

Session on Pranic Healing held at "Golden Days" Day Care Centre

Scanning stage involves assessing the body's energy field or aura to detect imbalances, blockages, or abnormalities in the energy flow.

After identifying areas with negative or congested energy, specific techniques are employed to remove stagnant energy from the body and aura. This process, known as "sweeping," eliminates blockages and allows the life force to flow more freely.

Following cleansing, fresh Prana is transferred to the affected areas of the body. This step aims to replenish the energy and support the healing process.

The final stage involves stabilizing the newly transferred energy to ensure that it is properly assimilated by the body and does not dissipate quickly.

Dr. Jain highlighted the various benefits of Pranic Healing during the session. He noted that this practice promotes both physical and emotional healing, reduces

stress and anxiety, and enhances overall well-being and vitality. Additionally, Pranic Healing can accelerate recovery from illnesses and injuries, and improve mental clarity and focus.

In a practical demonstration, Dr. Jain performed "Tapping Therapy," which involves tapping specific energy centers on the palms, forehead, head, eyes, lips, temples, and ears. Attendees reported feeling a sense of relaxation and relief following the demonstration.

Purnima slams Congress for pre-poll tie-up with NC for Assembly Elections

JAMMU: Advocate Purnima Sharma, Spokesperson of BJP J&K and former Deputy Mayor of Jammu, lashed out at the Congress party over its decision to form a pre-poll alliance with the National Conference (NC) for the upcoming Assembly elections in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir. She accused the Congress of aligning with forces that, according to her, promote "terrorism" and "separatism."

In a strongly worded statement, Purnima expressed her concerns over the implications of this alliance for the region's stability and national security. "The Congress Party has been exposed before the

country. By aligning with the National Conference, they are openly supporting terrorism and separatism, which have long been detrimental to the peace and unity of Jammu and Kashmir," she stated.

The senior BJP leader further criticized Congress for placing its own political interests above national priorities.

"For the Congress party and its allies, the country comes later; the party comes first. They have consistently opposed reservation policies that aim to uplift the marginalized sections of society, she said, asserting that the upcoming Assembly elections are expected to be a crucial test for both national and regional parties as they vie for control in the politically sensitive region."
