However, the same has to be learned in a methodical and systematic manner so as to apply it scientifically in the society. Research he said is a systematic and empirical investigation into a phenomenon. Both quantitative and qualitative aspects of research were described in detail. He said that when one trains oneself in the field of research the cumbersome process of research eventually turns out to be very interesting field. The qualitative aspects of research such as emotions, hatred, social distance, meanings differ in

their intensity depending upon the time and situation. He further described the ethics and morals of research and the method to approach an event or a topic according to the needs and requirements of the field. The research on the one hand has to be objective but depending upon the field, time and situation one has to adjust to the settings accordingly.
