## DDC member arrested by ACB for taking bribe of Rs 50,000

SRINAGAR: A District Development Council member was caught red-handed by the Jammu and Kashmir Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) on Tuesday while accepting a bribe of Rs 50,000, official spokesperson said.

The accused District Development Council (DDC) member was identified as Mohammad Shaban Chopan, a resident of Dara Harwan here.

The ACB spokesperson said the anti-graft body received a complaint from a man running a scholar boarding school along with a swimming pool and a guest house in Check Dara, Harwan here.

He said an official inspec-

tion was conducted at the site and the complainant came to know that it was arranged by Chopan.

"Thereafter, the DDC member, through his tout, namely Ghulam Mohammad Khathana, also a resident of Dara Harwan, Srinagar, demanded a bribe of Rs 5,00,000. The complainant was asked to pay Rs 50,000 as the first instalment and give a blank signed cheque," the ACB spokesperson said.

He said the complainant was further told that he should pay the remaining amount after getting the required clearances.

The complainant alleged that all this was done at the behest of Chopan to put pressure on him and find a reason to demand money from

Acting on the complaint, the ACB conducted a discreet verification through a designated officer. The verification report confirmed the allegations, the ACBspokesperson said.

On the basis of the complaint and the verification report, a case was registered. Subsequently, a trap team was constituted and a successful trap was laid, he said.

"During the trap operation, the accused public servant and his tout were caught redhanded while demanding and accepting Rs 50,000 and a blank signed cheque from the complainant. They were immediately apprehended,"

the spokesperson said. Further investigation is

ongoing, he said.

## Jammu Rlys Div collects Rs 3.4 Cr fine from violators

JAMMU: Railway authorities have collected Rs 3.4 crore from fines imposed on violators and illegal passengers travelling on trains in the Jammu Division during June, officials

The Jammu Division of the Northern Railway launched a campaign against irregular travel, illegal vending, littering and smoking on trains.

"During the ticket checking campaign in June by the checking staff and Chief Ticket Inspectors of the division, 5,462 cases of irregular travel by passengers were detected. A fine amount of Rs 3.4 crore was recovered from them," Senior Divisional Commercial Manager, Jammu Railway Division, Uchit Singhal said here.

He said surprise ticket checking campaigns are also conducted regularly by railway officials to prevent the unauthorised entry of passengers on trains.

"Passengers are advised to travel on trains with valid tickets. Under this, regular inspections are carried out to keep all the railway stations of the division clean and to prevent the general public from spreading dirt at the stations," he said.

About Rs 19,000 was recovered during this inspection in June 2025, as the fine from 64 passengers for littering on sta-

This initiative in the Jammu Division was carried out under the guidance of Divisional Railway Manager Vivek Kumar and the leadership of Singhal, during which the ticket checking staff conducted intensive checks in trains to curb ticketless and irregular travel, and to provide comfortable travel and better services to all genuine rail users.

## Cabinet approves Rs 1.07 lakh Cr ELI scheme to create 3.5 Cr jobs in 2 years

### ■ STATE TIMES NEWS NEW DELHI: The central

government on Tuesday approved an Employment Linked Incentive (ELI) scheme (ELI) with an outlay of Rs 1.07 lakh crore to create 3.5 crore jobs over the next two years through social security schemes run by the retirement fund body EPFO.

The ELI scheme to support job generation, enhance employability and social security across all sectors, with special focus on the manufacturing sector, was approved by the Union Cabinet in a meeting, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Information Modi. Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said.

The scheme aims to incentivise the creation of more than 3.5 crore jobs in the country over two years, an official statement said.

The scheme will provide incentives to employees as well as employers to boost job creation. Under the scheme, while

the first-time employees will get one month's wage (up to Rs 15,000), the employers will be given incentives for a period of two years for generating additional employment, with extended benefits for another two years for the manufacturing sector.

## Gives nod to Khelo Bharat Niti

NEW DELHI: Calling it a "strategic roadmap" for India's elevation into the top five of world sports, the cabinet on Tuesday approved the Khelo Bharat Niti to create "worldclass systems" of coaching and athlete support along with a robust administrative set-up to make the country a strong ontender for the 2036 Olympics.

Previously called the National Sports Policy and introduced for the first time in 1984, the Khelo Bharat Niti 2025 will supersede the 2001 policy. It is a "guiding document" to formulate plans and schemes for betterment of the country's

porting ecosystem. We have used the experience of the last 10 years and the new policy will work towards improvement of sports. Major objective is to make India a top-five sporting nation by 2047. That's the overall objective," Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw told reporters while unveiling the olicy and other cabinet decisions.

"The PM has given a different kind of emphasis to sports, especially in rural areas," he said.

announced in the Union Budget 2024-25 as part of the package of five schemes to facilitate employment, skilling and other opportunities for 4.1 crore youth with a total budget outlay of Rs 2 lakh crore.

The ELI scheme aims to incentivise the creation of more than 3.5 crore jobs in the country over a period of 2 years, it stated.

Out of these, 1.92 crore beneficiaries will be first timers, entering the workforce. The benefits of the scheme would be applicable to jobs created between August 1, 2025, and July 31, 2027.

The plan consists of two parts, with Part A focused on first timers (employees) and Part B focused on employers.

Targeting employees registered with EPFO, this Part A will offer a one-month wage up to Rs 15,000 in two instalments.

Employees with salaries up to Rs 1 lakh will be eligible. The first instalment will be payable after 6 months of service, and the second instalment will be payable after 12 months of service and completion of a financial literacy programme by the employee.

"To encourage the habit of

saving, a portion of the incentive will be kept in a savings instrument or deposit account for a fixed period and can be withdrawn by the employee at a later date. Part A will benefit around 1.92 crore first-time employees," the statement

Part B of the scheme will cover the generation of additional employment in all sectors, with a special focus on the manufacturing sector.

The employers will get incentives with respect to employees with salaries up to Rs 1 lakh

The government will incentivise employers, up to Rs 3,000 per month, for two years, for each additional employee with sustained employment for at least six months. For the manufacturing sector, incentives will be extended to the 3rd and

4th years as well. Establishments, which are registered with EPFO, will be required to hire at least two additional employees (for employers with less than 50 employees) or five additional employees (for employers with 50 or more employees) on a sustained basis for at least six months.

The benefit to the employer (per additional employment per month) will be up to Rs 1,000 for employees with a while this will be Rs 2,000 for employees with wages of more than Rs 10,000 and up to Rs 20,000.

Employees with wages up to Rs 10,000 will get a proportional incentive.

The benefit will be Rs 3,000 per month to the employers for employees with a wage of more than Rs 20,000 (up to a salary of Rs 1 lakh/month).

Part B (for employers) is expected to incentivise employers for the creation of additional employment for

nearly 2.60 crore persons. All payments to the firsttime employees under part A of the scheme will be made through the DBT (Direct Benefit Transfer) mode using the Aadhar Bridge Payment System (ABPS).

Payments to employers under Part B will be made directly into their PANlinked Accounts.

With the ELI scheme, the government intends to catalvse job creation in all sectors. particularly in the manufacturing sector, besides incentivising youth joining the workforce for the first time.

An important outcome of the scheme will also be the formalisation of the country's workforce by extending social security coverage for crores of young men and women.
