SRINAGAR: The job of bankers here is take financial-education literacy very seriously, when so much wealth is being created in the country J&K too should become part of this national journey.

"But the sad part is that this wealth is not evenly distributed in the country. For the market cap of Rs 300 lakh Cr there are only 11.4 Cr de-mat accounts in the country. Which actually means that everybody is not participating in the wealth creation happening in the country," he added.

Pitching for financial deepening in J&K, he advised the Bank management to take the financial education literacy deeper into and across Jammu and Kashmir.

He said, "The Assets under management portfolio in J&K are on a very lower side at just Rs 5700 Cr along with only 4.7 lakh Lac Demat Accounts and 4.8 lakh FoliOs. This calls for a massive financial deepening across the UT of J&K."

"Make your customers part of the wealth-creation journey and encourage them to make long-term investments for decent returns. Discourage overtrading as the markets can be very volatile. And advise them to always invest in companies that give long-term value", he added.

## Govt should stop installation of smart, prepaid meters: CCI

JAMMU: The Chamber of Commerce and Industry (CCI), Jammu, has called upon the Government to address the ongoing concerns surrounding the installation of smart meters in the Jammu region.

In this regard, a press conference was convened at the Chamber House today under the chairmanship of Arun Gupta, President CCI Jammu in which other office bearers were also present.

Arun Gupta raised pressing issues related to inflated power bills and sought transparency and clarification from the Government. Expressing deep concern, he emphasized the urgent need for clarity on the escalating power bills that have caused distress among the populace subsequent to the installation of new smart meters.

He questioned the necessity of replacing the existing digital meters with smart meters, urging government to verify the authenticity of these devices.

He highlighted the importance of discerning the discrepancies between the old and new power bills.

Arun Gupta also voiced apprehensions about the placement of meters on poles, which has generated unease among the general public. He proposed an alternative approach, suggesting that new Smart Meters should be installed within consumers' homes, as per the past practice, to alleviate such concerns. He also resented over move of Government to switching from Smart Meters to Prepaid Meters within a short timeframe. Arun appealed to the Government to immediately halt the ongoing process of smart meter installations until the raised concerns are effectively addressed. He also demanded that the Government should come up with one time amnesty scheme for commercial users as they are the worst sufferers after the abrogation of article 370 and 35A and also due to Covid-19.
