WASHINGTON/LONDON/ SINGAPORE: In a momentous achievement for India's space programme, the successful landing Chandrayaan-3 on the lunar south pole on Wednesday sparked jubilant reactions from around the world, including the Indian diaspora. India scripted history as the ambitious third Moon mission of the Indian Space Organisation Research (ISRO) touched down on the Moon's south pole, propelling the country to an exclusive club of four and making it the first nation to land on the uncharted surface.



Under the 'Digital J&K Programme' that was launched in mission mode last year, the number of online services has increased exponentially from 35 services in 2021 to 913 services



JAMMU: In a sensational exposure, a team of District Administration Jammu on Wednesday cracked a nexus in Lakshaya de-addiction Centres with some persons impersonating as doctors and prescribing medicines for the inmates

Teams constituted by SDM South Atul Sharma carried out raids at several such centres, including the one near Ashram Gurudwara, Digiana here and found some persons impersonating as doctors, prescribing medicines to combat Narcotic menace in the absence of registered docThe team found that medi-

cines were being procured in the name of Dr. Rohit but these were sold by Dr. Ajay Kumar, who himself is registered in some other clinic, and has hired some unauthorized and unregistered persons to sell narcotic medicines in his absence, thus playing with the life of innocent youth by making them addicted to narcotic medica-

During the raid, Dr. Ajay, in a statement to team, stated that he was hired by someone to work in his place and sell the narcotic medicines,

via proxy means.

Jammu Admin cracks down on Lakshaya

The De-Addiction Centres are owned by a Punjab based group, which carry out sale of narcotic drugs in the UT via proxy means, in the absence of authorized doc-

Majority of clinics are owned by Punjab-based Ashish Kumar and Shiva, who run narcotic centers in almost every district of Jammu and Kashmir.

During the investigation, one Nikhil Kumar was found to have been hired by Dr. Ajay Kumar as a proxy for a few weeks in one of the branches of Lakshaya de-

Addiction Centre in the absence of a registered doctor. The matter has been taken very seriously by the administration and action has been initiated against the proxy nexus funded by Punjab based traders. Various other centers are

Man injured in low-intensity blast

but finish terrorism: DGP **STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: Asserting that 99 per cent infiltration attempts from Pakistan on the border have been foiled in Jammu and Kashmir this year, Director General of Police Dilbag Singh on Wednesday said the security agencies are fully alert and working to finish terrorism rather than just contain it.

He said the border security grid is "much stronger than ever" with the addition of

"new elements" to scuttle any attempt from Pakistan to push terrorists and smuggle arms and narcotics.

"A number of encounters took place on the borders (in the recent past) which is a proof of the presence and alertness of our forces who are engaging them (infiltrators) at their place of choosing and neutralising them (before they manage to sneak into Jammu and Kashmir), the DGP, flanked by Additional Director General of Police (Jammu zone) Mukesh Singh, told reporters on the sidelines of a function here. Security forces foiled several infiltration attempts along the Line of Control

(LoC) in north Kashmir and Poonch-Rajouri belt of Pir panjal in the Jammu region in the recent past, killing nearly a dozen infiltrators and seizing huge consign-

Art 370 has 'self-limiting character': SC

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Wednesday said there is "intrinsic evidence" that Article 370 has a "selflimiting character" and it seems to have worked itself out after the term of the Jammu and Kashmir Constituent Assembly ended

A five-judge bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud was hearing a batch of petitions challenging abrogation of Article 370 that accorded special status to the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir.

"Really speaking, though the Constitution of Jammu and Kashmir framed its relationship with Union of India. unless that relationship was embodied in the Indian Constitution, how will it bind the dominion of India or



Parliament for successive years after 1957," the bench, comprising Justices Sanjay Kishan Kaul, Sanjiv Khanna, BR Gavai and Surva Kant, said.

The bench posed questions to senior advocate Gopal Sankaranarayanan, appearing for one of the petitioners Soayib Qureshi, who has challenged the Centre's August 5, 2019 decision to abrogate the provision.

on the recommendation of the Constituent Assembly of Jammu and Kashmir. "Interestingly, Article 370 is silent on what the regime should be once the con-

stituent assembly is formed and has taken a decision. There is a complete silence. If there is complete silence in Article 370, then Article 370 possibly has worked itself out ," the CJI said.

CJI Chandrachud asked Sankaranarayanan that if this reasoning is to be accepted, then it means that once Article 370 worked itself out, the Constitution of Jammu and Kashmir will fill the void and that it will be the supreme document.

"Now the question will be, can the Constitution of federating unit rise above
