old age pension and imposition of property tax. "The protest rally is being organised on many issues which expose the harsh realities of life in Jammu and Kashmir. The LG administration should do away with harsh measures that are hurting the poor," Bhalla told

reporters here. "Without any elected government, the people of J-K easily fall prey to the malicious tactics of BJP. People are being exploited as taxes in the form of power tariffs, toll

taxes, property tax, etc. and prices (of essential commodities) soar through the roof, he said. The party also demanded early conduct of assembly elections and restoration of statehood of Jammu and Kashmir. The Congress has launched a month-long protest campaign across Jammu and Kashmir to raise issues of price rise, installation of smart meters, imposition of property tax, withdrawal of widow and old age pensions, and restoration of statehood.
