## Punjab-based durg-peddler nabbed with 10 Kg poppy straw

KATHUA: Continuing its war against drugs, Kathua Police under guidance of SSP R C Kotwal on Wednesday arrested a Punjab-based resident and recovered/seized approximately 10 Kg poppy straw like narcotics from his possession.

As per details, a team led by Insp Vijay Kotwal SHO Police Station Lakhampur under the supervision of DySP DAR Kathua Sukhdev Singh during patrolling/checking duty near Railway Bridge Lakhampur noticed a suspicious Mahindra Bolero (PB30Q-9076), driven by one Tejinder Singh, son of Bhupinder Singh, resident of Rangian Tehsil Dehlon, Ludhiana and signaled it to stop for checking. During checking, approximately 10 Kg poppy straw like narcotics was recovered from the vehicle. The accused was arrested and FIR No. 72/2022 under sections 8/15 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Lakhampur.



## Missing girl traced, reunited with family

KATHUA: Police on Wednesday traced a missing girl and reunited her with family members.

As per details, on October 26, 2020 a missing report was lodged at Police Station Malhar by a person stating therein that his daughter, resident of Kindli Tehsil Lohai, District Kathua went missing from home. Acting on the complaint, a missing report was registered and search was launched to trace her. With the continuous efforts, coupled with technical assistance, a team of Police Station Malhar traced the girl, handed her over to legal heirs after completion of all legal formalities.

## 15 bovines rescued; 2 smugglers arrested

KATHUA: Police on Wednesday foiled a bovine smuggling bid by rescuing 15 bovines and arrested two smugglers.

As per details, a police team led by Insp Sunil Kumar Sharma SHO Police Station Hiranagar under the supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan during patrolling duty at Plahi area, apprehended two suspects

namely Mian Rashid, son of Faroz Din, resident of Plahi and Maskeen Ali alias Bantu, son of Lal Hussain, resident of Plahi Tehsil Hiranagar, who were indulged in trade of transportation/smuggling of bovine animals by foot from Plahi area. On checking, police team rescued 13 bovines (11 cows & 2 oxen) from their possession. Both accused were arrested on spot and FIR No. 118/2022 under section 188 of IPC was registered at Police Station Hiranagar.

While in another instance, on receiving specific information from a reliable source that an auto load carrier (JK02CW-7526) driven by an unknown person, is indulged in smuggling of bovines from Punjab towards J&K, a team led by PSI Ranbher Singh Incharge Police Post Hatli under supervision of DySP Headquarters Kathua Shammii Kumar laid a special Naka/checking duty near NHW Hatli and noticed said vehicle.

On seeing Naka party, the driver of vehicle managed to flee from the spot leaving the vehicle. On thorough checking, police team rescued 2 bovine animals from vehicle (JK02CW-7526). The vehicle was seized and FIR No. 320/2022 under section 188 of IPC was registered at Police Station Kathua.

## 2 drug-peddlers arrested, contraband recovered

HANDWARA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, Police on Wednesday arrested two drug peddlers in Handwara and recovered contraband substances from their possession.

As per details, a party of Police Station Kralgund during patrolling in Pandithpora area apprehended 2 suspects, who were identified as Tariq Ahmad Moochi, son of Mohd Maqbool Moochi and Abdul Quyoom Mir, son of Gh Nabi Mir, both residents of Pandithpora.

On checking, 106 gm Charas like substance was recovered from their possession.

They were arrested and shifted to police station where they remained in custody.

Accordingly, FIR No. 70/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Kralgund and further investigation started.

## 2 minor mentally challenged girls reunited with families

JAMMU: Child Welfare Committee Jammu helped a 15-year old mentally challenged girl to reunite with her family. The girl was found on at Railway Station on august 5 and due to her inability to tell about her whereabouts, she was placed in a children's home by CWC. Subsequently, the girl was counseled and on basis of inputs provided by her, the CWC team contacted CWC Sim Dega, Jharkhand.

The latter contacted girl's father, who told officials that his daughter went missing from past one and an half years. Due to swift efforts by CWC

and Child Help Desk Railways, the father of girl was brought to Jammu from Jharkhand and girl was reunited with her family.

In another case, a mentally challenged minor girl was found by a party of Police Station Channi Himmat and was presented before CWC for shelter. On getting her medical test done, she was found COVID positive. The girl was also unable to share any details about herself.

She was admitted in children hospital, Gandhi Nagar and after recovery, produced before the CWC Bench. The only thing she remembered was that she stays behind DC office.

The SHO of that area was contacted to find if any such case of similar nature has been reported and subsequently, girl's family was found who informed that girl went missing since past 7 days. With personal efforts of Shalini Sharma, Chairperson CWC Jammu and other team members, both the minor girls were successfully reunited with their families.

## 18-yr old girl raped

BILLAWAR: An 18 years old girl was raped in Billawar area on Wednesday. After conducting medical examination of victim, police has registered a case and launched manhunt to nab the accused.

## Landslide damages shepherd's mud house 80 animals killed

BANIHAL/JAMMU: Around 80 sheep and goats were killed and 15 injured when a landslide triggered by a cloudburst damaged the house of a shepherd in Ramban district on Wednesday, officials said.

The family members of the shepherd, Manzoor Ahmed, had a narrow escape when the landslide damaged his mud house in the Banihal area below the Jawahir tunnel in the early hours of Wednesday.

Nearly 80 sheep and goats, owned by Ahmed, died while 15 others were injured, they said. Station House Officer Munir Khan said he, along with Sub Divisional Police Officer of Banihal Nisar Khawaja, visited the spot. A police team and volunteers were assessing the situation, he added.

## Live mortar shell recovered in Samba
