Punjab sees 12.58 pc growth in basmati cultivation area

CHANDIGARH: The Punjab government's crop diversification drive has helped the state increase basmati cultivation area by 12.58 per cent during this kharif season, Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Minister Gurmurt Singh Khudian said on Sunday. The cultivation of long-grain rice has expanded to 6.71 lakh hectares current-

ly, a significant increase from 5.96 lakh hectares during the previous kharif season, the minister said.

Giving district-wise statistics of basmati cultivation, Khudian said that Amritsar led the way with 1.46 lakh hectares dedicated to this aromatic rice.

Following Amritsar were Muktsar with 1.10 lakh hectares, Fazilka with 84.9

thousand hectares, Tarn Taran with 72.5 thousand hectares, and Sangrur with 49.8 thousand hectares, showcasing maximum basmati cultivation in these districts.

The state agriculture minister also highlighted a substantial 46.5 per cent growth in the area under Direct Seeding of Rice (DSR) compared to the previous year.

The area cultivated using the water-saving DSR method has increased to over 2.52 lakh acres from 1.72 lakh acres in the Kharif season of 2023, he said in a statement here.

The state has prohibited the use of 10 pesticides on basmati to enhance the export quality of the aromatic crop to a world-class standard, the minister said.

Mohd Shami likely to play in one of Bengal's first couple of Ranji Trophy games

NEW DELHI: Senior speedster Mohammed Shami, who is undergoing rehabilitation after an ankle surgery, is likely to make a comeback to competitive cricket for his domestic side Bengal in the Ranji Trophy, and a potential international appearance later in one of the Test matches against New Zealand. It is understood that Shami will play either one or both of Bengal's opening away Ranji match against UP on October 11 and the next one in Kolkata against Bihar on October 18. Since there will be only a two-day gap between both



the games it is unlikely that he will play both.

The New Zealand Test series starts from October 19 in Bengaluru followed by Tests in Pune (October 24)

and Mumbai (Nov 1). Shami is expected to play one of those games before embarking on the big tour to Australia.

The 34-year-old Shami, one

of India's greatest fast bowlers, last donned the national colours during the ODI World Cup final against Australia in Ahmedabad on November 19, last year.

Since then Shami hasn't played any competitive games having undergone an ankle surgery in the United Kingdom in February this year and was in any case ruled out for a minimum period of six months.

While there are Instagram videos of Shami starting off with his RTP routines (Return To Play) at the National Cricket Academy (NCA) in Bengaluru, bowling with low intensity short-

ened run-up, there were reports that he could be available for the Duleep Trophy.

However, it has been learnt that there was no chance of him getting fit during the Duleep Trophy and the selectors don't want to take any chances by rushing him earlier than required.

The priority is to have India's top three pacers -- Jasprit Bumrah, Mohammed Shami and Mohammed Siraj -- fit for the five Tests in Australia.

Shami has so far taken 229 wickets from 64 Tests with six five-wicket hauls and 12 four-wicket hauls.

AIIMS neurosurgeon found dead in south Delhi house

NEW DELHI: A 34-year-old neurosurgeon at AIIMS allegedly committed suicide in his south Delhi house on Sunday, police said. Raj Ghoniya, a resident of Rajkot in Gujarat, died due to a suspected overdose as used vials of medicines and syringes were found in his

house in the Gautam Nagar area, police said.

A suicide note was also recovered from the spot, however, Ghoniya did not blame anyone in it, they added.

"At around 2 pm on Sunday, a PCR call was received at the Hauz Khas police station regarding suicide by a doctor in the

Gautam Nagar area. Police reached the spot and found Ghoniya in an unconscious state," a senior police officer said.

Ghoniya was taken to the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) where he was declared dead.

He was posted at the Trauma Centre of AIIMS.

OBCs and nomadic tribes stake claim to Ausa assembly constituency

Met forecasts very heavy rain in Gangetic West Bengal till Aug 20

KOLKATA: The Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) on Sunday predicted very heavy rainfall in Gangetic West Bengal till August 20, driven by a low-pressure area and an active monsoon.

This weather system is expected to intensify into a



well-marked low-pressure area and move in a west-northwestward direction. Over the next three to four days, it is likely to travel from southern Bangladesh across Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, and Madhya Pradesh, it said.

The forecast indicated

that Gangetic West Bengal will continue to experience very heavy rain until August 20, followed by heavy rain on August 21. Additionally, sub-Himalayan West Bengal is also expected to receive heavy rainfall till August 21 due to the influence of the weather system, the Met said.

Iron grip has clearly rusted and rusted terribly: BJP chief Nadda slams Bengal govt

NEW DELHI: BJP president JP Nadda on Sunday slammed the Trinamool Congress government in West Bengal as anti-women, anti-youth and anti-democracy as protests continued over the alleged rape and

murder of a trainee doctor in Kolkata.

He said in a post on X, "The chief minister has failed the people of the state, presiding over an administration which has looted with impunity. The iron grip has clearly rusted and rusted ter-

ribly." Students of different medical colleges took out a procession in Kolkata on Sunday, demanding justice for the trainee doctor who was allegedly raped and murdered at the RG Kar Medical College and Hospital.
