Jammu, 1 in Udhampur, and 4 in Delhi," he said. Karwani, who is monitoring the control room for the helpdesk, assured that all necessary arrangements have been made at these polling stations in

accordance with EC guidelines. The EC issued a notification on August 22 outlining the voting options for Kashmiri migrants, offering choices of both in-person voting at special

polling stations and through postal ballots. "Special polling stations have been set up in Udhampur, Delhi, and Jammu. Alternatively, Kashmiri migrants can opt for postal ballots," he

Karwani said the updated electoral rolls, detailing migrant electors in varous zones of Jammu and Udhampur mapped to respective special polling

stations, will soon be published. "Corrections or objections will be accepted within a seven-day period", he

The 90 assembly constituencies in Jammu and Kashmir are scheduled to go to polls in three phases beginning September 18, with counting of votes slated for October 4.

put out on Monday, as it has named former MLA Baldev Raj Sharma from Shri Mata Vaishno Devi seat in place of Rohit Dubey. All other names are the same for the same set of constituencies, announced yesterday before being withdrawn.

The party's latest list has 10 candidates for the second phase of polls and 19 for the third phase.

The BJP has so far not named its nominee for Nowshera, which was represented in 2014 by its current state president Ravinder Raina, and Gandhinagar, from where its another senior leader and former Deputy Chief Minister Kayinder Gupta was elected in the last polls.

Rana, who has won the 2014 elections from Nagrota on the National Conference ticket before joining the BJP three years back, is an easily amenable humble popular mass leader with a pan J&K presence and has nurtured and developed Nagrota constituency very well and is acceptable to all sections of society, a party leader said.

The BJP has reposed faith in former minister Chandra Prakash Ganga from Vijapur, former MLAs Pawan Gupta (Udhampur West), Jeevan Lal (Bani), Rajeev Sharma (Chhamb), Rajiv Jasrotia (Jasrota), Gharu Ram Bhagat (Suchetgarh -SC) and Devinder Kumar Maniyal (Ramgarh-SC). Sunil Bhardwaj was given the ticket from Ramnagar SC replacing former MLA R S Pathania, Ashok Bhat (Habbakadal in Srinagar), Kuldeep Raj Dubey (Reasi) after dropping former MLA Ajay Nanda, Thakur Randhir Singh (Kalakote Sunderbani) who replaced former minister Abdul Gani Kohli, Vijay Kumar Sharma (Hiranagar), Darshan Singh (Basohli) and

Mohammad Akram Choudhary (Gulabgarh-ST). The BJP fielded senior leader and National Secretary Narinder Singh Raina from R S Pura-Jammu south, party Vice President Yudhvir Sethi (Jammu East) and Arvind Gupta from Jammu West, dropping former min-

Former minister Sham Lal Sharma, who joined the BJP after leaving the Congress in March 2019, was fielded from Jammu North while former minister Surjit Singh Slathia, who joined the BJP in October 2021, got a tick-

A two-time MLA and former minister Chowdhary Zulfikar Ali, who recently joined the BJP after leaving the April Party, will contest from Budhal (ST) constituency, former MLA Balwant Singh Mankotia, who joined the BJP in September 2022, was fielded from Chenani, former minister Syed Mushtaq Ahmad Bukhari, who joined the BJP in February this year, was fielded from his stronghold of Surankote.

Mohd Iqbal Malik, who is a state executive member of the party and coincharge minority morcha after joining the BJP in July 2019, was named the party's candidate from Thanamandi, while three more new entrants into the party fold - former SSP Mohan Lal Bhagat, former MLC Murtaza Khan, Choudhary Abdul Gani - were fielded from Akhnoor-SC, Mendhar-ST and Poonch-haveli, respectively.

Shah, who is the son of union home minister Amit Shah, will relinquish his position in India at the BCCI's Annual General Meeting likely to be held towards the end of next month or in October. Shah became the fifth Indian after late Jagmohan Dalmiya, Sharad Pawar

N Srinivasan and Shashank Manohar to be elected for the high-profile job. The Ahmedabad-based administrator, who was the sole nominee for the chairmanship, emphasised his commitment to expanding the global reach and popularity of cricket, especially with its upcoming inclusion in the Los

Angeles 2028 Olympics. "I am humbled by the nomination as the Chair of the International Cricke Council," Shah stated in an ICC release.

He also acknowledged that international cricket stands at a critical juncture and it would be important to balance the coexistence of multiple for mats, promote the adoption of advanced technologies, and introduce marquee events to new global markets.

"I am committed to working closely with the ICC team and our member nations to further globalise cricket. Our goal is to make cricket more inclusive and popular than ever before," he was quoted as saying in the release.

Being a powerful decision-maker in the richest cricket board of the world which contributes more than 75 per cent of the revenue for the global body, Shah's election was never in doubt once he threw his hat in the ring.

It is understood that one among the powerful SENA cricket boards (South

Africa, England, New Zealand and Australia) was Shah's proposer and another one of these countries seconded the nomination. And he remained the lone contender on the last day of nominations. As per the ICC constitution, there are 17 votes -- 12 full Test playing

nations, chairman, deputy chairman, two associate member nominees and one independent female director. That he is a likely choice was evident when he was appointed the head of

ICC's most powerful sub-committee -- the Finance and Commercial Affairs (F&CA) in 2022. The timing couldn't have been better for Shah, who would have had to go on a mandatory cooling off period in 2025 for a period of three years til

The BCCI constitution allows office-bearers to stay in office for a cumula

tive period of 18 years -- nine in national board and nine in state units. But at a stretch, a person can remain office-bearer for a period of only six years after which a three-years cooling off period is necessary.

Shah, if all goes well, can have two terms in the ICC and come back to complete his remaining four years in BCCI in 2028 albeit as president of the

The immediate task facing Shah will be the conduct of the Champions Trophy in Pakistan.

It must be noted that Shah, as chairman of Asian Cricket Council (ACC) was a big supporter of the Hybrid Model where Pakistan and Sri Lanka co hosted the Asia Cup ODI event in 2023.

How ICC chairman Shah handles the matter remains to be seen considering that the Indian government might not allow the team to travel to

It is believed that the 'Hybrid Model' could again be the solution with Pakistan playing its matches at home and against India in Dubai.

The long term challenge would be to protect the future of Test cricket by having dedicated funds for the formats, keep ODIs sustainable and protect countries from losing core talent to freelancing in T20 leagues across the

Maintaining a calendar that is effective and allows players some breathing space along with means to earn well would also be high on his agenda.

Another important challenge is promotion of cricket in Olympics as it would make its debut at Los Angeles in 2028.

"While we will build on the valuable lessons learned, we must also embrace fresh thinking and innovation to elevate the love for cricket worldwide," Shah

"The inclusion of our sport in the Olympics at LA 2028 represents a significant inflection point for the growth of cricket, and I am confident that it will drive the sport forward in unprecedented ways," he added.

Bodies of two cloudburst victims recovered in Ramban, search on for 5 missing persons

RAMBAN/JAMMU: Two bodies, including that of a 12-year-old boy, were recovered on Tuesday as rescue operation continued in Jammu and Kashmir's Ramban district to trace five other missing people following a cloudburst, officials

The cloudburst occurred in Kumate. Panchavats Dhraman and Halla in Rajgarh tehsil late Monday afternoon, causing flash floods in Tanger and Dadi streams, they said.

Seven people of three different families were reported missing in the flash

floods, Tehsildar Rajgarh Major Singh told PTI.

Despite the inclement weather, the rescue team has so far managed to retrieve bodies of two persons --Yasir Ahmad (20) of Gadgram and Khalid Ahmed Parihar (12) of Suli-Kumate, Singh, who is supervising the rescue operation, said.

He said efforts are underway to locate the remaining five missing people --Ahmad's mother Naseema Begum (42) and sister Shazia Banoo (6), Parihar's mother Gulshan Begum (42) and sister Secrat Banoo (8), and six-year-old

Qazia Banoo of Dungar Dandllah.

The rescue team includes personnel from the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), local police and volunteers. Singh said that continuous rain has slowed down the rescue operation, as the rivulets are in spate. It took nearly three hours for the rescuers to reach the affected villages on foot, he added. At least two government schools at Gadgram and Sonsua, and a couple of other structures also suffered damages, while three parked private vehicles were washed away by the flash

SRINAGAR: Several former members of the banned Jamaat-e-Islami (JeI) Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday filed nomination papers to contest the Assembly polls in the Union Territory as independent candidates.

Sugra Barkati, daughter of jailed separatist worker Sarjan Barkati, also filed nomination papers on behalf of her father.

While Jamaat cannot take part in the elections due to the ban imposed on it by the Union home ministry, it had shown interest in participating in the polls during the Lok Sabha elections if the ban were removed.

Jamaat has not taken part in any elections after 1987 and had been a part of separatist amalgam Hurriyat Conference, which advocated for poll boycotts, from 1993 to 2003.

Talat Majeed, former ameer (chief) of Jamaat, filed his nomination papers from Pulwama constituency as an independent candidate.

Majeed said that after pondering over the changing geo-political scenario since 2008, he felt the need to shun some of the past "rigidities".

"In view of the prevalent geo-political scenario, I felt that time had come for us to take part in the political process. I have been expressing my views since 2014 very openly and I am taking that agenda forward even today,' he said.

Majeed said organisations like Jamaat and Hurriyat Conference have a role to play in the current political scenario.
