KARGIL: The Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh, Kavinder Gupta, held an introductory meeting with Councillors of LAHDC Kargil at the Conference Hall. He also held an introductory meeting with the Head of Departments (HoDs) of various departments in Kargil district. Reiterating his intent to fulfill the responsibilities entrusted to him by the Prime Minister of India and the Prime Minister of Ladakh, LG Gupta emphasised the collective effort of stakeholders and the UT Administration to work for the welfare of the people of Ladakh. He highlighted the need for broader outreach of centrally-sponsored schemes, including Beti Bachao Beti Padhao, for a better and educated society. He also asked Ladakh Police to take timely action to reduce cases registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act. Further reasserting his commitment to working for the welfare of people and the development of Ladakh, LG Gupta highlighted the need for the timely completion of project works, stating that he would review departmental works soon. During the meeting, LG Gupta was briefed about various ongoing development projects in Kargil, along with various other developmental issues through a detailed PPT presentation. Chairman/CEC, Dr Mohd Jaffer Akhoo, raised the issue of providing district status for Sankoo and Shakar-Chiktan, making funds allotted to Hill Councils for developmental works non-lapsable; extension of Kargil Airport and resumption of civilian flights at Kargil Airport, along with the conduct of the recruitment process to provide relief to unemployed youth, etc. Councillor Silmoo and former Chairman/CEC of LAHDC Kargil, Feroz Ahmed Khan, highlighted the need to strengthen LAHDC as an institution and the need to implement the tourism policy. Executive Councillor Phunsok Tashi highlighted the need for an increase in the Capex budget and the functioning of the Engineering College at the earliest. In the introductory meeting with all Head of Departments (HoDs), Sectoral Heads and District Officers of Kargil district, Deputy Commissioner, Kargil, Rakesh Kumar, gave a detailed PPT presentation, highlighting various ongoing development projects in the district. SSP Kargil, Shree Raam R, IPS, also gave a detailed presentation on the achievements and activities of the Ladakh Police.

2 arrested for selling banned nylon thread

JAMMU/R S PURA: Police on Sunday registered arrested two persons for selling banned Nylon Thread (Chinese manja, Gattu dour). Based on reliable information about sale of dreaded Nylon thread (Gattu), a police team of P/S R.S Pura led by PSI Abid Bashir under the command of SHO PS R.S Pura Inspector Ravi Singh Parihar and supervision of SP Headquarters Jammu and SDPO R S Pura conducted raids in the

R.S Pura market falling within the jd of PS R.S Pura. During raid, Police party seized 9 rolls of Nylon thread (Gattu) who was engaged in selling Synthetic Nylon thread made in China which is banned in District Jammu. The seller identified as Raman Kumar s/o Tilak Raj R/o Ward No. 06 R.S Pura tehsil R.S Pura district Jammu. In this regard an FIR under relevant section of law stand registered against

above said person and further investigation is underway. Police Station Janipur under the supervision of SHO Janipur Inspector Vikram Sharma also arrested one person involved in its possession and sale. The accused namely Bajinder Singh son of bikram Singh resident of karan nagar Jammu was apprehended with 10 rolls of banned gattu thread, which is notorious for causing serious injuries and even fatalities during kite flying.

The accused was using a new modus operandi - selling gattu thread through mobile-based orders and delivering it discreetly to customers, avoiding public attention and police checkpoints. The public is hereby cautioned against the use and possession of gattu thread, which is strictly prohibited by law due to its metallic or synthetic coating that poses grave risks to humans and animals, especially during the kite-flying season.
