration and submitted a formal memorandum of demands.

The memorandum emphasised immediate repair and restoration of Khas-Dhanu Dhanwalt road, construction of the Dhanu-Rang road under the PWD or NABARD scheme, and sanctioning of temporary repair funds, particularly to fill dangerous potholes and improve safety

The protestors lamented that for over six decades, the region's roads have faced administrative apathy, leaving villagers to trek long distances on foot. They stressed that the

lack of basic road infrastructure has hampered development, emergency access, and pilgrimage routes in the area. "Even in 2025, we are

forced to walk for miles due to broken roads and political neglect," said Balwan Singh. request the administration to wake up to our reality.'
