JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Police on Saturday nabbed a narco smuggler and recovered 6 grams of heroin from him.

As per details, a team of Police Station Satwari led by SDPO Sonu Sachit Sharma assisted by SHO Satwari Inspr Sumet Sharma and SI Jaimal Singh while on Naka duty rounded up one suspected person. During search 06 grams of heroin was recovered from his possession.

The accused identified as Ajit Singh alias Rajan, son of Daya Singh, resident of Karan Bagh was arrested and FIR No. 171/2023 under section 8/21/22 NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Satwari.

Two women nabbed with 14 Kgs poppy straw

substance abuse, Police on Saturday nabbed two women and recovered 14 Kgs of poppy straw from their possession.

As per details, a team of Police Post Sidhra led by SDPO Nagrota Akash Kohli assisted by SHO Nagrota Inspr Vishav Partap Singh and In-Charge Police Post Sidhra PSI Arun Kumar while on Naka duty at Point Tawi bridge Sidhra rounded up two suspected ladies who were on their way from Nagrota towards Sidhra. During search 14 Kgs of poppy straw was recovered from their possession.

Duo identified as Paramjeet Kour, wife of Sukhdev Singh, resident of Reya Beas Cheema Bhati Teh Baba Kalan District Amritsar Punjab and Sunita, wife of Sukhdev Singh, resident of Reya Beas Cheema Bhati Teh Baba Kalan Dist Amritsar Punjab were arrested and FIR No. 344/2023 under section 08/15 NDPS ACT was registered against them at Police Station Nagrota.

Drug peddler nabbed with 4500 intoxicating capsules

JAMMU: Police on Saturday nabbed a drug peddler and recovered 4500 psychotropic capsules from his possession

On search of his belongings, 4500 SPAM PAIN + psychotropic capsules were recovered from him.

He was arrested and FIR No. 243/23 under section 8/21/22 NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Bahu Fort. Intensive questioning is going on to know about his other accomplices in the crime. The overall arrest and recoveries

were made under the supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari.

4 arrested for abetment to suicide

SAMBA: Police on Saturday arrested four accused for abetment to suicide hence solved mysterious death case of Bodh Raj of RakhAmbTalli vide FIR 306/109 IPC registered at Police Station Samba.

The arrested accused have been identified as Faqir Chand, son of Lalo Ram; Surjit Kumar, son of Faqir Chand; Ashok Kumar, son of Jagdish Raj, all residents of Rakh Amb Talli and Jameet Roy, so of Lt. Sadhu Ram, resident of Meen Sarkar Barjani Bari Brahmana.

Senior Superintendent of Police Samba Benam Tosh said that on July 20, 2023 an information was received through reliable sources at Police Post RakhAmbTalli to the effect that one person namely Bodh Raj, son of Lalo Ram age 52 years, who was under treatment at GMC as poison case, expired at GMC Jammu and that his dead body was lying at mortuary room. Upon this information, Police initiated inquest proceedings u/s 174 CrPC to ascertain the actual cause of death. Police completed legal formalities, got conducted post-mortem, sent viscera to FSL and inquest was underway. In the meantime, Police received directions u/s 156 (3) CrPC from Hon'ble Court of CJM Samba to register FIR and in compliance with the court directions, FIR No. 197/2023 u/s 306/109 IPC has been registered at Police Station Samba, four accused have been arrested and further investigation is going on under the supervision of DySP Garu Ram and Additional SP Samba SurinderChoudhary.

MVD Doda Team cracks down on Traffic violators in drive on NH244

DODA: In a determined effort to enforce road safety rules and traffic regulations, a team of Motor Vehicle Department (MVD) Doda on Saturday conducted an early morning enforcement drive on NH244. The operation witnessed thorough checking of more than 150 vehicles, with a focus on verifying essential documents and ensuring adherence to traffic rules.



During the course of the extensive inspection, 45 vehicles were issued Challans for different violations, while 8 vehicles were compounded with on-the-spot recovery of Rs 10,000 fine. Five Inspectors transferred

Moreover, Inspector Vikram Sharma, presently performing his duties with District Jammu has been repatriated to Cyber Police Station Jammu for further duties with immediate effect.

Land broker arrested for fraudulently selling migrant property in Srinagar

JAMMU: A land broker allegedly involved in facilitating the transfer of migrant property worth crores of rupees by forging a power of attorney was arrested from Srinagar after eight years, Jammu and Kashmir Police Crime Branch said on Saturday. A special team of the Economic Offences Wing of Crime Branch Jammu apprehended Ghulam Rasool Mir alias

Rasool DC, a resident of the Gulab Bagh area of Srinagar, in connection with a case registered in 2007, the agency said in a statement here. Mir was booked in several sections of the Ranbir Penal Code, the agency said. It said Mir was arrested for his alleged involvement in the transfer of migrant property in collusion with revenue authorities and two other parties.

The charge sheet in the case against 12 accused including Mir was filed in the court on March 23, 2015.

The court had issued an arrest warrant against Mir who was on the run and was evading his arrest, the statement said.

SIU conducts raid in Pulwama in terror-related case

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir Police's Special Investigation Unit (SIU) on Saturday conducted a raid in Pulwama district in connection with a terror-related case, officials said. The raid was conducted at the residence of Sheikh Sayuril Nisar at Wopalwan Awantipora in south Kashmir to collect more evidence of his involvement in terror-related offences, a police spokesperson said.

"During the search, bank passbooks, books on Jihad, and incriminating material were seized by the SIU," the spokesman said.

SIA arrests key accused from Delhi in narco-terror case in Poonch

JAMMU: The Special Investigation Agency (SIA) of Jammu and Kashmir Police has arrested from Delhi a key accused in a case linked to smuggling of arms, explosives and narcotics from across the Line of Control (LoC) in Poonch district, officials said. Mohammad Javed, a resident of Poonch, had fled the scene after his three accomplices were arrested along with a huge cache of arms, explosives and narcotics near the border fence in Karmara area of Poonch on the intervening night of May 30 and 31, the officials said. They said the SIA, after taking over the case on July 6, located the presence of the absconding accused in Delhi and he was subsequently arrested by its special team.

Earlier, Mohd Farooq (26), Mohd Riaz (23) and Mohd Zubair (22) were arrested by the Army along with an AK assault rifle, two pistols, six grenades, a 10-kg IED and 20 packets of suspected heroin while they were trying to smuggle the material from across the LoC into this side.

The investigation of the case is on and some more arrests are expected on the disclosure of Javed, the officials said.

Last month, the SIA conducted raids at several places in Poonch for three consecutive days from July 26 to 28 following recovery of seven kilograms of heroin, more than Rs 2 crore and a pistol along with some ammunition from the house of notorious drug peddler Rafiq Lala in Damna Doyiyan area of Sathra on March 3.

Lala was arrested under the Public Safety Act (PSA) early this year. However, the SIA had taken his remand on July 1 for questioning over his alleged links across the border.

HC quashes Notifications issued under Sec 9, 9A JK Land Acquisition Act

JAMMU: Justice Wasim Sadiq Nargal, Judge of High Court Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh has allowed the petition of Gul Mohammad and ors and quashed the impugned notification No 84/ADC/Rbn dt 20-10-2011, Notification No 25/DCR dated 26-11-2011 and Public Notice No 94/ADC/Rbn dated 30-11-2011.

According to the case the petitioners have challenged the afore-said notifications and demanded that all the proceedings initiated by the respondents for acquisition of the land measuring 01 kanal 17 Marlas falling under Khasra No 729, land measuring 02 kanal 07 marla, in Khasra No 729, land measuring 02 kanal 5 marla in Khasra No 730, land measuring 09 kanal 14 marla in khasra No 731 min, land measuring 04 marla falling in Khasra No 3219/683, situated in village Khari, Banihal, be declared as non-est in the eyes of law. Counsel M. Y Akhoun, Adv appearing on behalf of the petitioner vehemently argued that Sec 6 of the Act of 1990 is the conclusive evidence that the land is needed for public purpose which declaration has to be made by the Government where Government means the erstwhile Government of J&K and not any authority of District level. The impugned notifications made by the Deputy Commissioner instead of a Minister or an officer specified authority. Advocate Nazia Fazal and ors on behalf of the respondents with a view to reject the claim of the petitioner have relied upon SRO 235 dated 11-08-2009 which provides that the Government has authorized the Financial Commissioner (Rev) Divisional Commissioner and Deputy commissioner under Sec 6 and 7 of the J&K Land Acquisition Act. The Justice Wasim Sadiq Nargal after hearing both the sides said, "I find merit in this petition and the same is accordingly, allowed. He said that the impugned Notifications issued by respondent No 4, under Section 9 and 9A of the J&K Land Acquisition Act are quashed. He further said that all the subsequent proceedings for acquisition under taken by the respondents are also declared non-est in the eyes of law and therefore quashed."
