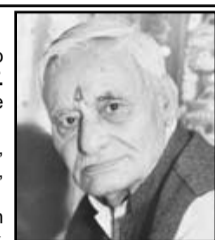

CRIME REPORT

Three theft cases solved; 4 arrested, stolen items recovered

STATE TIMES NEWS
JAMMU: Police on Friday solved three different theft cases by arresting 4 accused persons and recovered stolen items from their possession.

As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Gangval by one Banshi Lal, son of Dhani Ram, resident of Nagrota at present Shiv Nagar, Jogi Mohalla Jammu, stating that on May 29, 2022 some unknown persons entered his house and decamped with gold ornaments and some other items. On this case FIR No. 62/2022 under sections 454/380 of IPC was registered and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Gangval under the supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Gangval Inspr Joginder Singh Chib, after putting in strenuous efforts, rounded up suspects namely Vivek Sharma, son of Kedar Nath, resident of Nourgan Bishnah and Atish Jangral, son of Ashok Kumar, resident of Kotli Main Fateh Bishnah. During further questioning, the accused confessed their involvement in crime and on their disclosure, stolen items including gold ornaments 6 tola and household items viz a washing machine, a LED, an inverter, a transformer, 3 motors, a battery, 8 bags of rice etc totaling to Rs 5 lakh approximately were recovered.

Similarly, on July 28, 2022 a written complaint was lodged by one Atish, son of Hira Lal, resident of Shastri Nagar stating that his scooter (JK02D/6604) Vespa was stolen by someone from Satwari. On receipt of this information, FIR No. 134/22 under section 379 of IPC was registered and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Satwari under supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Satwari Inspr Sameer Jeelani, after putting in strenuous efforts, rounded up a suspect namely Vinay Verma, son of Prakash Chand, resident of Shastri Nagar. During intensive questioning, accused confessed his involvement in crime and on his disclosure stolen scooter was recovered.

Also, another complaint was lodged by one Eshan Gupta, son of Vijay Kumar, resident of Shastri Nagar, Jammu at Police Station Gandhi Nagar regarding theft of his Scooty (JK02BT/7281) near Ram Darbar Mandir. On this, FIR No. 186/2022 under section 379 of IPC was registered and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Gandhi Nagar under the supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Gandhi Nagar Inspr Pankaj Sharma, after putting in strenuous efforts, rounded up a suspect namely Rohin Kumar, son of Jagir Lal, resident of Dator Tehsil R S Pura Jammu. On his disclosure, stolen scooter and one more bike bearing Chassis No. 29861 & Engine No. 42664 were also recovered. The overall operation was done under the supervision of SP South Mamta Sharma.

Two narco-smugglers nabbed with 15.28 gm heroin

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Police on Friday nabbed two narco smugglers and recovered 15.28 gm heroin from their possession. As per the details, a team of Police Post Chatha led by SHO Satwari Inspr Sameer Jeelani assisted by Incharge Police Post Chatha SI Ranjit Singh Chib while on Naka duty rounded up two suspects on a vehicle (JK02CM 6248). On search 15.8 grams of heroin was recovered from them. The suspects were later identified as Sachin Kumar, son of Somraj, resident of Digiana Ashram and Rishav Sharma, son of Arvind Sharma, resident of Lower Gadigarh. Duo was arrested and FIR No. 135/2022 under sections 8/21/22/29 NDPS Act was registered against them in Police Station Satwari. The whole operation was done under the supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma.

Two missing persons traced, reunited with families

JAMMU: Police on Friday traced two missing persons and reunited them with their families. As per details, two different complaints were lodged at Police Station Bakshi Nagar and Police Post Pouni Chak, by legal heirs of a boy and a minor girl, stating that they went missing from their respective houses. In this regard two different missing reports i.e., missing report on July 28, 2022 regarding missing of boy namely Prince, son of Rajinder Gupta, resident of Upper Resham Ghar Colony, Jammu was registered at Police Station Bakshi

Nagar while cognisance of missing girl was taken up by Police Post Pouni Chak and investigation started.

On this special, police teams were formed under supervision of SDPO West Rahul Nagar and SDPO Domana Sunil Singh. The team led by SHO Bakshi Nagar Inspr Harjeet Singh and SHO Domana Inspr Tilak Raj assisted by Incharge Pouni Chak PSI Nitish Khajuria, after putting in hectic efforts, generated input regarding presence of missing boy in Maharashtra.

He was finally traced from Dadar Mumbai, Maharashtra with help of local police of the area. Similarly missing girl was traced from the area under jurisdiction of Police Post Pouni Chak. Subsequently, their families were informed and both traced persons were handed over to their respective family members after completing all legal formalities.

8 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU/UDHAMPUR: In a quest to stem the menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police teams of Police Station Khour, Police Posts Greater Kailash and Sidhra acted stringently on the specific inputs, raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 4 different vehicles involved in illegal mining, which included a tractor-trolley without registration number seized by Khour Police; two tippers (JK02BF7268 and JK02BN5377) seized by Greater Kailash Police and a dumper (JK02CT 9260) seized by Sidhra Police. The recoveries were made by SHO Khour Inspr Balvinder Singh, Incharge Police Posts Greater Kailash PSI Harish Chander and Sidhra-SI Majid Hussain in their respective jurisdictions.

Udhampur Police under overall supervision of SSP Udhampur Dr. Vinod Kumar also seized 4 vehicles involved in illegal transportation of construction material in the jurisdiction of Police Post Roundmail. A team headed by Incharge Police Post Roundmail PSI Akhlesh Khajuria under the supervision of Anwaar Ul Haq Addl. SP Udhampur and DySP Hqrs Sahil Mahajan seized 4 tractors (3 from Roun Domail area and 1 from Village Krowa) bearing registration numbers JK14G 2003, JK14G 8459, JK14H 9921 indulged in illegal extraction/transporting of construction material. All 4 seized vehicles were immediately handed over to the officials of Geological and Mining department Udhampur for further legal proceedings.

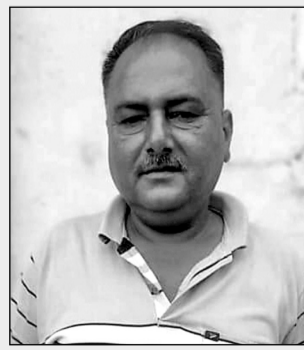
2 shopkeepers nabbed with 42 bundles of banned Chinese Manja

AKHNOOR/JAMMU: Police on Friday nabbed two shopkeepers with 42 bundles of banned Chinese Manja. As per details, information was received at Police Station Akhnoor regarding sale of banned synthetic threads. On this, a team of Police Station Akhnoor under the supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial led by SHO Akhnoor Inspr Hilal Azhar raided the place and rounded up a suspect who was selling banned Chinese Manja. During search, 10 bundles of Chinese Manja (Gattu) were recovered from his possession. Accused was arrested and FIR No. 227/2022 under sections 188 of IPC was registered against him at Police Station Akhnoor. The arrested person was identified as Sikander Kumar, son of Om Parkash, resident of Ward-2, Daskal Akhnoor.

Similarly, acting on information received at Police Post Talab Tillo regarding sale of banned synthetic thread, a team of Police Post Talab Tillo under supervision of DySP Hqrs Swati Sharma led by SHO Nowabad Inspr Vijay Kumar assisted by Incharge Police Post Talab Tillo PSI Rajesh Kumar raided the place and rounded up a suspect, found selling banned Chinese Manja. During search, 32 bundles of Chinese Manja (Gattu) were recovered from his possession. Accused, identified as Rakesh Kumar, son of Late Banarsi Lal, resident of Bhagwati Nagar, was arrested and a case under relevant section was registered at Police Station Nowabad. The arrest was made in violation of DM order regarding ban on sale of plastic/synthetic threads (Manja).

Trucker arrested; 700 gm poppy straw recovered

REASI: Police on Friday arrested a trucker and recovered 700 gm of poppy straw from his possession. As per details, during routine checking and frisking, a party of Police Post Dansal led by PSI Varinder Singh and Insp Jeet Manhas SHO Arnas under the supervision of Prithpal Singh SDPO Arnas intercepted a truck (JK20B-0510) driven by one Basharat Ahmed, son of Mohd Sarwar, resident of Kheral Tehsil & District Reasi and recovered 700 gm poppy straw from vehicle. He was arrested and FIR No. 113/2022 under section 8/15/25 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Arnas.



Notorious drug-peddler arrested with brown sugar

SOPORE: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs from the society, Police on Friday arrested a notorious drug peddler in Sopore and recovered contraband substance from his possession.

He was identified as Sona-Ullah-Shalla, son of Muhammad Subhan Shalla, resident of Gul Abad Arampora, Sopore. During checking, 300 gm Brown Sugar like substance was recovered from his possession. He was arrested and shifted to police station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No. 166/2022 under relevant sections of law stands registered at Police Station Sopore and investigation started.

Theft in mobile shop; Rs 10,000 cash, phones stolen

R S PURA: Thieves on Friday burgled a mobile phone shop at R S Pura town and decamped with Rs 10,000 cash and phones.

As per details, shop-owner Manish Chopra lodged a complaint with police that thieves targeted his shop on Thursday night by breaking lock of shutter and decamped with Rs 10,000 cash and mobile phones worth Rs 4 lakh. He further submitted CCTV footage of his shop to police, in which a youth was seen collecting mobile phones. Police has registered a case and started investigation.

BSF Jawan commits suicide

ANANTNAG: A BSF Jawan committed suicide by shooting himself at Anantnag area on Friday.

As per details, Mitul Hazarika, resident of Assam, presently posted at Anantnag for Yatra duty shot himself with his service rifle. On hearing gunshot, his colleagues rushed to the spot and found him in pool of blood. He was shifted to hospital where he was declared as brought dead by doctors. Police is investigating the matter.

Woman among two arrested with heroin, illicit liquor

KATHUA: Acting against narcotics smuggling/consumption & production of illicit liquor within district, Kathua Police under the guidance of SSP Kathua R C Kotwal on Friday arrested two narco-smugglers including a woman and recovered approximately 9 gm Heroin like narcotics along with 7 lts illicit liquor from their possession.

As per details, a police team led by Insp O P Chib SHO Kathua under the supervision of DySP Headquarters Kathua Shammi Kumar during Naka/checking duty in its jurisdictional area apprehended a suspected woman identified as Shillo Devi, wife of Ram Paul alias Palli, resident of Chak Drab Khan Kathua. On checking, a black-coloured polythene containing approximately 9 gm Heroin like narcotics was recovered from her. She was arrested and FIR No. 304/2022 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Kathua. It is pertinent to mention here that accused is a habitual offender and three different cases vide FIR Nos 61/2019, 284/2019 & 530/2021 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS have already registered against her at Police Station Kathua.

While in another instance, information was received from the reliable source that few persons were doing trade of selling illicit liquor to people of Phalote Village near canal. Acting swiftly, a team of Police Station Kathua during special checking/ patrolling duty, noticed one suspect found indulged in trade of selling illicit liquor to people. On physical checking approximately 7 lts illicit liquor was recovered from his possession. The accused, identified as Shiv Kumar, son of Jallu Ram, resident of Ghati at present Phalote Tehsil & District Kathua, was arrested and FIR No 303/2022 under section 48(a) Excise Act was registered at Police Station Kathua.

Two killed in roof collapse at Kathua Landslides force closure of Jammu-Srinagar highway, Mughal Road

JAMMU: Two people died when the shed of a poultry farm collapsed due to heavy rains in Kathua district on Friday, officials said.

The incident happened in Keerian Gandyal area of the district, they said, adding three people were buried under the shed.

While two of them died, an injured person was shifted to a hospital in Pathankot. Meanwhile, the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway and Mughal Road were closed for vehicular traffic due to landslides and shooting stones triggered by heavy rain at several places in Jammu and Kashmir's Ramban and Poonch districts, officials said.

A few hundred vehicles, including those carrying a batch of Amarnath Yatra pilgrims, are stranded on the highway, they said. Heavy rains triggered shooting of stones at Mehar and Cafeteria Morh in Ramban, blocking the highway, the officials said. A convoy of 174 Amarnath Yatra pilgrims has been halted at Chanderkoot Yatra Niwas till clearance of the road, they said. Vehicular traffic on the historic Mughal Road in Poonch was suspended on Friday due to a landslide triggered by heavy rains, according to the officials. The road, which connects Poonch and Rajouri districts in Jammu region with Shopian in South Kashmir, is an alternative route to the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway. The restoration work of the twin roads to Kashmir is in progress, they said.

People are advised not to travel on Jammu-Srinagar Highway without confirmation from traffic authorities, the officials added.
