mapped into the newly delimited assembly constituencies as per the Delimitation Commission's final order made applicable by the Union Law Ministry w.e.f. 20th May 2022. As part of the Pre-Revision activities, the process of Rationalization/Rearrangement of Polling Stations, Removal of discrepancies of Demographically Similar Entries/Photo Similar Entries, Duplicate EPICs, Preparation of Supplements and integrated draft roll with reference to 01.10.2022 as the qualifying date is going on at present in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir. The integrated draft Roll with reference to 01-10-2022 as the qualifying date shall now be published by all EROs of the UT on 15th September, 2022, marking the formal beginning of the revision activities.

The revision activities which shall begin on 15th September; include disposal of claims and objections received after publication of integrated draft electoral roll. In order to provide more opportunities to the youth of Jammu and Kashmir the Commission has extended the period for filing of claims and objections from 30 days to 40 days i.e. 15th September to 25th October, 2022. During this period Special camps shall also be organized by CEO Jammu and Kashmir on weekends for which the date will be publicized separately. During this period of filing claims and objections any person desiring of getting his/her name included in the Electoral Roll or desiring to file any other claim for correction of an entry or any objection against any entry in the electoral roll shall have multiple platforms available for doing so, viz; Offline Mode, by filing a hard copy of the claim/objection in the prescribed Form before the ERO/AERO or BLO concerned. Online Mode, by logging into <https://www.nvsp.in> portal or by downloading Voter Helpline App (VHA).

The final electoral roll after due disposal of all claims and objections filed within the stipulated time period shall be published on 25th November, 2022.

With the new amendments in the Law, the Commission has also made the registration Forms more user friendly and simpler. The newly modified Forms have come into force with effect from 1st August, 2022. Now, the Form 6 which was earlier being used for Registration of new electors and for shifting from one constituency to another constituency, shall be exclusively used for registration of New electors. There is no change in Form 6A. Form 7 which is used for objection to Proposed inclusion/for deletion of a name in Existing Electoral roll shall remain to be for the same purpose with a slight modification that a provision for attaching a death certificate has also been incorporated. Form 8 has under gone a major change. Form 8 now can be used for multiple purposes, viz; correction of any particulars in the roll, shifting of residence (within or outside constituency), Replacement of EPIC, and Marking of Person with Disability. Form 8A which was earlier used for shifting within constituency has been abolished now, as the same provision is made in the new Form 8. In addition to these a new Form 6B has been introduced for capturing Aadhaar number of the existing electors. All Forms (wherever required) have been suitably modified to capture Aadhaar number from the new electors.

For linking of AADHAAR number with Electoral Roll data, provision has been made in the modified registration forms to seek Aadhaar details of electors. A new Form-6B has also been introduced for collecting Aadhaar number of existing electors. However, no application for inclusion of name in electoral roll shall be denied and no entries in electoral roll shall be deleted for inability of an individual to furnish or intimate Aadhaar Number. It has been emphasized that while handling Aadhaar number of the applicants, the provision under Section 37 of the Aadhaar (Targeted Delivery of Financial and other Subsidies, Benefits and Services) Act, 2016 must be adhered to. Under no circumstances should it go public. If the electors' information is required to be put for public display, the Aadhaar details must be removed or masked. A Time bound drive is being started for collection of Aadhaar number of the existing electors by or before 01-04-2023. Furnishing of Aadhaar number is purely voluntary. Objective of the programme is to establish the identity of electors and authentication of entries in Electoral Roll.

For the purpose of improving the health of the electoral roll, the Election Commission has emphasized the need for field verification by the Booth Level Officers. There is a mechanism for supervision and checking for enforcing strict accountability of the work performed by different levels of electoral machinery, such as Supervisors, EROs and AEROs by field verification. Similarly, DEOs, Roll Observers and CEOs also check the work done by EROs before the final decision on claims and objections is taken. Besides, Officers from ECI and O/o CEOs are also deployed to further random checks and to supervise. Respective Divisional Commissioner have been designated Roll Observers in their respective divisions for the purpose of supervision the Electoral Roll work.

With a view to ensure more involvement of political parties, the Commission has allowed Booth Level Agents (BLAs) of recognized political parties to file applications in bulk, subject to the condition that a BLA shall not submit more than 10 Forms to BLO at one time/in one day. If a BLA files more than 30 Applications/Forms during the entire period of filing claims and objections, then the cross verification must be done by ERO/AERO themselves. Further, the BLA will

also submit a list of application forms with a declaration that he has personally verified the particulars of the application forms and is satisfied that they are correct, the press note added.

### J&K records 626...

stands at 4,776 as no fresh fatality was reported in the past 24 hours, the officials said. There are 5,146 active cases in the Union territory, while the number of recoveries has reached 4,60,905, they said.

Meanwhile, Ladakh has reported 17 fresh COVID-19 cases that pushed its infection tally to 29,021, officials said.

All the fresh cases were reported from Leh.

So far, 228 people have succumbed to COVID-19 in Ladakh. Of these, 168 deaths were reported from Leh and 60 from Kargil, according to the officials.

The officials said there are 118 active cases in Ladakh -- 110 in Leh and eight in Kargil. A total of 330 samples were tested for COVID-19 in Ladakh. Of these, 260 samples from Leh and 52 from Kargil were found to be negative, they said.

Twelve more people -- nine in Leh and three in Kargil -- were discharged from hospitals after they recovered from the viral disease. With this, the total number of recoveries stands at 28,675, they said.

The Jammu and Kashmir Police had filed a 1,000-page charge sheet against three people -- Rather and Mohammad Saleem Kumar; alias Tota, and a juvenile. The police have prayed for the juvenile to be treated as an adult as per the amended Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, wherein youngsters in the age group of 16-18 can be tried under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) if they are accused of heinous crimes.

The accused were charged under sections 120-B (criminal conspiracy) and 326-A (voluntarily causing grievous hurt by use of acid) of the IPC.

The charge sheet was filed within three weeks of the incident to ensure swift and exemplary punishment to the accused and to deter those who may be having such 'barbaric' tendencies, the officials said.

The maximum punishment under these sections is life sentence and the minimum is 10 years' imprisonment, but the prosecution is pressing for the maximum so that it acts as a deterrent, they said.

During search, a Pistol, magazine and 4 live cartridges were recovered from possession of Malkeet Singh and a Khokhri was recovered from the possession of Gaganpreet Singh. FIR No. 193/2022 under sections 3/4 of Arms Act was registered at Police Station Gandhi Nagar Jammu.

It is pertinent to mention that out of the two absconders, Malkeet Singh was out on parole for few days but he didn't reported back. Reportedly, he had absconded to Nepal. Also, another absconder namely Gaganpreet Singh was evading his arrest since registration of FIR.

### Four arrested with heroin, sharp-edged weapon

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Jammu Police achieved a major success by arresting four accused persons and recovered heroin and a sharp-edged weapon from their possession.

As per details, a team of Police Station Bakshi Nagar under the supervision of SDPO West Rahul Nagar and led by SHO Bakshi Nagar Inspr Harjeet Singh laid a special Naka near Psychiatric Hospital (Boys Hostel Ground), Resham Ghar and rounded up a suspect with a vehicle bearing (JK02AU-1408). On search 200 grams of heroin was recovered from accused, who was later identified as Badri Nath, son of Lt Ramesh Chander, resident of House No.57, Jain Bazaar, Jammu. He was arrested and FIR No 140/22 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Bakshi Nagar. Similarly, a team of Police Station Gandhi Nagar under supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Gandhi Nagar Inspr Pankaj Sharma assisted by Incharge Police Post Digiana SI Tarseem Raj, while on Naka duty near Santab Da Gurdwara, Nanak Nagar rounded up a suspect on a vehicle (JK02CS-2750). On search 7 gm heroin, a sharp-edged weapon and a Digital weighing Machine were recovered from his bag. The suspect, identified as Kamaljeet Singh, son of Late Surinder Singh, resident of House No 1388 Sector-8, Lane-3 Nanak Nagar was arrested and FIR No 192/2022 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act, 4/25 of Arms Act was registered at Police Station Gandhi Nagar.

Also, a team of Police Station Jhajjar kotli led by SHO Inspr Vikram Sharma assisted by PSI Ishfaq Ahmed Kasana, while on patrolling duty, rounded up two suspects on a vehicle (JK14C/8618). ### Couple among six killed in separate mishaps

KATHUA: A couple among six persons got killed in separate mishaps at Kathua on Tuesday.

As per details, a scooty got hit by a truck on National Highway near Kalibari, Kathua due to which scooty-borne couple died on the spot. The deceased was identified as Har Kishore, son of Amar Babu, resident of Bihar, presently working at CTM and her wife, Madhuri.

Meanwhile, a cyclist also got killed after getting hit by a truck in Barnoti area. The deceased was identified as Raghurib Singh, resident of Barnoti. Parkash Chander, son of Jagtu Ram, resident of Billavar was hit by an unknown vehicle near Narwal, due to which he got injured. He was shifted to hospital where he was declared as brought dead by doctors.

In another instance, Mohd Shahid, so of Faraz Ali, resident of Uttar Pradesh also died in a mishap at Ramban while Atish Kumar, son of Daulat Ram, resident of Daswal, who got injured in mishap in Rajbagh area on August 8, succumbed to injuries.
