LEAD strongly advocated for retaining the current structure, which provides gross GST incentives rather than shifting to GST incentive on value addition component only.

The delegation further called for a more efficient and transparent evaluation to process expedite approvals. They also stressed the importance of prioritizing small and medi-

um-sized investment proposals, ensuring that the scheme's resources are not disproportionately allocated to large-scale projects.
