

LCMA conducts demolition drive in various areas of Srinagar

107 bovines rescued; 5 smugglers arrested

 SAMBA/UDHAMPUR: Police on Monday foiled various attempts to smuggle bovines by rescuing 107 bovines and arrested 5 smugglers in Samba and Udhampur districts. As per details, acting on an information received through reliable sources regarding illegal transportation of bovines, a party from Police Post Mansar while performing vehicle checking duty intercepted a truck (JK02AR/1439). During checking, 13 bovines were found laden inside the truck, which were rescued. The driver namely Surjeet Kumar, son of Sat Paul, resident of Tanda R S Pura Jammu was arrested and FIR No. 204/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered against him at Police Station Samba. In another similar incident, same police party rescued 13 more bovines at Naka point Mansar which were being transported illegally in a truck (JK02AQ/ 5369) and arrested accused driver namely Manmohan Singh, son of Partap Singh, resident of Govindpora, Ramban. FIR No. 205/2022 under sections 188 IPC, 11 PCA Act was registered at Police Station Samba.

'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' Har Ghar Tiranga: Cultural programme held at HSS Rahmoo

 PULWAMA: In connection with 'Har Ghar Tiranga' campaign under the aegis of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' initiative of government, a colourful cultural programme was on Monday organised by Higher Secondary School (HSS), Rahmoo in collaboration with Chief Education Office, Pulwama. The program was presided over by Principal

Higher Secondary School Rahmoo and was attended by the staff members and students. The programme highlighted the cultural vibrancy of Kashmir showcasing Band Pather, Nukad Natak, Bach e Nagmi and Roaff. Speaking on the occasion, Principal HSS stressed on the need to organise such programs across the length and breadth of the country so that diverse cultural threads are preserved and revered as well. The programme concluded with the pledge, "while we celebrate 75th year of Independence we need to keep our rich traditions and culture afloat, and set the goal of preparing our students for academic excellence". The NSS Unit of the institution was appreciated for their selfless service in managing the program.

Udhampur Police also rescued 81 bovines from clutches of smugglers while foiling six smuggling bids in Udhampur, Chenani and Tikri .

On directions of SSP Udhampur Dr Vinod Kumar and under the supervision of Addl. SP Udhampur Anwaar ul Haq Addl SP Udhampur and DySP Hqrs Sahil Mahajan , a party of Police Station Udhampur led by Insp Chaman Gorkha SHO Udhampur established a Naka point at Jakheni for checking of vehicles. Police foiled three bovine smuggling attempts and registered 3 FIRs no. 340/341/342 of 2022 under relevant sections of law and rescued 48 bovines from clutches of 2 bovine smugglers namely Farooq Ahmed, son of Rehmat Ali, resident of Rakh Barotian, Samba and Mohd Ashraf, son of Gh Qadir, resident of Samba. Both smugglers were arrested on spot whereas two other accused, taking advantage of darkness, managed to flee.

While foiling another attempt of bovine smuggling, a party of Police Station Chenani led by Insp Om Parkash SHO Chenani under the supervision of Ahmed Shaafi SDPO Chenani intercepted 2 trucks (JK02AR 8759 and JK03E 2502). The drivers of both vehicles fled from the spot taking advantage of heavy traffic on road. On checking, 29 bovines were found laden in 2 vehicles, which were rescued. FIR Nos. 138 & 139 of 2022 under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Chenani. While foiling another attempt, a party of Police Post Tikri led by SHO Police Station Rehambal Insp Rajesh Sharma and assisted by Incharge Police Post Tikri PSI Abdul Satar interecepted a Mahindra Bolero (JK02CG 7516) and rescued 4 bovines. The driver, identified as Prince Sharma, son of Naresh Kumar, resident of Salehar, was arrested. In this connection, case under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Rehambal and further investigation is underway.

Terms and Conditions for Opening a Crèche:

- The Crèche units must be opened near the areas where large number of women are employed and work for 6-8 hours a day. The sights for opening crèches could be near Hospitals, Educational Institutions, Colleges, Universities, Government offices, Shopping malls, Industrial Areas, construction sites etc.
- The crèche should be located near the homes of Children or near the place of work of the mother preferably at a walking distance i.e1/2 to 1 Km.
