JAMMU: "We are living in a world where kindness is needed more than ever; where our words and action matter. With this impactful opening statement, Mehar of Grade IX B conducted the morning assembly along with her batchmates on the topic "Say No to bullying and Yes to change of mind" at JK Public School, Kunjwani.

The baton was taken further by Tajveer Singh, who enthralled the audience with his brilliant oration. He said, "As someone said, people will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but they will never forget how you made them feel. We often think bullying is only about hitting or shouting at someone, but bullying isn't always loud and obvious sometimes. "It may seem small but even the smallest hings can matter a lot to a person receiving all these things. Nowadays, a person being bullied doesn't react and keeps suffering silently as long as he can. And, at the

IGNOU invites applications for PhD programme for July 2025 session

JAMMU: Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) has started inviting applications for PhD programmes for the July 2025 session. The interested candidates can fill out the form online by following the official portal

phd.samarth.edu.in and complete the registration. The portal will accept applications till 21 days from the date the admission was announced.

The students with a master's or M.Phil. Degree and UGC NET can apply online at ignouphd.samarth.edu.in within 21 days. There are two admission categories, one for students with JRF and another for students without JRF. Selection will be based on UGC NET scores and interview performance. Interviews will be held at IGNOU's New Delhi cam-

To apply, students need to pay Rs.1000/- as a registration fee which is nonrefundable. Admissions will happen under two categories. Under the Category A, if a candidate has passed the UGC NET exam with JRF (Junior Fellowship), he/she will be called directly for the interview and the selection will depend 100% on the interview. Under the Category B, if a candidate

passed UGC NET but did-

n't get a fellowship, he/she

will also be considered for

admission, but the process

will be different from

Category A.

If a candidate has completed a master's degree with at least 55% marks after a 4-year bachelor's degree or after a 3-year bachelor's degree, he/she can apply. The candidates belonging to SC, ST, OBC (non-creamy layer), Differently-Abled, or EWS category, will get 5% relaxation in marks.

If a candidate has a 4year bachelor's degree, he/she must have at least 75% marks to apply for the PhD course. SC, ST, OBC (non-creamy layer), Differently-Abled, or EWS students can get 5% relaxation. The candidates having completed an M.Phil. degree with at least 55% marks (or equal grade), are also eligible.

The Radiosonde, a GPSaided weather balloon known as PisharotySonde, measures

vertical atmospheric profiles including temperature, humidity, pressure, wind speed, and location. It uses IndRoS software developed by ISRO and is supported by a ground

station indigenously developed at the Semiconductor Laboratory Mohali, under Director General Dr. Kamaljeet Singh and Nemi Chand.

This initiative is part of

the RANN (Radiosonde Network for NICES) project under the National Information System for Climate and Environment Studies (NICES), contributing to climate change research and atmospheric studies. The project is in collaboration with Dr. Hareef Baba Shaeb K, NRSC, ISRO. Prof. Vinay Kumar,

Convener Satish Dhawan Centre for Space Science and Prof. Rakesh Kumar Jha, Head Department of Electronics Communication
