CS reviews 'Har Ghar Tiranga' action plan, I-Day preparations

MP Khatana ensures rehabilitation support for Taraf Manji residents amid industrial area plans

JAMMU: In response to concerns from 'Taraf Manji' village, Kathua, where a new industrial area is proposed, Senior BJP leader and Rajya Sabha MP Dr. Gulam Ali Khatana has pledged full support for the local community. Khatana met with a 200-member delegation from the Gujjar community, including refugees and tribal members, led by Vardeep Singh. The delegation sought intervention regarding rehabilitation and compensation for those affected by the project.

Khatana informed the delegation that he had already discussed the matter with Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha and the Divisional Commissioner Jammu. He emphasized that rehabilitation

and compensation are essential components of the project. "Our government will not proceed with evictions without ensuring future provisions for the affected families," Khatana assured.

Highlighting the benefits of the industrial policy, Khatana stressed that it would create employment opportunities and protect local traders' interests. He praised LG Sinha for his constructive approach to development and assured the community that their concerns were being addressed. "Under PM Narendra Modi's leadership, all development projects are carefully supervised to avoid any citizen facing discomfort or forced eviction," he added.

The deputation, including notable figures such as Sturm

Din Khatana, Moulvi Saif Ali, and Wagh Hussain, expressed confidence in PM Modi's leadership, recalling past neglect of their needs by previous governments. They requested at least five kanal plots per affected family to rebuild their homes.

Khatana's proactive stance offers hope for a balanced approach to the industrial project, ensuring both development and community welfare. The interaction underscores the importance of transparent and inclusive planning, aiming to address the socio-economic impacts on local populations effectively.

The residents of Taraf Manji village are optimistic that their concerns will be addressed, and their voices heard in the development process.
