



CRIME REPORT

Charge-sheet filed by SIA Jammu

JAMMU: The State Investigation Agency (SIA)/CID CI Jammu has presented the charge-sheet in case FIR No. 06/2010 of P/S JIC Jammu in the Court of 3rd Addl. Sessions Judge, Jammu. The charge-sheet has been presented on August 24, 2022 against a Pak trained Hizbul Mujahideen terrorist of District Doda namely Abdul Rashid alias Arsalan and another person namely Sartaz Ahmed @ Dr Sohail (killed in an encounter with security forces in 2009) under sections 13, 18, 18-B, 20, 38 Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967.

The Chief Investigating Officer of the case has proved that Abdul Rashid @ Arsalan and the other killed terrorist used to extort money and threaten the contractors, who were carrying out Govt. developmental work in District Doda and for recruitment in terrorist outfit Hizbul Mujahideen over cell phone.

The SIM of the cell phone over which these terrorists used to call and intimidate the law abiding citizens had been forcibly obtained from one Mohd Sharief by them. The accused Abdul Rashid was also involved in the various cases under FIR No. 03/2010 and FIR No. 31/2010 of Police Station Doda.

During 2009-2010, he acted as District Commander of proscribed terror outfit Hizbul Mujahideen and had remained instrumental in carrying out various unlawful activities in District Doda and other parts of Jammu and Kashmir. The charge-sheet has been diazried in the Trial Court.

Theft case solved, 3 arrested

HANDWARA: Police on Thursday solved a theft case by arresting three accused persons involved in commission of crime and recovered stolen property from their possession. As per details, on August 24, 2022, Police Station Vilgam received information about theft of communication cables in village Hafrada. Accordingly, FIR No 96/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Vilgam and investigation was initiated.

During the course of investigation, after strenuous efforts and based on leads developed during the investigation, three accused involved in the commission of crime were traced by joint parties of Police and Army and were subsequently arrested. They were identified as Owais Reyaz Lone, son of Reyaz Ahmed Lone, resident of Redbugh Kupwara; Amir Ahmed Ganie, son of Farooq Ahmed Ganie, resident of Check Keegam Kupwara and Nayeem Ahmed Bhagat, son of Ab Rashid Bhagat, resident of Gulgam Kupwara. On their disclosure, stolen cables were recovered from their possession. Besides, vehicle bearing registration number JK09-9702 used in crime was also been seized.

2 persons arrested; endangered medicinal herbs recovered

HANDWARA: Acting tough against the persons involved in illegal trade of endangered medicinal herbs, Police on Thursday arrested two accused persons and recovered endangered medicinal herbs from their possession.

A police party of Border Police Post Bungus during patrolling at Dhani Bhak Bungus intercepted two persons in a suspicious manner, who tried to flee away from the spot but were apprehended tactfully. They were identified as Aamir Hussain Sheikh, son of Khak Hussain Sheikh; Sadiq Ahmad Khandil, son of Mohd Ashraf Khandil, both residents of New Gabra Kernah were travelling with horses laden with bags. During search of bags, around 2 Kg endangered medicinal herbs (Saussurea

Costus) was recovered from their possession. They were arrested and shifted to police station where they remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No.58/2022 under relevant sections of law has been registered in Police Station Qalamabad and investigation started.

4 notorious drug-peddlers booked under PSA

SOPORE: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs from the society, Police on Thursday booked 04 notorious drug peddlers under Public Safety Act (PSA) after obtaining formal detention orders from the competent authority.

Earlier, Police in Sopore have arrested four notorious drug peddlers identified as Aadil Sultan Malla, son of Muhammad Sultan Malla, resident of Sheikh Sahib Chinkipora Sopore, Aadil Ashraf Khan, son of Muhammad Ashraf Khan, resident of Pethseer Sopore, Suhail Ahmad Ganie, son of Abdul Khaliq Ganie resident of Model Town Sopore and Bilal Ahmad Ganie, son of Ghulam Ahmad Ganie, resident of Hathishah Sopore. It is pertinent to mention here that all the accused persons were promoting drug abuse trade by supplying drugs to local youth. Subsequently, the cases were duly processed and after obtaining sanctions from the competent authority, the arrested drug peddlers were detained under Public Safety Act and were lodged in Kot-Balwal Jail Jammu.

D&FCO team seizes haul of intoxicants, drugs

JAMMU: The teams of Drug and Food Control Organisation have seized huge stocks of formulations containing Tapentadol (14,095 tablets) worth more than Rs 3 Lakh during a special drive launched across the Jammu Division. A team of Regulatory Officers of the Organization seized tramadol, tapentadol and allied pharmaceutical preparations during surprise inspections of De-addiction Centers, Pharma Dealers & Chemists Shops, under the relevant provisions of the Drugs & Cosmetics Act from and investigations in the matter have been initiated.

According to Organization, the inspection drive was conducted after evident reports regarding unethical trade and misuse of the tramadol, tapentadol by the anti social/ nefarious elements for the purpose of addiction and intoxication especially amongst the youth. "During the special drive the Inspecting teams observed that some firms were stocking huge quantities of Drugs Formulations consisting of Tapentadol especially by the De-addiction Centers/ Psychiatric-Clinics and selling the same in gross violation of the mandatory provisions," an official spokesperson said.

During the drive, operations of 17 Medical Establishments were disallowed under sections 22 (d) of Drugs & Cosmetics Act, 1940 on spot which included four each in Jammu and Samba, two in Kathua, three each in Udhampur and Rajouri and one in Ramban.

"The establishments were indulging in unethical trade practices particularly sale of habit forming formulations without maintaining records" he informed.

In light of these observations, the Department has directed all the Authorized Stockists dealing with such kind of formulations to strictly restrict sale and distribution of aforementioned restricted drugs for the legitimate requirements only. They have been further directed to submit distribution details of formulations consisting of habit forming ingredients on a monthly basis through mail: deputycontrollerjammu@gmail.com, so that Drugs Control Officers (Concerned) shall check the rationality and curb the unethical trade of such drugs, failing which severe action shall be taken against such erring firms. "Since these formulations which are otherwise Drug of Choice for patients suffering from severe/critical disease in their pain management, have high potential for addiction and respiratory depression when misused and taken in high doses.

Therefore, the Stakeholders are impressed upon to ensure judicious use of such formulations and maintain complete records open for cross verification" said Deputy Drugs Controller, Jammu. He further said that modalities are being worked out to channelize and restrict their procurement and sale through identified dealers only

especially near tertiary Care and District Hospitals to curb the diversion and misuse of aforementioned drugs without affecting the legitimate requirements of the patients for prevention and cure. State Drugs Controller, J&K has warned the defaulters to desist from any unethical trade practices, failing which strict action as warranted under the Act shall be taken against them.

D&FCO team seals medical stores

RAMBAN: Drug and Food Control Organization has intensified inspections across the district, especially in far-flung areas. In continuation of the drive, Drug Control Officer (DCO), Intimiyaz Ahmed on Thursday conducted an extensive inspection in Tehsil Ramban including Village Silla, Suligam, Gandoth, Brad Galion etc, and sealed a medical store on spot for violation of Drugs and Cosmetics Act 1940. The team also lifted four drug samples on a random basis to ascertain quality parameters by sending them for testing to the State Testing Laboratory.

7 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a quest to stern menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police team of Police Stations Nagrota, Miran Sahib, Bahu Fort, Kanachak and Police Post Chatha acted stringently on the specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 7 vehicles involved in illegal mining, which included Two tractor trolleys without Registration number seized by Nagrota Police; a Tractor Trolley (JK02CF-3663) seized by Miran Sahib Police; a Tractor Trolley (JK11B4270) seized by Bahu Fort police; a Tipper without Registration number seized by Kanachak Police; a tractor trolley (JK02BT 2489) seized by Gharota Police; a Tractor Trolley bearing Chassis No. MBNBG55AFMCH23615 seized by Chatha Police. The recoveries were made by SHO Nagrota Inspr Vishav Pratap Singh, SHO Miran Sahib Inspr Zaheer Mushtaq, SHO Bahu Fort Inspr Nayat Ali, SHO Kanachak Inspr Kunal Singh Jamwal, SHO Gharota Inspr Rajesh Khajuria and In-Charge Police Post Chatha PSI Ranjit Singh in their respective jurisdictions.

Missing woman traced, reunited with family

Narco-smuggler nabbed with heroin

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Police on Thursday nabbed a narco-smuggler and recovered 14 gm heroin from his possession. As per details, a team of Police Station Janipur led by SHO Janipur Inspector Ajaz Haider while on Naka duty rounded up suspects who were on their way towards Janipur towards Bantalab on vehicle (Jk19A-0995). During search 14 gm heroin was recovered from the suspects. In this regard, FIR No. 93/2022 U/S 8/21/22 NDPS Act got registered at Police Station Janipur and accused was arrested who was identified as Adil Hamid Bhat, son of Abdul Hameed Bhat, resident of Ashar, Banihal. The arrests and recoveries were made under the supervision of SDPO West Rahul Nagar.
