Watch out India! Congress wants repeat of Bangladesh to destabilize Bharat



Octavian founded 'Indian' National Congress will have to decide whether it continues to be an Indian political party or owes alle-

giance to forces inimical to India that is Bharat. Having ruled India for better part of over seven decades since independence and continuing to swear by the Constitution, the Congress has developed a sort of inertia against the nation, which is dangerously more pronounced now than ever before.

After the fall of Dhaka amid bloody radicalized mayhem in the guise of student protests over 'quota reservation', New Delhi must watch out. Top aide of the Gandhi family, former external affairs minister and senior Congress leader Salman Khursheed has sent out a warning,"...what's happening in Bangladesh can happen here (in India) also". Credited with having facilitated

settlement of illegal Rohingya Muslim immigrants in sensitive Jammu areas through coercive tactics, involving Raman Bhalla, the then J&K Minister for Revenue, Salman is known for pursuing communal politics. Bhalla has himself confessed this in private conversations with senior journalists, and at times, publicly bragged to satiate his vote bank.

Taking cue from his senior leader, chronic Modi baiter Mani Shankar Aiyer has also waded into muddy waters by terming Indian political situation akin to Bangladesh. This is not out of cuff remark but well calculated provocation at the behest of his mentors to engineer political instability in the country.

The warnings should not be brushed aside or put under the carpet just by describing it as 'signs of frustration or desperation on losing elections' as is being made out by some BJP leaders. The threat is for real. It has to be understood in the backdrop of certain recent developments if not what has been happening over the months and

years to finalise the 'regime change' script by inimical world powers in coalition with Indian political actors.

Self styled activist Yogendra Yadav is reported to have counseled Rahul Gandhi that the fight for 'preserving' democracy has to be fought on streets also. This might have bolstered the Gandhi scion so much that during the peak of Lok Sabha electioneering in April this year he threatened that the whole country will be on fire if 'the BJP wins these match-fixed elections'. India would have certainly been on fire had Modi's BJP crossed 272-mark. The script to bleed India went haywire when the election results made every political party to smile. Despite losing, the Congress and its INDI Alliance partners felt triumphed. They celebrated the Modi juggernaut halting at 240 seats. Waqf Bill referred to joint parliamentary panel

NEW DELHI: The Waqf (Amendment) Bill was introduced in Lok Sabha on Thursday and referred to a joint parliamentary panel after a heated debate, with the government asserting the proposed law did not intend to interfere with the functioning of mosques and the opposition calling it targeting of Muslims and an attack on the Constitution

Lok Sabha Speaker Om

Birla said he will talk with leaders of all parties for constituting the joint parliamentary committee.

Soon after Union Minority Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju sought leave to introduce the Bill, opposition INDIA bloc MPs strongly protested the introduction of the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, calling it "attack" on the Constitution and aimed at targeting Muslims.

Congress MP

Venugopal, who had submitted notice to oppose its introduction, accused the government of violating the right to freedom of religion and claimed the legislation was being brought with an eye on the upcoming assembly polls.

"This is a draconian law and a fundamental attack on the Constitution," Venugopal said. He said people taught the BJP a lesson -- in the Lok Sabha polls -- for


