SRINAGAR: Three terrorists have been killed in two separate anti-infiltration operations along the Line of Control (LoC) in Kupwara district, the army said on Thursday.

Operations in the Machhal and Tangdhar areas were launched on Wednesday following intelligence inputs, it said.

In a post on X, the army's Srinagar-based Corps said, "Based on intelligence inputs with respect to likely infiltration bids, a joint operation was launched by the Indian Army and the Jammu and Kashmir Police on the intervening night of August 28 and 29 in the genarea Machhal, $_{\mathrm{eral}}$ Kunwara "
