

Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar resigns, citing medical reasons

NEW DELHI: In a sudden Vice President Dhankhar on Jagdeep Monday evening resigned from his post citing medical reasons.

He has sent his resignation to President Droupadi Murmu and said he was stepping down with immediate effect.

"To prioritise health care and abide by medical advice, I hereby resign as Vice President of India, effective immediately, in accordance with Article 67(a) of the Constituton," Dhankhar said in his letter to the President. Dhankhar, 74, assumed office in August 2022 and his tenure was till 2027. He is also the Chairman of the

3.1 magnitude earthquake hits Kishtwar

JAMMU: An earthquake hit Kishtwar district in the early hours of Thursday, officials said. There were no reports of any loss of life or damage to property, they said. The earthquake, with its epicentre near Kishtwar and a magnitude of 3.1, occurred at 1.36 am on Monday, the National Centre for Seismology said. The depth of the earthquake was 10 km below the surface at latitude, 33.17 degrees north and longitude 75.87

Landslide hits Mata Vaishno Devi track; pilgrim dies

Student dies as landslide hits Govt school in Poonch; **DySP** injured near Ban Toll Plaza

JAMMU/POONCH: monsoon rains lashed the Jammu region, a pilgrim and a student died on Monday due to separate incidents of landslides in Katra and Poonch while a police officer was injured near Nagrota.

A 70-year-old pilgrim was killed while nine others were injured when a massive landslide struck the old track to the Vaishno Devi shrine, officials said.

They said a booking office and an overhead iron structure caved in under the weight of the landslide, triggered by heavy rains which lashed Katra town, the base camp for the pilgrims visiting the shrine atop Trikuta hills.

The vatra remained suspended for several hours as a precautionary measure following the landslide.



JAMMU: Nine peddlers were nabbed with drugs and Rs 20 lakh in their possession from different places in Jammu and Udhampur districts, police said on Monday. A drug peddler was

detained under Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (PIT-NDPS) Act in Kathua, while two shops of an alleged drug peddler were demolished in Rajeev Nagar of Jammu, they said.

A police spokesperson said a man and his son-in-law were arrested after 283 grams of heroin and Rs 20 lakh were recovered from Sikandarpur Kothey in Bishnah area in the outskirts of Jammu. The son-in-law was identi-

fied as Sadiq Ali alias "Jattu" of Marheen area of Kathua and the older man as Saif Ali alias "Safu" of Bishnah. An investigation is under-



JAMMU: A fresh batch of over 3,700 pilgrims left Jammu on Monday for the twin base camps of the cave shrine of Amarnath in the south Kashmir Himalayas amid tight security arrangements, officials said.

So far, over 3 lakh pilgrims have paid obeisance at the ice lingam of Lord Shiva at the 3,880-metre-high shrine since the yatra began on July

Escorted by CRPF and police personnel, the batch of 3,791 pilgrims -- 3,067 men, 522 women, nine children, 192 sadhus and sadhvis, and a transgender -- left the Bhagwati Nagar base camp here in 148 vehicles between 3.33 am and 4.06 am, they said.

The first pilgrim convoy,

carrying 1,208 pilgrims in 52 vehicles, left for the shorter but steeper 14-km Baltal route in Ganderbal district, followed by the second convoy of 2,583 pilgrims in 96 vehicles, who are undertaking the yatra via the 48-km traditional Pahalgam route in Anantnag district, they According to data, the

number of pilgrims undertaking the yatra has been declining over the last few days. While 7,908 pilgrims left for Amarnath on July 18, the number was 6,365 on July 19, 4,388 on July 20, and today's batch of 3,791 pilgrims was the lowest so The footfall at the counters
