

LCMA conducts demolition drive in various areas of Srinagar

SRINAGAR: In its continuous drive against illegal constructions/encroachments, the Enforcement Wing of Lake Conservation and Management Authority (LCMA) on Monday carried out a demolition drive in the areas of Braine Phaloo, Batpora, Ishber Khunam Mohalla, Hakeem Mohalla Bagwanpora Lal Bazar, Nowpora and Kanitar/Saderbal.

During the drive, illegal structures including three 2nd storeys and one 3rd storey that were under construction were demolished. Besides one wooden shed, one Shopping complex, one plinth and one shed struc-

ture was also razed to ground. Legal action was also initiated against the violators. Meanwhile, all the public residing within the LCMA jurisdiction and in lake are hereby once again directed not to go for any sort of illegal constructions/encroachments, as the Enforcement wing will continue demolition drives against illegal constructions/ removal of encroachments.

Besides, strict action will be taken against the violators who shall be found indulging in illegal construction activities. Also CCTV Cameras have been installed in order to curb the ferrying of illegal building material in the district.

Speaking on the occasion, the ZEO Hajin, Mohammad Akbar said that under the directions of Deputy Commissioner Bandipora, Mega Tiranga rally was kick-started in Zone Hajin in which a number of students have participated and this will continue till 15th August. Besides, number of events will be conducted ahead of 15 August celebration, he added.

Udhampur Police also rescued 81 bovines from clutches of smugglers while foiling six smuggling bids in Udhampur, Chenani and Tikri.

On directions of SSP Udhampur Dr Vinod Kumar and under the supervision of Addl. SP Udhampur Anwaar ul Haq Addl SP Udhampur and DySP Hqrs Sahil Mahajan, a party of Police Station Udhampur led by Insp Chaman Gorkha SHO Udhampur established a Naka point at Jakhni for checking of vehicles. Police foiled three bovine smuggling attempts and registered 3 FIRs no. 340/341/342 of 2022 under relevant sections of law and rescued 48 bovines from clutches of 2 bovine smugglers namely Farooq Ahmed, son of Rehmat Ali, resident of Rakha Barotian, Samba and Mohd Ashraf, son of Gh Qadir, resident of Samba. Both smugglers were arrested on spot whereas two other accused, taking advantage of darkness, managed to flee.

While foiling another attempt of bovine smuggling, a party of Police Station Chenani led by Insp Om Parkash SHO Chenani under the supervision of Ahmed Shaafi SDPO Chenani intercepted 2 trucks (JK02AR 8759 and JK03E 2502). The drivers of both vehicles fled from the spot taking advantage of heavy traffic on road. On checking, 29 bovines were found laden in 2 vehicles, which were rescued. FIR Nos. 138 & 139 of 2022 under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Chenani. While foiling another attempt, a party of Police Post Tikri led by SHO Police Station Rehambal Insp Rajesh Sharma and assisted by Incharge Police Post Tikri PSI Abdul Satar intercepted a Mahindra Bolero (JK02CG 7516) and rescued 4 bovines. The driver, identified as Prince Sharma, son of Naresh Kumar, resident of Salehar, was arrested. In this connection, case under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Rehambal and further investigation is underway.

The NGOs/ Voluntary Organizations registered on the Darpan Portal of the Niti Aayog will apply online application on www.ngomwcd.gov.in and submit hard copies as prescribed in Annexure A to the District Programme Officers POSHAN against proper receipt of the respective Districts of J&K along with the list of documents as mentioned in Annexure B.

Eligibility Criteria:

1. The NGOs/Voluntary Organizations registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860.
2. NGOs/ Voluntary Organizations having Audited accounts for last 3 years and experience of minimum 3 years for providing child care services to children between six months to six years.

Terms and Conditions for Opening a Crèche:

1. The Crèche units must be opened near the areas where large number of women are employed and work for 6-8 hours a day. The sights for opening crèches could be near Hospitals, Educational Institutions, Colleges, Universities, Government offices, Shopping malls, Industrial Areas, construction sites etc.
2. The crèche should be located near the homes of Children or near the place of work of the mother preferably at a walking distance i.e. 1/2 to 1 Km.
3. The Crèche must be opened at least 02Kms away from the functional Anganwadi Center of particular area.
4. Ideally the Crèche should be opened where at least 25 beneficiaries in the age group 6 months- 6 years are present.
