He highlighted various aspects like Browsing Security: is the application of internet security to web browsers in order to protect networked data and computer system from branches of privacy or malware. Google Map Security:

Google map should take acceptance from users on Monitoring & Reviewing agreement and warn to users regarding suspected browsing. If user browses a location that is highly sensitive, then user's activities can be monitored and reviewed.

These may include acquiring user information such as session information, session locations details, history logs, browsed places etc.

OTP Fraud: The entire idea of a one-time password (OTP) is to act as a security measure to ensure the transfer of money. This time-bound security step became very popular as digital financial transactions rose. Something introduces as a critical second-factor authenticator became the basis for siphoning the money off of people. Dr Vishal Sharma Principal Govt. Degree College Bani
