



Pr Secy to PM chairs 7th meeting of Coordination Committee on India's G20 Presidency

NEW DELHI: Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister of India, Dr. P.K. Mishra on Tuesday chaired the seventh meeting of the Coordination Committee on India's G20 Presidency at Bharat Mandapam, Pragati Maidan, New Delhi.

The meeting covered Summit preparedness in substantive as well as logistical aspects. Progress and outcomes on both Sherpa and Finance track were reviewed.

Presentations made in this regard by the Sherpa (G20), Secretary (Department of Economic Affairs) and Secretary (Information Broadcasting).

Discussion was held on Indian Presidency's priorities including Green Development, accelerat-Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), strong sustain-

able balanced and inclu-

sive growth, digital public infrastructure, gender equality and reform of

multilateral institutions. Sherpa (G20)informed that so far, a total of 185 meetings, including 13 at the Ministerial level, have been concluded covering almost all States and Union Territories in the country. Besides the 12 outcome documents, 12 other deliverables with consensus have been adopted, it was added.

(DEA)informed that considerable progress has been made in the finance track including on crypto assets agenda, financial inclusion, mobilizing climate finance and enabling finance for SDGs.

Secretary (I&B) briefed about the arrangements for media, like setting up of media center and media accreditation. So far, more than 3200 media personnel have registered for the Summit, including 1800 foreign and more than from 1200 domestic media. Adequate arrangements are being made to facilitate both foreign as well as domesmedia, it was

informed. The Principal Secretary also reviewed the implementation of past decisions pertaining to logistical aspects. Delhi Government and security including officials. Commissioner (Delhi Police) briefed on steps being taken for hosting the visiting dignitaries, plans for traffic management, airport and security arrangements, and beautification drive being undertaken in Delhi NCR in the run up to the Leader' Summit. Noting the positive progress achieved in hosting the G-20 Leader's Summit next Principal month, Secretary instructed all concerned to complete all arrangements in the next few days so that rehearsals could begin.

Mishra emphasized on the continued importance of the whole of government's approach and action in ensuring timely and adequate preparations.

He pointed out that with one month remaining for the Summit, it was time for last mile delivery with precision. He said that detailed SOPs should be developed and specific duties be assigned to officers for smooth execution. Under Prime Minister's guidance, young officers from all over the country are being given an opportunity to participate and learn from organization of the Summit. Governor, Delhi, Cabinet Secretary and senior officers from concerned Ministries/ Departments were also present during the meeting.

Parliament clears inter-services organisations bill

STATE TIMES NEWS NEW DELHI: Parliament on Tuesday passed a bill that seeks to provide the commander-in-chief and officer-incommand of inter-services organisations disciplinary and administrative powers over personnel from other

forces serving in such establishments. The bill was cleared in Rajya Sabha with a voice vote. Lok Sabha had given its nod to the legislation on

Speaking in the Upper House, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said India is fully prepared to face any type of warfare and the country's defence spending can be increased to 5-6 per cent of GDP if needed.

In his reply to a discussion on The InterservicesOrganisations (Command, Control and Discipline) Bill, 2023, Singh said the legislation has been brought to keep in tune with the changing nature of modern warfare and ensure better coordination among the three services.

"It (warfare) is not conventional now, it has become technology and ${\bf network\text{-}centric...} \quad {\bf It} \quad {\bf is} \quad {\bf therefore}$ important considering the new challenges, which we and our forces are facing, there is a need for better coordination. This bill has been brought for that purpose only," the defence minister said.

Singh further said, "After the passage of this Bill, our inter-services organisations will be able to work in a Replying to a query, he said the

country's maritime interests are fully protected and there is no reason for "Also, we are fully prepared for any

type of warfare," he said. This preparedness will continue going forvard, Singh asserted. On low defence spending and vacan-

cies in the armed forces, he reiterated all efforts have been made to ensure there are no shortcomings in any form in protecting the country. He said financial resources will not be allowed to be a constraint and, if

need be, the defence budget can be

increased to even 5-6 per cent of GDP.

In response to a query on the theatrisation, the defence minister said it is a different subject and speaking about it now would be premature. "However, I want to assure that if

theatrisation happens, this Act, through a normal notification, would be effective on the theatre command as well," he said. The defence minister said consider-

ing the current global circumstances there is a need to keep India's forces strong.

"This bill has been brought with a

view to strengthen our forces. There should be better jointness and at the same time integration should be better so that our forces can move faster to achieve the desired results," he said.

The legislation has been brought for the purpose of ensuring better coordination and integrated infrastructure between the three services arms and to further strengthen the tradition of discipline inherent in the armed

"It is this discipline that not only instils self-confidence within our armed forces but also strengthens the sense of unity within them as a unit or establishment. Therefore, if there is any case of indiscipline, it should be resolved immediately and it is also necessary to have a quick solution,

Singh noted. Discussion on the bill continued in the absence of the opposition members who walked out in protest demanding a discussion on the Manipur issue.

Doda police exposes another fake accident; 3 arrested, stolen goods worth Rs 11 lakhs recovered

DODA: In a remarkable display of investigation , Doda Police on Tuesday exposed a fake accident by arresting three persons including a father-son duo. The trio had orchestrated a meticulously planned fake accident, only to be foiled by the vigilant efforts of the Doda Police.

The arrested individuals have been identified as Shamim Ahmed, son of Bashir Ahmed, Bashir Ahmed, son of Ghulam Nabi, both residents of Droundi, Bhalla, and Ashiq Ali, son of Khair Din, resident of Trown Bhalla, District Doda, according to sources. Their actions were directed at deceiving and defrauding their employer, as well as attempting to manipulate the circumstances of a vehicular accident involving a vehicle registered as "Jaunga."

The police swung into action following an alert received on July 29, 2023, at the Thathri Police Station. The report indicated that a vehicle bearing registration number JK02CH 5504 had met with an accident near Shibnote Prem Nagar, plunging into the Chenab River. A swift police response revealed that the driver of the said vehicle had managed to escape the incident, leaving behind a submerged vehicle.

Upon further investigation, it was revealed that the vehicle had been utilized to transport a range of goods, including food items, cosmetics, garments, hardware, and sanitary items. Subsequently, a case was registered under relevant sections of law at the Thathri Police Station and inves tigation started.

During the investigative, a mobile phone was found at the scene. Technical analysis of the device prompted suspicior regarding the driver's actions. The mobile phone, registered in the name of Ashiq Ali, was linked to his brother-in-law, Shamim Ahmed who confessed to driving the vehicle at the time of the supposed accident.

Under interrogation, the driver admitted to his role in the scheme, which involved unloading a portion of the goods and deliberately disposing of the vehicle into the Chenab River This devious plan was hatched in collaboration with his associates, Ashiq Ali and Bashir Ahmed. The intention was to deceive the employer and profit from the stolen goods.

As the investigation unfolded, the police carried out raids at various locations, leading to the recovery of stolen goods valued at approximately Rs 11 lakhs. The recovered items had been strategically stashed by the perpetrators in differ ent areas within Trown and Pranoo of Bhalla. Further investigations are ongoing, with the anticipation of additional recoveries and insights into the broader network of the accused.

The police team, led by Inspector Amrit Katoch, the Station House Officer of Thathri Police Station, and PSI Sumunder Sher Khan, in charge of Prem Nagar Police Pos cracked the case. The operation was conducted under the supervision of Vaseem Mehmood, SDPO Bhaderwah, Vinod Kumar, ASP Bhaderwah, and Abdul Qayoom, SSP Doda.

"I checked the weight of the packet and thought money is there but today when we opened it, there were pieces of

She said that they have registered a complaint at the police station.

The victim Saleema said that the money siphoned from her was meant for the marriage of her daughter. An official said that CCTV footage has been obtained and efforts are on to nab both thugs.
