
SHRADHANJALI

CRIMEREPORT

Burglary case solved; 2 arrested

BARAMULLA: Police on Thursday solved a burglary case by arresting 02 accused persons involved in the commission of crime besides, recovered stolen property from their possession.

As per details, On July 31, 2023 Police Station Kunzer received a written complaint from Abdul Razak son of Late Gh Mohammad resident of Gonipora Kunzer stating therein that during intervening night of July 30-31/2023, some unknown burglars barged into his residential house and stolen jewellery. Accordingly, a case under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Kunzer and investigation was initiated.

During the course of investigation, officers with the help of technical and human resources, zeroed in on two persons identified as Bilal Ahmad Lone son of Gh Mohd Lone & Ashan Jeelani Wani son of Ghulam Jeelani Wani, both residents of Gonipora Kunzer.

During questioning, both the accused persons confessed their involvement in the commission of crime and on their disclosure, stolen jewellery was recovered. They have been arrested and shifted to police station where they remain in custody.

13 Punjab-based dumpers among 23 vehicles seized, 3 arrested for illegal mining

SRINAGAR/KATHUA/JAMMU: Acting tough against the persons involved in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals, police on Thursday arrested 3 persons and seized 23 vehicles.

As per details, a party of Police Station Awantipora headed by SHO Awantipora arrested 3 persons and seized 02 vehicles (tippers) bearing registration numbers JK18-7299 & JK13-7999 for their involvement in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals at Hatiwara.

Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law have been registered at Police Station Awantipora and investigation has been taken up.

Meanwhile District Mineral Officer, Rajinder Singh Rana seized 13 Punjab based dumpers for indulging in illegal mining at Gandial areas of district here today.

Acting swiftly on inputs of dumpers entered in Gandial areas from Pathankote side, team of Geology and Mining Department rushed to the spot and caught all 11 vehicles on the spot while 2 others were seized at Taraf Tajwal. Meanwhile, 3 dumpers fled the spot.

Strict warning was given to violators for not lifting mineral from any stone crusher without e-challans and GST bills besides following the transportation guidelines and all rules of Geology and Mining Department as per SRO-105 and MMDR Act of 1957.

Deputy Commissioner, Rakesh Minhas was immediately apprised about the incident who instructed the department to remain cautioned while conducting raids and impose heavy penalties on the vehicles and machines involved in illegal mining. DMO further informed that the mineral guards are working day and night to control illegal mining activities in Ravi-Ujh rivers, Tarnah and other khads during monsoon season and have kept strong vigilance on the transportation of mineral from Kathua to Punjab and other areas.

Three notorious bootleggers arrested

SAMBA: Police on Thursday arrested 3 notorious bootleggers and recovered illicit 'desi' liquor from their possession. The arrested bootlegger have been identified as Tilak Raj, son of Uttam Chand, resident of Dhaki Tehsil& district Samba, Karan Singh, son of Basant Singh, resident of PaloniChandli Tehsil & district Samba and Sohan Lal, son of Gopal Dass, resident of Radwan Tehsil Ramgarh district Samba. FIR No.188/2023 under section 48(A) Excise act has been registered at Police Station Samba through Police Post Goran against Tilak and Karan, whereas FIR No.45/2023 under section 48(a) Excise act has been registered at Police Station Ramgarh against Sohan. The bootleggers have been arrested by In-Charge Police Post Goran PSI Sajid Jaral and Additional SP Samba Surinder Choudhary.

Murder case solved within 48 hours, 3 arrested

JAMMU: Police on Thursday solved a murder case within 48 hours and arrested three accused. As per details, Jammu Police solved a murder case of Muntaz Ansari, son of Raza Din Ansari, resident of Gorakhpur UP at present Makara area under the jurisdictions of Police Station Akhnoor. Giving details, SSP Jammu Chandan Kohli said that an information was received at Police Post Chowki Choura regarding the murder of a person and on this police team of PS Akhnoor under the supervision of SP Rural Rahul Charak led by SDPO Akhnoor Mohan Lal assisted by SHO Police Station Akhnoor Inspr Zaheer Mushtaq and In-Charge Police Post Chowki Choura PSI Pankaj Katoch did strenuous efforts and on the basis of technical assistance along with human intelligence detained. He further added that 12 suspected persons were detained for questioning and during further questioning three accused persons confessed their involvement. In this regard, Cases FIR No. 222/2023 U/S 302/34 IPC Act got registered in Police Station Akhnoor and accused persons got arrested.

The accused arrested have been identified as Ravi Kumar, son of Shivcharan Chouhan, resident of Bangan Tehsil Devi Nager District Punjab State Madhya Pradesh; Davinder Kumar, son of Shiv Kumar, resident of Devi Nagar and Pawan Kumar, son of Bami Ram, resident of Bajoli Puni Reasi. It is pertinent to mention that knife was also recovered from the accused namely Ravi Kumar.

Moreover the three accused were staying in the house of Suresh Kumar, son of Milan Raj, resident of Makara who has also been booked in violation of DM order regarding tenant verification. Further investigation of the case is going.

Jammu Police also seized 8 vehicles involved in illegal mining. The seized vehicles include One Tractor Trolley without Registration No seized by Nagrota police; Two Tractor Trolleys (JK02CV-8524 and JK02CT-5954), by Akhnoor police; One Tractor Trolley without Registration No by Phallian Mandal Police; two vehicles i.e one Tractor Trolley without Registration and one Tipper without Registration No, by Miran Sahib Police; One Tractor Trolley bearing Chassis No MBNGAAN-HUMJCO3078, by Chatha Police; one dumper bearing (JK02DC-4864) Ganjansoo Police. The recoveries were made by SHO Nagrota Inspr Vishav Partap Singh, SHO Akhnoor Inspr Zaheer Mushtaq, In-Charge Police Posts Phallian Mandal PSI Ajesh Singh Jamwal, Chatha-PSI Harjinder Paul Singh and BPP-Ganjansoo ASI Ravinder Bhushan in their respective jurisdictions.

Scooty rider nabbed with 20 bundles of banned Chinese thread

As per details, in a drive against the sale of banned synthetic threads (manja) var-

ious Nakas were laid in different locations by Jammu Police. An information was received at Police Station Janipur regarding sale of banned synthetic threads. On this, team of Police Station Janipur under the supervision of SDPO West Vikram Singh led by SHO Janipur Inspr. Sikander Singh during Naka checking at Jagi Darbar Janipur rounded up an accused person who was coming from Bantalab towards Janipur on his scooty (JK02BV-3199). During search, 20 bundles of Chinese Manja (Gattu) were recovered from his possession.

The accused identified as Dhrub Mehra, son of Rajinder Kumar, resident of Shakti Nagar Jammu was arrested and FIR No. 79/2023 under section 188 IPC was registered against him at Police Station Janipur. The arrest was made in violation of DM order regarding ban on sale of plastic/synthetic threads (manja).

2 feared drowned in Chenab River

Woman found hanging; parents alleges murder by in-laws over dowry

JAMMU: A woman was found hanging in her house at Sidhra area on Thursday, however her parents alleged that she was murdered over dowry by her-in-laws.

According to the information, Priya Chib, wife of Sushil Jambal, resident Sidhra was found hanging in her house and was shifted hospital where she died. The parents of the deceased woman were informed by in-laws which reached the hospital and staged protest. They said that they were informed over the phone that their daughter had hanged herself but she can't take such step as she was a brave daughter.

They said that dowry was constantly demanded by her in-laws, however they already have given them an expensive car, but still they used to make new demands every time. They also said that she was sent to her maternal home several times.

Two found hanging
