General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the ASI and the Uttar Pradesh government, that no excavation will be carried out during the survey nor any destruction caused to the structure.

dents. The pre-370 period recorded 5050 incidents, which significantly reduced to 445 in the post-370 period, marking a remarkable 92 per cent decrease. This decrease signifies improved public order and a more peaceful environment. Encounters and counter-terrorism operations decreased from 539 in the pre-370

period to 369 in the post-370 period, representing a 32 per cent decrease. This decline suggests a positive impact on the region's security, with fewer instances of confrontations between security forces and terrorists.

Instances of civilians being killed during law and order significantly decreased from 132 in the pre-370 period to 0 in the post-370 period, marking a 100 per cent decrease. The number of civilians injured decreased from 9303 in the pre-370 period to 117 in the post370 period, representing a 99 per cent decrease. The sacrifices made by police and security forces decreased significantly, with the number of personnel martyred dropping from 345 in the pre-370 period to 150 in the post-370 period, marking a 57 per cent decrease. When the PIL came-up for hearing, Division Bench observed that the matter pertains to improvement of infrastructure facilities in respect of Primary and Secondary Schools in urban and rural areas of the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh as well as for proper maintenance of studentsteachers ratio in these schools. While the scope appears to be vast, yet there are certain requirements which will require immediate attention of the concerned authorities in this regard.

While considering this aspect, DB observed that it has been brought to the notice of this Court that the status report dated 11.07.2023 submitted by the Project Director, Samagra Shiksha, Jammu and Kashmir contains certain information about the works being executed and completed as per the projects undertaken and their timeline across the Union Territory of J&K and Ladakh under AWP&B (civil works)

Samagra Shiksha. In the status report, it has been mentioned amongst others that in 272 schools, works have been sanction for construction of boy's toilets. Similarly, in 136 schools works have been sanctioned

for construction of girls toilets, whereas 197 boys toilets and in 95 girls toilets have been completed. It has also been mentioned that 53 and 27 works are still in progress in respect of the boys and

girls toilets respectively. Similarly, out of 544 girls CWSN toilets, 356 have been completed and 166 are in progress. These figures pertain to the year 2018-4. Similarly certain amounts have also been sanctioned during the year 2000-21 for construction of girls toilets. In respect of CWSN toilets Elementary out of 172, 89 toilets have been completed and 63 are in progress.

Similarly, in respect of girls toilets Elementary, 40 girls toilets have also been sanctioned, out of which 19 have been completed and 08 are in progress.

DB after perusal of the status report dated 11.07.2023 further reveals that for the year 2018-2019, sanctions have been granted for construction of boundary wall in respect of 824 schools, out of which 630 have been completed while 433 are shown to be in progress. Similarly, for the year 2020-21, sanctions have also been granted for construction of boundary wall elementary in respect of 269 schools and only 92 works have been completed while as 140 works are in progress.

DB observed that this Court would like to know from the Administration about the exact stage of progress and period of completion in respect of 53 and 27 boys and girls toilets as well as 433 boundary wall and 140 boundary walls elementary mentioned in the status report, if not already complet-

DB also noted that in the note appended to the table prepared by the Project Director, Samagra Shiksha, J&K certain works have been surrendered due to non-availability of land.

Illegal construction at Patnitop DB directs CBI counsel to apprise court whether sanction has been

granted from concerned authority for filing charge sheet

JAMMU: In a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) regarding illegal construction at Patnitop, a Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court Comprising Chief Justice N Kotishwar Singh and Justice Wasim Sadiq Nargal after hearing both the sides, granted six weeks time to Sr. AAG Monika Kohli counsel for the CBI to apprise this Court as to whether the sanction has been granted from the concerned authority for filing the charge sheet, if not, then assign the reasons there for. It is worthwhile to mention here that on December 31, 2019, Division Bench had directed Director Central Bureau of Investigation to conduct in-depth enquiry into encroachment on forest land and other public land; illegal change of use and misuse of the land in violation of the permitted user; raising of illegal constructions; failure of the authorities to take action; fix the responsibility of the persons who were at the helm of affairs, were duty bound to and responsible for their taking action; their failure to proceed in accordance with law on issues regarding several aspects relating to the illegal constructions compounding and misuse thereof and; any other illegality.
