JKATA urges Govt to end re-employment without consensus, demands immediate action on OPS, promotions

JAMMU: The Jammu and Kashmir Agriculture Technocrats Association (JKATA), under the leadership of Dr. Surinder Radotra, held its monthly meeting today, highlighting several pressing issues faced by agriculture graduates across the Union Territory. Key concerns included the restoration of the Old Pension Scheme (OPS), pending promotions, finalization of seniority lists, and transparent $transfer\ policies\ for\ Agriculture$ Extension Assistants (AEAs) and Junior Agriculture Extension Officers (JAEOs). The association also issued a strong appeal against the ongoing re-employment and extension-in-service policies, which they argue block promotional avenues for deserving in-service officers. Dr. Radotra emphasized that despite repeated assurances, over 4.5 lakh employees, including agriculture technocrats, are still awaiting the implementation of OPS. He acknowledged that Chief Minister Omar Abdullah had committed to restoring

OPS in the party manifesto

and had also assured a JKATA

delegation of swift action. However, the final cabinet decision is still pending.

Addressing the long-pending issue of promotions, Dr. Radotra pointed out that JAEOs due for promotion since 2017 remain unregularized, and the final seniority list for AEAs is yet to be published despite multiple tentative lists. These delays have significantly impacted morale and professional growth.

JKATA has also raised concerns with the Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, Chief Secretary Atal Dulloo, and Principal Secretary of Agriculture Shailendra Kumar, urging immediate and timebound resolution of these issues.

The Association strongly opposes the extension and reemployment of retired officers, particularly at the Director level, stating that it stifles the progression of over 2,642 active technocrats. "Every serving employee has the right to timely promotion. These unfair practices must stop to maintain transparency and motivation in the department," said Dr. Radotra
