JHAJJAR KOTLI: Police on Tuesday seized illegal dumper material and handed it over to IMA Nagrota.



Four Ban toll plaza employees arrested for abducting commuter**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JHAJJAR KOTLI: Police on Tuesday arrested 4 employees of Ban toll plaza for abducting commuter.

As per details, a written application was submitted by one Faisal Maqbool Rather, son of Mohd Maqbool Rather, resident of Nowpora, Baramulla at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli stating that on August 2, 2022 at about 3:00 AM, he along with one Faizan Mushtaq Lone, son of Mushtaq Ahmed Lone, resident of Nowpora Baramulla was coming from Jalandhar towards Srinagar. But, when reached Ban Toll Plaza Nagrota, staff of Ban Toll Plaza misbehaved with them and abused despite paying toll tax through Fastag. The staff was wrongly demanding more amount. "After paying toll tax when they moved ahead, four to five persons of Ban Toll Plaza followed them on Alto car (JK02AG/5342) and wrongfully stopped their truck near Nandini Tunnel no.2. After that, they forcibly abducted and kidnapped Faizan Mushtaq Lone with intention to wrongfully confine him besides demanding more money by threatening, using rude language, but he managed to flee from spot somehow.

On the receipt of information FIR No.189/2022 under sections 341,342,365,504 506,34 of IPC was registered at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli and a team from Police Station Jhajjar Kotli led by SHO Inspector Vikram Sharma under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar and SP Rural Jammu Sanjay Sharma was constituted to work out abduction case. The police party swung into action and after making hectic efforts, nabbed accused persons, identified as Narinder Singh, son of Gopal Singh, resident of Korga Jandrah; Manish Kumar, son of Tarseem Lal, resident of Gurdaspur (Punjab); Mohd Akram, son of Zakeen Mohd, resident of



Sitharaman stressed that taxes have not been levied on food items consumed by the poor, as the GST has not been imposed on items that are sold loose.

While the minister was referring to a tax on a food item in West Bengal in the pre-GST era, TMC party leader Derek O'Brien tried to raise a point of order and later his party staged a walkout.

Sitharaman also clarified there is no GST on crematoriums, but the tax is only on the construction of a new crematorium.

Taliban under scrutiny...

The strike early Sunday shook awake Shirpur, once home to historic buildings bulldozed in 2003 to make way for luxury homes for officials in Afghanistan's Western-backed government and international aid organisations. After the US withdrawal in August 2021, the Taliban elite began taking some of the abandoned homes there.

The house where al-Zawahri stayed was the home of a top aide to senior Taliban leader Sirajuddin Haqqani, according to a senior US intelligence official. Taliban officials blocked AP journalists in Kabul from reaching the damaged house on Tuesday.

The UN Security Council was informed by monitors of militant groups in July that al-Qaida enjoys greater freedom in Afghanistan under the Taliban, but confines itself to advising and supporting the country's new rulers.

A report by the monitors said the two groups remain close and that al-Qaida fighters, estimated to number between 180 to 400, are represented at the individual level among Taliban combat units.

Major bovine smuggling bids foiled, 212 animals rescued**STATE TIMES NEWS**

SAMBAL/RAMBAN/REASI: Police on Tuesday foiled major bovine smuggling attempts by rescuing 212 animals in separate actions.

As per details, acting on information received from reliable sources regarding illegal transportation of bovines, a team of Police Station Ghagwal near Naka Tapay Ghagwal intercepted a truck (JK02AQ/2395). During checking, 14 bovines were found laden in truck, which were rescued. The driver namely Rafiqat Ali, son of Mohd Sardar, resident of Surinsar was arrested and FIR No. 115/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered against him at Police Station Ghagwal.

In another instance, acting on the specific inputs regarding transportation of bovine animals, police parties of Police Stations Batote, Chanderkote, Ramban, Ramsoo and Police Post Jawahar Tunnel intercepted 14 different vehicles (JK13D/9898, JK02AX/3709, JK21AK/2243, JK02BJ/3285, JK02AS/8717, JK21 F/4180, JK14 B/8681, JK19 8031, JK21F/4880, JK14H-6972, JK03B/9240, JK02BR/9717 and JK02AD/6289) and on checking found vehicle laden with 172 bovines, which were rescued. FIR Nos. 152,153,156/2022 registered at Police Station Batote, FIR Nos 117, 118/2022 at Chanderkote and FIR Nos 264,267,269,270,271/2022 at Police Station Ramban, FIR No. 81/2022 at Ramsoo and FIR No. 171/172/173 at Banihal under relevant sections of law and investigation started. Notably, 15 pilgrims lost their lives and 55 others were injured in flash floods due to heavy rainfall near the cave shrine in south Kashmir Himalayas on July 8.

The annual yatra -- which took place this year after a gap of about three years -- started on June 30.

Meanwhile, a batch of 570 pilgrims left the Bhagwati Nagar base camp here this morning to pay obeisance at the 3,880-metre-high cave shrine of Amarnath in south Kashmir Himalayas, officials said.

The 43-day Yatra began on June 30
