Abid Mushtaq, who scored 26 runs and took 7 wickets in the first innings, once again rose to the occasion and contributed unbeaten 36 runs off 111 balls with 4

All three batsmen displayed solidity, fluidity and sublimity, who along with small contributions from Arya Thakur (21), Abdul Samad (18), Fazil Rashid (16) and Auqib Nabi (16) guided Jammu and Kashmir to a respectable total of  $285~\mathrm{runs}$ .
