

PRIs, councilors, people protest against Commissioner Secy B K Singh; allege rigging in recent transfers

UDHAMPUR: Councilor of Udhampur Municipal Council, Sarpanch of Udhampur district, Panch besides local people demonstrated vigorously by burning an effigy of Commissioner Secretary of Education Department B K Singh. They alleged that there has been a lot of rigging in transfers of Teachers, Masters, Lecturers etc. They told that in transfer list issued by the Education Department recently, employees were transferred at zero kilometers.

The representatives said that despite the shortage of teachers

in the schools located in hilly areas, as teachers are quite less in many schools and many do not have head-teachers, but instead of increasing teachers in those schools, the teachers were brought to the city. This clearly shows how much rigging has happened in the Education Department in recent transfer list. The representatives said that since B K Singh is the Commissioner Secretary of the Education Department, such rigging is taking place in Education Department, especially in Udhampur; Samba, Kathua, Jammu and Reasi districts. They alleged that he is

not capable to carry forward the department smoothly and should be transferred back to the Forest Department and a capable officer should be appointed as the Commissioner Secretary of Education Department.

Protestors also sought CBI probe in transfer list recently issued by education department. Sarpanch Shivdev Singh, Sarpanch Sunil Manohar, Sarpanch Surjit Singh, Naib Sarpanch Surjeet Singh, Councillor Samnik Bhasin, Councillor Jagdish Kumar, Councillor Darshan Kumar besides large number of people were present during the protest.

Two vehicles stolen

JAMMU: Two vehicles were stolen from two different places in Jammu city on Monday. As per details, one Balwant Singh, son of Dhani Ram, resident of Gho Manhasa lodged a complaint with Janipur Police that he parked his bike near Court complex, but when he came back, it was missing.

In another instance, Prakash Kapoor, son of Maharaj Krishan Kapoor, resident of Anand Nagar, Bohri lodged a complaint with Domana Police that last night he parked his Scooty (JK02BR-8971) outside a shop in area and went for shopping, but when he came back, the scooter was not there. Police has registered cases in their respective police stations and started investigations.

Disaster Response Force rescues 20 trekkers

LADAKH: Ladakh Disaster Response Force on Monday rescued 20 trekkers of Steel Authority of India Limited, who got stuck in the upper reaches due to heavy rains. 20 trekkers, who were trekking in Leh's Rumbak Valley, got trapped due to heavy rains and sudden floods. After getting information about the same on Monday morning, teams of Ladakh Disaster Response Force started rescue operation and helped trekkers to cross the creek down the hill.

On the other hand, the nomads, who were trapped due to sudden floods in Kargil on Sunday, were also shifted by Ladakh Police personnel to safer places. With moving with their families, they got stuck along with their cattle due to flash floods in Kargil's Zero Point area. After getting information, Kargil police took the nomads along with their cattle to a safer place near the tunnel stop in Gumri and made necessary arrangements for their food.

5 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a quest to stern menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which teams of Police Stations Satwari, Miran Sahib, Police Posts Chinore and Chatha acted stringently on the specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 5 vehicles involved in illegal mining. The seized vehicles included a tractor (JK02AX1018) and one Dumper bearing chassis number MBNAAL2BLRL01062 seized by Satwari Police; a Dumper without registration number seized by Miran Sahib Police; a tractor-trolley (JK02BM 8776) seized by Chinore Police and a tractor-trolley bearing chassis No MBNGAALDDMRE01758 seized by Chatha Police. The recoveries were made by SHO Satwari Inspri Sameer Jeelani, SHO Miran Sahib Inspri Zaheer Mushtaq, Incharge Police Posts Chinore PSI Ameet Singh and Chatha SI Ranjit Singh Chib in their respective jurisdictions.

Theft case solved, accused arrested; stolen items recovered

JAMMU: Police on Monday solved a theft case by arresting an accused and recovered stolen items worth Rs 25,000 from his possession. As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Post Sidhra by one Mohan Lal, son of Paras Ram, resident of Pargalta regarding theft at Mata Mandir Pargalta Bajalta Jammu area under jurisdiction of Police Station Nagrota. On this, FIR No 288/2022 under sections 457/380 of IPC was registered at Police Station Nagrota and investigation started. A team of

Police Post Sidhra under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar led by SHO Nagrota Insp. Vishay Partap Singh assisted by Incharge Police Post Sidhra SI Majid Hussain, after putting in strenuous efforts and after connecting various leads along with timely human intervention, rounded up a suspect namely Raghbir Singh, son of Arun Singh, resident of Pargalta, Bajalta. During further questioning, he disclosed that he had stolen ornaments and hidden them on roadside, after which he was arrested.

Finally, the stolen ornaments worth Rs 25,000 were recovered from his possession.

Narco-smuggler nabbed with heroin

AKHNOOR: Police on Monday nabbed a narco smuggler and recovered 8 gm heroin from his possession.



Burglars' gang busted, 5 arrested

AWANTIPORA: Police on Monday solved several theft cases by busting a gang of burglars and recovered stolen properties from their possession. After several recent thefts in minority religious places in Tral area, a special Investigating Team (SIT) under supervision of SDPO Tral Mubashir Rasool and led by SHO Tral was constituted and initiated investigation into the matter. During the course of investigation, strenuous efforts were put in and technical/tangible evidences were gathered. Besides, a specific input was generated by investigating team, after which two persons identified as Amir Rashid Ganai, son of Abdul Rasheed Ganai, resident of Gulshampora, Tral and Sajad Ah Sheikh, son of Noor Mohd Sheikh, resident Sheikhpora, Padampora were interrogated. Both were carrying instruments viz, a chisel & a torch and confessed that they were planning to commit theft in Tral area.

During further course of investigation, the duo confessed that they along with Tariq Ah Sheikh, son of Noor Mohd Sheikh, resident of Goripora and Shafiqat Ali, son of Mohd Ayoub, resident of Thannamandi (at present Goripora Awantipora) have committed thefts at several places, including recent thefts in Gurdwaras, thus trying to incite communal discord in the area. Subsequently, both the accused were also apprehended. Furthermore, investigating officers also learnt about involvement of another accused Bilal Ahmad Wani, son of Gh Mohd Wani, resident of Saraf Mohalla, Bijbehara who used to sell stolen items in his shop. He was also arrested. On their disclosure, stolen property worth lakhs which include cash, gold ornaments, a car etc, was recovered from their possession so far. Officers also recovered instruments used for forced entry and executing thefts viz Cutter, Hexa Blades, Iron Rod, Screw Drivers etc. from their possession.

After rigorous questioning of the suspects, it came to surface that all of them are not only addicted to idrugs but also had a history of broken families and familial discord. In order to bear cost of their addiction, they used to commit thefts.
