

Put CSC Report on Reservation in Public Domain: JKRCEA

JAMMU: The Jammu Kashmir Reserved Categories Empowerment Alliance (JKRCEA), a leading socio-political body representing SC, ST, and OBC communities, held a forceful press conference demanding the immediate public release of the Cabinet Sub-Committee (CSC) report on reservation. The alliance termed the referral of the report to the Law Secretary a "mockery of justice" and accused both the Central and JKUT governments of violating the constitutional rights of marginalized communities. JKRCEA leaders alleged that successive governments have used SC, ST, and OBC communities for electoral gains while ignoring actual reforms. They criticized the inclusion of "unconstitutionally carved groups" in the amended Rule 4 of the J&K Reservation Act, 2005, which increased the reservation quota from 43% to 67%, including 3% horizontal reservation for ex-servicemen. The

alliance took serious exception to the June 19 submission of the draft CSC report, prepared without stakeholder consultation, and its subsequent referral to the Law Secretary — whom JKRCEA accused of consistently opposing reservations. Prof. G.L. Thapa, Working President, condemned the ongoing denial of reservation in promotions despite the 77th Constitutional Amendment's extension to J&K in 2019. Mohinder Bhagat, Working General Secretary, highlighted how bureaucrats ignored favorable High Court interim orders supporting promotions for SC/STs. Sham

Basson, Member of the Presidium, called on National Conference leadership to clarify its stand and warned BJP Morcha leaders against misleading the communities. JKRCEA demanded restoration of reservation in promotions, reinstatement of the original recruitment roster (3,15,27...), and full implementation of the Mandal Commission Report along with a caste-based census in J&K. The press conference witnessed participation from over 40 notable activists, academics, and retired officials, affirming widespread support for JKRCEA's cause.
