### G&M Deptt seizes 7 vehicles for illegal mining

ANANTNAG: In its efforts to curb illegal mining in the district, a team of officials from Geology and Mining (G&M) Department, Anantnag headed by District Mineral Officer Anantnag, Dr Showkat Ahmad Bhat seized 7 vehicles found involved in illegal extraction/transportation of minor minerals on Thursday. The operation was carried out by Geology & Mining Department in various areas of Anantnag including Sandrani Nallah near Sadura/Damjan, Aarpath Nallah near Teiwan Shangus and Bijebehara, during which 7 vehicles including a Dumper, a tipper and 5 tractors were seized. Strict action as per rules shall be taken against all those found involved in mining, said DMO. It is worthwhile to mention that the Geology & Mining Department is continuously conducting surprise raids in areas having apprehension of illegal mining.

### Two bootleggers nabbed, 150 bottles of illicit liquor seized

JHAJJAR KOTLI/BISHNAH: Police on Thursday nabbed two bootleggers and recovered 150 bottles of illicit liquor from them.

As per details, a team of Police Stations Jhajjar Kotli and Bishnah under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar and SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh led by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Inscr Vikram Sharma and SHO Bishnah Inscr Pawan Kumar, assisted by ASI Mohd Latif, laid special Nakas in their respective jurisdictions and recovered 150 bottles of illicit liquor i.e., 50 bottles by Jhajjar Kotli police and 100 bottles by Bishnah police. A vehicle (PB71/4425) was also seized. Accordingly, two cases viz i.e., FIR No.192/2022 and FIR No. 133/2022 under sections 48 (a) Excise Act were registered at Police Stations Jhajjar Kotli and Bishnah respectively and accused were arrested, who were identified as Bodh Raj, son of Tara Mani, resident of Jandrah, Tehsil Dalsal arrested by Jhajjar Kotli police and Rajinder Kumar, son of Raj Kumar, resident of village Deoli Tehsil Bishnah, arrested by Bishnah Police.

### Man arrested with 45 psychotropic injections

JAMMU: Police on Thursday nabbed a man and recovered 45 psychotropic injections from his possession.

As per details, a team of Police Station Domana led by SHO Inscr Tilak Raj assisted by Incharge Police Post Pouni Chak PSI Nitish Khajuria while on Naka duty at Anand Nagar near Mint leaf restaurant area, rounded up a suspect namely Vipin Pandita, son of Late Bansi Lal Pandita, resident of Om Nagar, Udhewalla. On search, 15 Diazepam, 15 Rexogesic injections and 15 Phenergan injections-Promethazine Hydrochloride were recovered from his possession. He was arrested and FIR under relevant sections was registered against him at Police Station Domana. Intensive questioning is going on to know about his other accomplices in crime. The overall arrest and recoveries were made under supervision of SDPO Domana Sunil Singh.

Shopkeeper nabbed with 210 bundles of banned Chinese Manja Jammu: Police on Thursday nabbed a shopkeeper with 210 bundles of banned Chinese Manja (Gattu).

As per details, information was received at Police Station Kanhachak regarding sale of banned synthetic thread. On this, a team of Police Station Kanhachak under the supervision of SDPO Domana Sunil Singh led by SHO Kanhachak Inscr Kunal Singh Jamwal raided a suspected place and rounded up a person found selling banned Chinese Manja. During search, 210 bundles of Chinese Manja (Gattu) were recovered from his possession. The accused, identified as Rajinder Singh, son of Des Raj, resident of Shama Chak was arrested and FIR No 90/2022 under relevant sections was registered at Police Station Kanhachak.

### 8 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a quest to stern menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police teams of Police Stations Arnia, Miran Sahib, Gharota, Police Posts Phallian Mandal, Manwal and Border Police Post Jogwan acting stringently on specific inputs, raided at different locations and seized 8 different vehicles involved in illegal mining, including a Tractor Trolley without registration number seized by Miran Sahib Police; 2 Tractor-Trolleys without Registration number seized by Arnia Police; a tipper (JK02CU 7891) seized by Gharota Police; 2 vehicles i.e., a Tractor-Trolley bearing Chassis No.GZCDS844980S3 and a tractor trolley (JK02CW 1712) seized by Phallian Mandal Police; a Dumper (JK21H-4700) seized by Manwal Police and a tractor without registration number seized by Jogwan Police. The recoveries were made by SHO Miran Sahib Inscr Zaheer Mushtaq, SHO Arnia Inscr Devinder Singh, SHO Gharota Inscr Rajesh Khajuria, Incharge Police Posts Phallian Mandal PSI Ajesh Singh Jamwal, Manwal-PSI Ayub Khan and Jogwan-PSI Kapil Singh Wazir in their respective jurisdictions.

### Theft case solved; woman arrested, stolen ATM card along with cash recovered

MIRAN SAHIB: Police on Thursday solved a theft case solved by arresting an accused woman and recovered stolen ATM card along with cash.

As per details, a written complaint was lodged at Police Station Miran Sahib by one Raj Kumari, wife of Ashok Kumar, resident of Khour Deonian regarding theft of her ATM card and withdrawal of money from her account. On this, FIR No 87/2022

under sections 484/380 of IPC was registered and investigation started. A team of Police Station Miran Sahib under the supervision of SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh led by SHO Miran Sahib Inscr Zaheer Mushtaq, after putting in strenuous efforts and connecting various leads, rounded up a suspected woman namely Daya Wanti, wife of Son Nath, resident of Khour Deonian. During further questioning, she confessed her crime and on her disclosure, stolen ATM card along with an amount of Rs 24,000 was recovered from her possession.

### 3 missing women traced, reunited with families

KATHUA: Police on Thursday traced three missing women and reunited them with their families.

As per details, on July 8, 2022 a missing report was lodged at Police Station Kathua by a person stating therein that his wife and daughter, resident of Uttarbehni, Vijaypur Tehsil Purnamal & District Samba went missing from his house. Acting on the complaint, a missing report was registered at Police Station Kathua and search was launched to trace out missing women. With the continuous strenuous efforts coupled with technical assistance, a team of Police Station Kathua traced the woman along with her daughter on Thursday.

While in second instance, another missing report, regarding a woman, resident of Plassi Tehsil, Basohli dated July 29, 2022 was closed at Police Station Basohli as she was traced out. All the above women were handed over to their legal heirs after completion of all legal formalities.

### 58 bovines rescued, 5 smugglers arrested

UDHAMPUR: Police on Thursday rescued 58 bovines and arrested 5 smugglers at Udhampur, Kathua and Rajouri districts.

As per details, on directions of SSP Udhampur Dr. Vinod Kumar and under the supervision of DySP HQS Sahil Mahajan, a party of Police Station Rehambal headed by Insp Rajesh Sharma and assisted by PSI Abdul Satar Incharge Police Post Tikri established a Naka at Tikri. During checking, a vehicle (JK02AR 8377) carrying bovines was intercepted and 30 bovines were found laden in it, which were rescued. The driver identified as Shabir Ahmed, son of Mohd Ashraf, resident of Leray Udhampur was arrested and FIR under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Rehambal.

In another case, a party of Police Station Chenani headed by Insp Om Parkash SHO Chenani under supervision of SDPO Chenani Ahmed Shaafi intercepted a truck (JK13D 9898) and rescued 14 bovines at Motorshed Naka point Chenani. On questioning, driver disclosed his identity as Amar Dev, son of Sanjiv Dev, resident of Hojai District Assam, who was arrested on spot. A case under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Chenani.

In another instance, a police team led by Insp Amit Sangra SHO Rajbagh under the supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan under the overall supervision of SSP Kathua, R C Kotwal while on Naka/checking duty near NITW Rajbagh Naka intercepted a Mahindra Load Carrier (JK08J-9585), being driven by one Sadaq Ali, son of Mohd. Farooq, resident of Rakh Sarkar Palai Tehsil Hiranagar along with his associate Farmaani Ali, son of Hukum Din, resident of Garian Kalan Tehsil Chenani District Udhampur. On thorough checking, 2 bovines were found laden in it, which were rescued. Duo was arrested and FIR No. 164/2022 under sections 188 of IPC Act, 11 of PCA act was registered against them at Police Station Rajbagh. Meanwhile, Rajouri Police team headed by PSI Sahil Choudhary rescued 12 bovines in Chatyar area from a bovine smuggler. He was arrested and a case under relevant section of law was registered against him.


### Truck carrying 1,350 Kg banned polythene seized, driver arrested

During checking, police recovered 27 bags of banned polythene bags weighing about 1350 Kg from truck and Divisional Officer Pollution Control Board Jammu was informed. The truck along with banned material was seized and handed over to concerned officers for further proceedings under law.

### Body of drowned teenage youth retrieved from Neeru River

BHADARWAH: After hectic efforts, the body of drowned teenage youth has been retrieved from Neeru River near Bhalla area of Additional District Bhadarwah, on Bhadarwah-Doda Road on Thursday morning.

Shamoon Hussain, son of Noor Hussain, resident of Chilli Bhalessa at present Village Kungla Tehsil Bhalla, went missing while taking bath in fast flowing stream of Neeru River at Senai area last night. SHO Bhadarwah Jatinder Singh Rakwal said that after hectic efforts, the body has been fished out from the Neeru River at Senai area near Bhalla.

According to reports, 14 years old Shamoon Hussain presently putting up in village Kungla was taking bath along with his friends in Neeru river at Senai area, when suddenly Shamoon slipped into the fast flowing stream of the river and disappeared. The boys immediately raised an alarm and informed the locals, who reached the spot and also informed the police. SHO Bhadarwah Jatinder Singh Rakwal said that a police team along with locals started the search and rescue operation from 7 to 10 PM last night. We resumed the search operation today early morning and fished out the body of drowned teenager from the river at 7 AM.

"After legal formalities, the body was handed over to family members," SHO informed.
