


enhance patrolling on Inter-State borders. They were also asked to layout joint nakas and conduct checking of vehicles originating from Border and NIW to foil the nefarious designs of ANEs/ASEs. Moreover, representative of Army and CAPF were also requested to depute their manpower for joint CASO and anti tunneling exercise along the IB which are being conducted regularly besides monitoring of drone activities in the border area. SSP Kathua further stressed upon the officers to step up vigil and security in the district to check any attempt of infiltration.

90 vaccinated, 1,056 samples collected in Ramban

RAMBAN: As per District Immunization Officer Ramban, Dr. Suresh, the Health Department on Tuesday administered Covid vaccination to 90 persons in the district. Continuing the enforcement drive to implement Covid protocol across the district Ramban, the Enforcement teams fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance. The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking Covid vaccination doses at their nearest CVC. As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, the Health Department has collected 1056 samples including 270 RT-PCR and 786 RAT samples besides administering Covid vaccine to 90 persons at various dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.
