CRIME REPORT

Notorious drug-peddler arrested, 44 Kg poppy straw recovered

BUDGAM: Continuing its efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs, Police has arrested a notorious drug peddler on Tuesday and recovered contraband substance from his possession. As per details, acting on specific information about drug peddlers in Lakhripora area of Budgam, a party of Police Station Budgam raided house of one Reyaz Ahmad Bhat, son of Bashir Ahmad Bhat, resident of Lakhripora and recovered 44 Kg Poppy Straw, concealed in two suit cases. He was arrested and shifted to police station where he remained in custody, while another drug peddler managed to flee and efforts are on to nab him. Accordingly, FIR No. 278/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Budgam and investigation started.

Rape accused arrested within 48 hours

BUDGAM: Police on Tuesday arrested a rape accused within 48 hours of commission of crime. As per details, on August 13, 2022, Police Post Soibugh received a written complaint from a man resident of Lakheempura Keeri, Bihar presently working at Brick Kiln 71-P Wahabpora, stating therein that his minor sister went missing on August 12, 2022 at about 0400 Hours & when he searched her, she was traced out at about 1600 Hours on same day. Meanwhile, the complainant's sister disclosed that she was kidnapped and raped by one Liyakat Ali Dar, son of Mohammad Jaffar Dar, resident of Wahabpora, Budgam. In this regard, FIR No. 275/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Budgam and investigation started. During preliminary investigation, officers of Police Post Soibugh learnt that accused is at large. Police raided several suspected places and after strenuous efforts, accused was arrested from Wadwan area of Budgam. He was shifted to police station where he remained in custody.

13-yr girl dies as group of Doda pilgrims on Manimahesh Yatra met with accident 2 injured airlifted to Chamba GMC; another hospitalized at Bharmour

DODA: A 13-year old girl died and three others got injured as a group of Doda pilgrims on Manimahesh Yatra met with an accident on Tuesday. The unfortunate incident occurred at Bharmour, Himachal Pradesh. Among the injured, 2 were airlifted to Government Medical College Chamba and another injured minor was hospitalized at Bharmour by local administration. District Administration Doda is in touch with DC Chamba, ADC Bharmour and authorities of GMC Chamba. The DC Doda telephonically enquired about well being of the injured and was apprised by the GMC Chamba authorities that both have fractures but their condition is stable. The Deputy Commissioner also spoke to the families of the injured and assured all possible assistance in coordination with administration of Chamba and Bharmour. Additional Deputy Commissioner, Bhadarwah is coordinating with ADM Bharmour for hassle-free transfer/shifting of body of deceased girl to her native place.

Woman among four notorious drug-peddlers arrested; heroin, cash recovered

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Police on Tuesday nabbed four narco smugglers including a woman and recovered 400 gm heroin and Rs 8,000 cash from their possession. As per details, a team of Police Station Gandhi Nagar led by SHO Gandhi Nagar Inspector Pankaj Sharma while on Naka duty rounded up two suspects, who were on their way from Bahu Plaza towards Green Belt on vehicle (JK02CS/1367). The

suspects were later identified as Jameel Ahmed, son of Khursheed Ali and Rafiq Ahmed, son of Din Mohd, both residents of Bathindi. During search, 400 gm heroin i.e., 200 gm from each accused along with Rs 8000 cash was recovered from their possession. Duo was arrested and FIR No 200/2022 under sections 8/21/22/25/29 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Gandhi Nagar. It is pertinent to mention that during further intensive questioning, the accused revealed names of two more suspects namely Ashfaq Ahmed Naikoo, son of Abdul Rehman Naikoo, resident of Peertaki, Y K Pura, Kulgam and a woman namely Zareena Akther, wife of Talib Hussain, resident of Bathindi Jammu, who were also arrested. The whole operation was done under supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma and SP South Mamta Sharma.



Bootlegger nabbed with 51 bottles of illicit liquor

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday nabbed a bootlegger and recovered 51 bottles of illicit liquor from his possession during Naka checking near Sardar Basti Beli Charana. As per details, a team under the supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO PS Satwari Inspr Sameer Jeelani assisted by Incharge Police Post Beli Charana PSI Jeevan Kumar rounded up an accused identified as Satnam Singh, son of Sohan Singh, resident of Chatha Farm. During search, 51 bottles of illicit liquor were recovered from his possession. The accused was arrested and cognizance was taken by Police Post Beli Charana.

25 bovines rescued; three smugglers arrested

JAMMU: Acting tough against bovine smugglers and to curb the bovine smuggling menace, Police on Tuesday rescued 21 bovine animals i.e., 9 bovine animals while on Naka duty near Tanda Jagti Nagrota and 12 bovines at Salora area under jurisdiction of Police Stations Nagrota and Jhajjar Kotli respectively. As per details, a team of Police Station Nagrota led by SHO Nagrota Inspr Vishav Partap Singh while on Naka duty at Tanda Jagti area rounded up a suspect, who was found transporting 9 bovines towards Srinagar. Identified as Mohd Yousif, son of Jamal Din, resident of Kalyanpur Jammu, the accused was arrested and FIR No.311/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11,12 and 13 of Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (Transportation of Animals on Foot) Rules 2001 was registered against him at Police Station Nagrota. Similarly, during patrolling duty at Salora area in jurisdiction of Police Station Jhajjar Kotli, police team led by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Inspr Vikram Sharma rounded up a suspect namely Abdul Rashid, son of Fareed, resident of Galeote Udhampur carrying 12 bovine animals. In this regard, FIR No.200/2022 under section 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act, 11/12/13 of Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (Transportation of Animals on Foot) Rules 2001 was registered at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli and accused was arrested. The overall arrest and recoveries in both the cases were made under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar. District Police Samba successfully foiled an attempt to smuggle bovines in jurisdiction of Police Station Ghagwal by rescuing 4 bovines and arresting a bovine smuggler. Acting on information received through reliable sources regarding illegal transportation of bovines, a party from Police Station Ghagwal near Naka Tapyal Ghagwal NHW, signaled a Load carrier bearing registration no JK14H/8646 to stop for checking. But, instead of stopping vehicle, the driver accelerated the vehicle and jumped Naka point, but was successfully chased and intercepted by alert cops just a few meters away from Naka Point. On checking of vehicle, 4 bovines were found laden inside vehicle which were rescued. The driver, identified as Mushtaq Ahmed, son of Fazi, resident of Jakheni District Udhampur was arrested and load carrier was seized. In this connection, FIR No. 121/2022 under section 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Ghagwal.

Absconder nabbed after 3 months

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday nabbed an absconder who was evading arrest for last 3 months. As per details, an information was received at Police Station Gangyal through reliable sources regarding an absconder namely Suresh Kumar, son of Rattan Chand, resident of Laehhipur, Tehsil Marheen, who was evading arrest since May 2022 in FIR No. 56/22 registered under section 376 of IPC at Police Station Gangyal. On this, a team of Police Station Gangyal under the supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Gangyal Inspr Joginder Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts, arrested the absconder. Further investigation of the case is going on.

Two accused personating as policemen arrested for extortion

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday nabbed two accused, who were personating as policemen and were taking money from people. As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Bahu Fort by a woman namely Nazia Choudhary, wife of Rafiq Ahmed, resident of Bathindi stating that her husband got arrested in NDPS Act case registered at Police Station Gandhi Nagar and two persons came to her house claiming themselves as policemen posted at Police Station Gandhi Nagar and demanded a sum of 5 lakh from her for releasing her husband. On this, she immediately gave a swift car and Rs 50,000 cash. Consequently on August 14, 2022, both accused again came to her house and showed a pistol, stating that one among accused, named Sunny is a police Inspector while other is his PSO. They told her that his husband shall be released only if she would give remaining amount to them. Later on inquiry, the woman came to know that both accused were not police employees and just extorting money from her through fraud means and by disguising themselves as policemen on duty. On this, FIR No. 212/2022 under sections 170/419/384/109 of IPC and 3/25 of Arms Act was registered at Police Station Bahu Fort and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Bahu Fort, under supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari led by SHO Bahu Fort Inspr Nayat Ali, after putting in strenuous efforts and connecting various leads, rounded up both accused identified as Jagtap Singh alias Sunny, son of Daljeet Singh, resident of Miran Sahib and Muzaffer, son of Ab Gani Wani, resident of Ramban, at present Gujjar Nagar. During search, Rs 47,000 cash and an air pistol was recovered from their possession. Moreover, the swift car they took from victim was also recovered from their possession.



Excise sleuths conduct raids in Kathua, destroy 1,150 Kg Lahan

KATHUA: Excise Department destroyed 1150 Kg Lahan during different raids carried out to arrest menace of illicit distillation and sale of illicit liquor in Excise Range Kathua. On directions of Excise Commissioner, Pankaj Kumar Sharma and supervision of Deputy Excise Commissioner (Executive) Jammu, Kusum Sharma, a team of Excise Eradication/Enforcement Wing Jammu conducted raids at various areas. Led by ETO Eradication wing Jammu Narinder Singh Anthal, the team comprised of Sub-Inspectors Mohd Salim, Karamat Ali & a trainee Sub Inspector Faisal Ahmed along with Excise Guards Karnail Singh & Amit Khonja. The team raided Changi, Shiba Chak and adjoining areas of Kathua district to arrest menace of illicit distillation of liquor. During raids, 1150 Kg Lahan, raw material for illicit liquor was recovered by the team from state land & later destroyed on the spot.
