While Shivani Charak was the lone sportsperson of J&K to be awarded with the Outstanding Sports Persons for the year 2020, Sandeep was the lone sportsperson of Jammu Division to receive the honour for the year 2021. "Contribution from Sandeep Singh, who serves with Indian Navy was accepted gracefully by the club, the donation from Shivani Charak was greatly appreciated but humbly declined, she being a student," informed President of the Club, Ram Khajuria.

He said that he was pleasantly surprised and impressed when ace sport climber Shivani Charak, though a student, also announced to donate her award money to the club. Sandeep Singh, however,

requested that his small contribution may be utilized by the club preferably for the promotion of short treks for the budding trekkers.

"It shall be my very humble contribution to the club which has been promoting trekking, mountaineering and sport climbing in a big way for the last 40 years and despite financial and infrastructure constraints has produced international sport climbers and mountaineers" he added.

It is pertinent to mention here that 33 years old Sandeep Singh, a Physical Training Instructor in Indian Navy, after successfully completing his Basic and Advance Mountaineering Courses from Nehru Institute of Mountaineering (NIM), Uttarkashi, sealed Satopant, a formidable peak at a height of 7075 m in a pre Everest expedition in 2016 and submitted Everest on May 27, 2017. Sandeep Singh is also a

trained diver also who is qualified to go under water upto a depth of 35 meters.
