JAMMU: The Pickeball Federation of India (PFI) held its virtual Core Committee meeting today, where several crucial decisions were made and new leadership appointments were announced. The meeting was attended by the executive members of PFI, who discussed a range of topics as per the agenda.

The highlight of the meeting was the finalization of the dates for the upcoming National Pickleball Tournament.

The event will take place in Jaipur, Rajasthan, from November 15 to 17, 2024.

This highly anticipated tournament is expected to draw participants from across the country.

In preparation for the national event, a two-day technical workshop and clinic will be conducted jointly by PFI and the J&K Pickleball Association.

Scheduled for September 2024 in Jammu, this workshop aims to enhance the skills of participants. Each state can send a minimum of two and a maximum of four participants, with a preference for including at least one female participant.

The committee also decided on the financial aspects concerning state affiliations and player participation. The annual affiliation fee for each state has been set at Rs 10,000, and a National Tournament Fee of Rs 1,000 will be required for each player. All states are required to complete their registration or renewal process before the Jaipur National Tournament and submit their registration certificates during the event.

During the meeting, three new members were proposed to be inducted into the National Committee body. The proposed members are Raghuraj Singh, Sunil Dang, and Manish Gogaia.

Their inclusion is expected to bring fresh perspectives and expertise to the committee. A new Core Executive

Committee was formed for the tenure 2024-2028. The committee members are: President Karan Singh

(Rajasthan), Senior Vice President Ranjeet Chib (Jammu & Kashmir), Vice President Devendra Singh Bisht (Uttarakhand), Vice President S.K.D. Mishra (Chhattisgarh), Secretary Amit Kumar (Uttarakhand), Joint Secretary Manmohan Vvas (Gujarat), Treasurer Rajinder Deshwal (Haryana), Executive Member Ganesh Dutta

(Assam) and Executive Member Ram Kumar (West Bengal).

This new leadership team is expected to steer the federation toward continued growth and success in promoting the sport of pickleball across India.

The meeting concluded with a sense of optimism and commitment to advancing the sport at both national and state levels.
