CRIMEREPORT

Inter-state gang of thieves busted; 4 arrested, 4 trucks recovered

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday busted an interstate-Gang of thieves by arresting four accused and recovered four trucks worth more than Rs 1 crore.

As per details, on July 7, 2022, a complainant lodged a complaint at Police Post Gadigarh stating that his truck was stolen during intervening night of July 6-7, 22. On this, FIR No 117/2022 under sections 379 of IPC was registered at Police Station Satwari. Similarly, two other cases of truck theft were reported at Police Post Bathindi on July 13 & 29 respectively, on which two more FIRs were registered at Police Station Bahu fort. Accordingly, on directions of SP South Mamta Sharma, two teams under the supervision of SDPO East DySP Zaheer Jafri and SDPO South Sachit Sharma were constituted. A team led by SHO Bahu Fort Inspr Nayat Ali assisted by Incharge Police Post Bhatindi PSI Mohd Younis Khanday and another team by SHO Satwari Inspr Sameer Jeelani assisted by Incharge Police Post Gadigarh SI Ravinder Singh raided at several places in their respective jurisdictions. Based on specific information, three suspects were rounded up who confessed their involvement in theft cases. The accused were identified as Bablu Kumar, son of Kewel Krishan; Shubam Sharma, son of Rakesh Sharma, both residents of Rajiv Nagar; Narwal and Ramesh Kumar, son of Shanker Dass, resident of Dansal Jhajjar Kotli. On their disclosures, a truck theft gang was busted and another accused namely Bittu Khurana, resident of Bhagwan Dass, resident of Kheri Markanda, Kurukshetra was also arrested and with timely intervention. Finally four trucks were recovered from Karnal Haryana. All the accused are being examined thoroughly and more arrests and recoveries are likely to be made in the case in days to come.



Shopkeeper arrested with 245 bundles of banned Chinese thread

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday nabbed a shopkeeper and recovered 245 bundles of banned Chinese Manja (Gattu) from his possession.

As per details, information was received at Police Post Chowk Chabutra regarding sale of banned synthetic thread after which special teams of



Police Post Chowk Chabutra under supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kallu led by SHO Pacea Danga Inspr Raghubir Singh assisted by Incharge Police Post Chowk Chabutra PSI Jyoti Choudhary raided at suspected location and rounded up a suspect, who was selling banned Chinese Manja. During search, 245 bundles of Chinese Manja (Gattu) were recovered from his possession.

In this regard, Docket sent to Police Station Pacea Danga for registration of FIR and accused was arrested, who was identified as Paramdeep Singh, son of Mohinder Singh, resident of House No 280, Old Rehari, Jammu.

Two theft cases solved; 2 arrested, stolen items recovered

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday solved two different theft cases by arresting two accused persons and recovered stolen items from their possession.

As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Channi Himmat by one Faheem Ahmed Tak regarding theft from his car at Gujjar Colony Jammu, in which a purse containing some cash, ATM card, Driving License, Identity card of office, along with a Samsung mobile phone was stolen by some unknown person. On this, FIR No 117/2022 under section 379 of IPC was registered and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Channi Himmat under the supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari led by SHO Channi Himmat Insp Deepak Katoch assisted by PSI Paramjeet Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts, rounded up an accused namely Zeeshan Choudhary, son of Mohd Isaq, resident of Gujjar Colony, Jammu. During further questioning, he confessed his involvement in crime and on his disclosure stolen items were recovered.

Similarly, on August 1, 2022, a written complaint was lodged at Police Post Canal Road by one Arti Thakur, daughter of Vijay Kumar, resident of Suid Lohrana Daechan, Kishtwar at present House No 736, Bhagwati Nagar regarding theft of a Mangalsutar (made of Gold) from her rented room. On receipt of information, a FIR No. 90/2022 under sections 454/380 of IPC was registered at Police Station Nowabad and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Nowabad under the supervision of DySP Hqrs Swati Sharma led by SHO Nowabad Inspr Vijay Kumar assisted by Incharge Police Post Canal Road PSI Amreek Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts, rounded up a suspect namely Rahul Kumar, son of Ashok Kumar, resident of Sheikh Nagar, Bahu Fort Jammu, at present House No 736, Bhagwati Nagar, Jammu. During sustained questioning, accused confessed his crime and on his disclosure stolen Mangalsutar was recovered.

Missing woman traced, reunited with family

to them after completing all the legal formalities.

2 drug-peddlers arrested, psychotropic substance recovered

BARAMULLA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs from the society, Police on Tuesday arrested 2 drug peddlers in Baramulla and recovered Psychotropic substances from their possession.

As per details, a party of Police Station Baramulla under the supervision of SHO Baramulla during routine checking near Khanpora Bridge Baramulla arrested 2 drug peddlers, who were identified as Bilal Ahmad Shiekh, son of Gh Hassan Shiekh, resident of Zehanpora Boniyar and Javid Rashid Bhat alias Izhar, son of Ab Rashid Bhat, resident of Mohalla Mir Sahib Baramulla. During search, officers were able to recover 1470 tablets of Spasmaproxivan from their possession. They were shifted to police station where they remained in custody. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law have been registered in Police Station Baramulla and investigation started.

Girl raped, case registered

Abortive bid to loot SBI ATM

POONCH: In an attempt to steal cash, burglars struck ATM of State Bank of India (SBI) installed in Quila Bazar Poonch during intervening night of August 1-2, 2022, but they failed to take away cash. The burglars broke ATM, but could not lay their hands at cash-box.

When customers went to ATM in morning on Tuesday, they found ATM in a badly damaged condition and informed bank authorities. The SBI officers, after visiting the site, reported the matter to police, which has registered a case and started investigation. However, as per authorities there was no loss of cash.



Two notorious criminals booked under preventive detention; another sent to judicial custody

RAJOURI: Police on Tuesday booked two notorious criminals under preventive detention while a notorious criminal was sent on judicial custody.

As per details, Thannamandi Police booked two notorious criminals namely Mohd Arif alias Kalia, son of Mohd Farooq, resident of Khablan Thannamandi and Javid Iqbal, son of Mohd Ashraf, resident of Banghai Thannamandi involved in various thefts cases, receiving stolen properties, drug peddling under sections 107/110/151 of CrPC and were sent to District Jail Dhangri by order of Executive Magistrate Thannamandi under preventive detention for a period of one month.

Meanwhile, a hardcore criminal Amjad Mahmood, son of Mohd Zaffar, resident of Badakana, Thannamandi, involved in various thefts cases, was also sent to District jail Dhangri on judicial custody after chargesheet was filed against him in the court of law. The cases include FIR no 128/2019 under sections 279/304A of RPC; FIR No 56/2022 under section 379 of IPC and FIR no 76/2022 under sections 457/380 of IPC.
