It is pertinent to mention here that the stature of Dr Kiran Seth can be well judged from the fact that he has received Padma Shri from the Govt, Distinguished Alumnus Award by the IIT Kharagpur, NDTV Indian of the Year under Arts and Culture category, Sahitya Kala Parishad Award, Sanskriti Award, Harballabh Sangeet Sammelan Award, Keshav Kothari Smriti Award, Rajiv Gandhi National Sadbhavana Award, Chand Khan Award and Modernites Excellence award by Modern School Delhi besides a long list of other awards.

JAMMU: Deputy Commissioner Jammu, Avny Lavasa on Wednesday reviewed the progress of digitisation of Jamabandis and delivery of other services of the Revenue department, here at a meeting. ADC L&O, Minga Sherpa; ADC, Satish Sharma; ACR, Vijay Kumar; ACG, Rakesh Dubey; SDMS, Tehsildars along with senior officers from Revenue department were present in the meeting. The Deputy Commissioner took a detailed review regarding writing and digitization of Jamabandis, their proof reading and certification, besides disposal of revenue court cases on RCCMS portal, issuance of online Fard and other serv-

ices, compensation for losses caused in recent rains/flood, disbursement of rent etc. The DC directed the Tehsildars to complete the writing of Jamabandis and digitization within stipulated time. "The proof reading of Jamabandis followed by certification shall be completed at the earliest" she directed. Regarding construction of Solid Waste Management projects, the DC directed the revenue officers to identify the land for the same in their respective areas. The DC also inquired about disbursement of rent for the buildings used by departments and compensation for the losses due to recent rains/floods the Tehsildars.

Meanwhile, the Tehsildars were asked to take measures for speedy disposal of court cases related to revenue and uploading of the same on the designated portal.

Rana seeks deployment of special teams for containing LSD among cattle

DANSAL: Senior BJP leader Devender Singh Rana on Wednesday expressed grave concern over the spread of Lumpy Skin Disease (LSD) among milch cattle and sought constitution of special teams of veterinary officials for exhaustive survey, prompt checking and expeditious treatment of such cases. Sharing the concern of the rural communities during his extensive visit of several villages in Panchayat Jandrah, Dhan, Nagola, Kanyala and Tarah in Block Dansal of Nagrota Assembly Constituency, Rana said the immediate recourse to combat the disease is to carry out vaccination drive to contain the spread of the disease. Devender Rana said that the cattle rearing are almost the mainstay of the village communities and the threat of LSD is likely to cause in milk production, affecting the farmers. Such a scenario will impact the overall life in both the rural and urban inhabitants due to scarcity of milk and milk produce.

He hoped that the administration will take earnest measures by deputing expert teams to the rural areas at Panchayat and Block levels, especially the most vulnerable villages to carry out animal diagnosis, generate awareness and undertake fogging in all the cattle-sheds. He said preventive measures were imperative keeping in view the alarming

scenario in various states of the country. To save the cattle and to instill confidence among the farmers, mobile teams and deployment of stationary teams in the vulnerable villages is the need of the hour; he added.

Rana also urged the farmers to extend full cooperation to the veterinary officials and abide by the guidelines being notified from time to time in the larger interest of the cattle population and the rural economy. He said he will be taking up the issue at appropriate forums for seeking remedial and preventive measures against the LSD.

During his visit, the people apprised the Senior BJP leader about the various other community and individual issues, pertaining to power supply, drinking water and other utility services. He said the issues raised would be taken up at appropriate levels, especially with regard to restoration works in the wake of the recent monsoon rains, regulated power and drinking water supply, health and rations etc.
