131 fresh COVID cases in J&K, 8 in Ladakh

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir on Monday recorded 131 fresh COVID-19 cases that pushed its infection tally to 4,76,175, officials here said.

The death toll remained unchanged at 4,779, they said.

Of the fresh cases 14 were reported from the Jammu division and 117 from the Kashmir valley, the officials said.

The number of active COVID-19 cases in the union territory stands at 2,293. So far, 4,69,103 people have recovered from the viral disease, they said.

Meanwhile, Ladakh has reported eight cases of Coronavirus, thereby increasing the COVID-19 tally to 29,151, while three patients were recuperated from the disease, officials said.

All the 8 cases were recorded in Leh.

According to the officials, 229 people have succumbed to COVID-19 in Ladakh till date, 169 deaths in Leh and 60 in Kargil.

The officials said the number of active COVID-19 cases has gone up to 74 in Ladakh - 66 from Leh and 8 from Kargil.

All the three patients were discharged from hospitals in Leh, they said, adding with this, the total number of recoveries stands at 28,848.

Need for masses to openly oppose terrorism to end targeted killings in Kashmir: Anupam Kher

SHIMLA: Film actor Anupam Kher here on Monday said there is a need for the masses to openly oppose terrorism in order to put an end to the targeted killings in Kashmir.

He was speaking at a book launch programme at Shimla Press Club.

Kher said the targeted killings of Kashmiri Pandits

have been going on for the last fifty years.

He claimed such cases have reduced a lot since the abrogation of the special status of Jammu and Kashmir in 2019.

"Recently, the terrorists have again started carrying out targeted killings in the union territory. However, now they are also killing

Muslims who are patriots," he said.

"Some people think that targeted killings have increased in Kashmir after the release of the 2022 film 'Kashmir Files'. But, I don't think so," he added.

He released a Hindi novel titled "Punarvas" written by local journalist Suresh Shandilya.

JAMMU: Hundreds of protesters on Monday blocked the Jammu-Pathankot National Highway in Samba district after a college student from Jammu and Kashmir was found dead in Punjab, officials said.

Twenty-year-old Vaishali, a resident of Madkoli village of Sumb block, went

missing on Saturday while returning from Government Degree College in Samba. Her body was found under mysterious circumstances in Ludhiana on Sunday, they said. According to officials, the family had lodged a missing report at the local police station on Saturday evening.

Carrying the body of the

deceased, a large group of mourners, including her college friends, blocked the highway near Samba town demanding proper investigation into the circumstances leading to her death. "Her disappearance and subsequent death smells of foul play..We want justice which can be delivered only after a fair probe, a relative of the deceased said.

The protesters, however, dispersed peacefully after senior police and civil administration officers pacified them and assured that all angles of the case will be probed.

The products listed on online marketplaces like Amazon and GeM included 'chikri woodcraft', which has been practised for over a century with Thana Mandi area of Rajouri being its major centre, the official said.

He said wood from chikri tree is used in the making of a number of articles. This particular wood is light honey in colour and contains no grains.

One of the famous objects made with the chikri wood is the double-sided comb having extremely fine teeth. This variety of comb exhibits a delicate jali' (mesh) work, the official said.

He said the products were launched on Amazon by the District Development Commissioner Rajouri, Vikas Kundal, in presence of a group of artisans who welcomed the initiative aimed at improving their living. The administration is committed to providing the best platform to the artisans of the district where they can sell their products in an easy manner and this is the first move in this direction. Such steps will continue in future

as well, Kundal said. He said his administration is committed to provide best market linkages to the local artisans.

The district administration has already taken a number of steps to facilitate the artisans, including opening of rural haat at Muradpur.

Cooperative department Rajouri and Handicrafts played a major role in imparting necessary training to the artisans and market exposures, the official said. Padma awards nominations open till Sept 15

NEW DELHI: Online nominations and recommendations for the Padma Awards 2023 have opened and the last date for submission is September 15, the Union Home Ministry said in a statement Monday.

Asking general public to send nominations and recommendations for Padma awards, the ministry said they can be filed online only on the Rashtriya Puruskar Portal (<https://awards.gov.in>).

Instituted in 1954, the three Padma awards -- Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan and Padma Shri -- are amongst the highest civilian awards of the country.

These are announced on the occasion of the Republic Day every year.

The award seeks to recognise 'work of distinction' and is given for exceptional achievements and service in all fields and disciplines, such as, art, literature and education, sports, medicine, social work, science and engineering, public affairs, civil service, trade and industry etc.

All persons without distinction of race, occupation, position or sex are eligible for

these Awards.

Government servants including those working with Public Sector Undertakings, except doctors and scientists, are not eligible for Padma awards.

The Modi government is committed to transform Padma awards into "People's Padma", the statement said.

All citizens are, therefore, requested to make nominations and recommendations, including self-nomination, it said.

Concerted efforts may be made to identify talented persons whose excellence and achievements really deserve to be recognised from amongst women, weaker sections of society, SCs and STs, divyang persons and who are doing selfless service to the society, the statement said.

The nominations and recommendations should contain all relevant details specified in the format available on the portal, including a citation in narrative form (maximum 800 words), clearly bringing out the distinguished and exceptional achievements and service of the person recommended in her and his respective field and discipline.
