Distressed family waits for PMAY to rebuild earthquake-damaged mud house, living under open sky

BHADARWAH: Forced to live under the rubbles of damaged mud house, 7 months pregnant Nishu Devi (29) along with her two physicallychallenged family members is frustrated by the apathy of authorities in Jammu and Kashmir and is cursing her

Nishu belonging to BPL (below poverty line) family was living in a mud house in the remote Lamote village under Kursari Panchayat and had applied for the centrally-sponsored Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) to build a concrete house 2 years back.

She alleged that despite submitting all the required formalities to the authorties well in time and running from pillar to post to get financial assistance to build concrete house, the poor family was kept devoid of the flagship scheme (PMAY) which ensure pucca house for all. The sufferings of the family took an ugly turn on August 8 when their mud house completely collapsed due to the earthquake that rocked Bhaderwah valley, leaving the family practically roofless.
