

TRI organises Webinar, cultural programmes on World Tribal Day

SRINAGAR: International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples (World Tribal Day) was observed here on Tuesday. The theme for this Year's World Tribal Day was "The Role of Indigenous Women in the preservation and transmission of traditional knowledge". On the occasion, Tribal Affairs Department and the Tribal Research (TRI) Institute organised a webinar in which Tribal Research Fellows, subject experts and students participated.

The role of indigenous women in preserving tribal culture, developing and promoting uses of natural products, integration of traditional knowledge and practices of

indigenous women was highlighted during the programme. Tribal Research Fellows who participated in the discussion include Tushita Pandey, Abdul Aadil Paray, Sayed Hamid Mehmood, Dr. Annie Jamwal, Abrar Qadir Mir, and Tariq Abrar.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Shahid Iqbal Choudhary, Secretary Tribal Affairs Department also holding the charge of Director Tribal Research Institute J&K informed that every year, 9th August is celebrated as World Tribal Day for the upliftment of tribal society and to preserve their culture.

He stressed upon the need to raise awareness about various Rights available to the indige-

nous communities and as enshrined in the constitution of India. He said that Tribal Research Institute is working as a body of knowledge for preservation of tribal cultural heritage, evidence based planning and appropriate legislation, capacity building, dissemination of information and generation of awareness. Indigenous women are vital to the preservation of ancestral knowledge and also protect the traditional natural resources besides promotion in a sustainable manner, he said.

Further, it was informed that an MOU has been signed for establishment of Tribal chair at IIT Jammu and BGSBU Rajouri and they

have been entrusted with the task to document tribal culture, folk songs, folk tales, folk dance, rituals, customs, traditions, artifacts, indigenous health practices etc.

Around 200 students from various hostels of the Tribal Affairs Department actively participated during the programme. Debate competition, quiz, speeches, talk shows, and other talent-based activities related to the theme were organised. Prizes were also announced for the participating students based on their performance.

Lumpy skin disease: Over 50,000 animals administered goat pox vaccine in Punjab

CHANDIGARH: Over 50,000 animals have been administered doses of the goat pox vaccine to check the spread of lumpy skin disease among cattle in Punjab. State Animal Husbandry, Fisheries and Dairy Development Minister Lalit Singh Bhullar said over 2.33 lakh doses of goat pox have already been arranged and 1.67 lakh doses distributed in the districts and affected areas.

Bhullar has witnessed cases of lumpy skin disease especially among cows.

Bhullar on Tuesday visited Jindawala, Nabipur and Naushera Pannuan villages in Tarn Taran district and listened to the problems of livestock farmers, according to an official statement.

"District deputy directors of the department have been instructed to immediately contact the head office for any requirement of vaccine so that the vaccination drive does not face any hindrance," said the minister.

As many as 673 teams of veterinary officers and inspectors have been constituted by the department and they are constantly engaged in vaccination and awareness campaigns, he said.

The minister stressed on following the guidelines of the government for the treatment and control of lumpy skin disease in the state, which include the isolation of affected animals, control of movement of animals and farm workers, disinfection of farm premises and control of vectors.

Lumpy skin disease is caused by a virus of the capripox genus. It spreads rapidly among cows and buffaloes through flies, mosquitoes and ticks.

It causes soft blister-like nodules all over the body, fever, runny nose, watery eyes, salivation, reduced milk yield and difficulty in eating.

PM Modi reshaped India's foreign policy, says EAM Jaishankar

HYDERABAD: External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on Tuesday said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi has reshaped the country's foreign policy that has national interest at its core, but in a manner that is harmonised with global good.

Speaking at a discussion on a book titled 'Modi@20: Dreams Meet Delivery', at the English and Foreign Languages University (EFLU) campus here, Jaishankar said that the Prime Minister's language, metaphors, appearance, mannerisms, and habit define a person that the world has come to recognise.

"There is no gainsaying the fact that Prime Minister Modi looms large on the world stage. Definitely, his policies and initiatives have had their impact. But there is also a personal respect that influences the attitude of others. Peers perceive him as quintessentially Indian, and respond accordingly," a release from EFLU quoted Jaishankar as saying.

"I recall how fascinated

American leaders were about his (Modi's) fasting habits during the 2014 visit or the interest that European leaders showed in his Yoga," Jaishankar said.

Elaborating on the country's foreign policy, Jaishankar said that a large element of this is also the manner in which the Prime Minister carries himself.

He said that for the first time, the country is being led by a President, Vice-President-elect, Prime Minister, and Speaker who are all born in Independent India, while adding that these leaders knew the aspirations of the people of the country.

EFLU Vice Chancellor and Member UGC, Prof. E Suresh Kumar, who presided over the book discussion, termed the publication as inspiring and a great read to understand Modi's contribution to our country.

The book titled 'Modi@20: Dreams Meet Delivery' is a compilation of articles written by eminent personalities from different fields, the release added.

India invites UN Security Council members for high-level special meeting of Counter-Terrorism Committee in Oct

UNITED NATIONS: India has invited all members of the UN Security Council for a high-level special meeting of the Counter-Terrorism Committee in New Delhi and Mumbai in October aimed at highlighting the increase in the use of new technologies by terrorists and exploring the course of action to effectively deal with this threat. India is currently Chair of the Security Council Counter-Terrorism Committee for the year 2022 and will host diplomats of the 15-nation UN body, including the US, China and Russia, in October for a special meeting on counter-terrorism.

The growing use of the Internet and social media platforms to spread terrorist and violent extremist propaganda has posed challenges to Governments and the tech industry alike. The continued increase in the use of new technologies to move and store funds, including virtual assets, online exchanges and wallets, privacy coins (EACs) and potential misuse of dual-use technologies pose the risk that terrorists will seek to abuse these systems for terrorism financing and other terror-linked purposes.

India's Permanent Representative to the UN Ambassador Ruchira Kamboj said. Speaking at the UN Security Council briefing on Threats to international peace and security caused by terrorist acts' Tuesday chaired by permanent-member

and Council President for the month of China, Kamboj said there is a need for intense discussions on this subject. She told the Council that India, as the Chair of the Counter-Terrorism Committee (CTC) will be hosting a special CTC session in Mumbai and Delhi on October 28-29, highlighting the nature of this threat, member states' capacity gaps and best practices and exploring the further course of action to effectively deal with this threat. Kamboj said the high-level meeting will be in-person and she invited all Council colleagues to participate in the meeting, saying formal invitations will be issued by the CTC Chair later this month. Earlier speaking at the UNSC meeting, Acting Executive Director of the Counter-Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate Weixiong Chen said that the forthcoming special meeting of the Counter-Terrorism Committee on the use of emerging technologies for terrorist purposes will be held in October 2022 in New Delhi and Mumbai. Chen said it is my hope that this event will serve as a forum to further enhance and strengthen our multilateral and multi-dimensional counterterrorism efforts.

India is halfway through the second year of its two-year term as an elected non-permanent member of the 15-nation UN Security Council. India's tenure at the Council will end in December this year when the country will also preside as

President of the powerful UN organ for the month.

Current members of the Security

Council are Albania, Brazil, Gabon,

Ghana, India, Ireland, Kenya, Mexico,

Norway and UAE, along with five permanent members China, France, Russia, UK

and the US. Kamboj further underlined

the need for political will to defeat terrorism.

There can be no justification for terrorist acts, much less glorification of terrorist acts, a tendency we have unfortunately

seen in recent years in some parts of the world, she said, a reference to former

Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan

describing slain Al Qaeda leader Osama bin Laden as a martyr. There should be no double standards in dealing with terrorists.

We should refrain from labelling terrorism

based on motivations, which will only allow

opportunist forces to provide justification for certain terror activities based on their convenience, she said.

Kamboj also underlined the need to support capacity-building efforts of the UN Office for Counterterrorism and enhance its autonomy. India has been supporting these efforts by providing financial support and resources for the OCT's programs aimed at countering

terror financing and preventing terrorist movement. "We reiterate our call for providing greater financial support and adequate resources to the UNOCT from the regular UN budget, she said.

National Conference slams BJP for making tall claims, false promises
