EC finalises electoral...

finalized the Electoral College list for the Vice Presidential Election, 2025.

The Electoral College list will be available for purchase at a counter set up in the Election Commission office from the date of notification, which is likely to be announced soon, the poll body said. Dhankhar resigned as vice president on July 21, a little more than two years ahead of the end of his tenure. His term was to end on August 10, 2027.

According to Clause 2 of Article 68 of the Constitution, an election to fill a vacancy in the office of the vice president occurring due to his death, resignation or removal, or otherwise, will be held "as soon as possible".

The person elected to fill the vacancy will be entitled to hold office "for the full term of five years from the date on which he enters upon his office".

From the day the notification is issued, "calling the Electoral College to vote", and till the day of the poll, a period of 30 days is stipulated. A person cannot be elected as the vice president unless he is a citizen of India, has completed 35 years of age and is qualified for election as a member of the Rajya Sabha.

A person is also not eligible if he holds any office of profit under the government of India or a state government or any subordinate local authority.

question about his government's role in ensuring the safety of tourists in the wake of the Pahalgam attack.

Following the terror attack, all the tourism destinations were closed for security audit and reopened only after the authorities were satisfied on that front, Abdullah said.

He added that tourism in his union territory got affected after the Pahalgam terror attack, but asserted that people associated with the industry were not sitting idle either.

In one of the worst terror strikes in Jammu and Kashmir in recent history, 26 tourists, including several from Gujarat, Maharashtra and Karnataka, were killed at Pahalgam on April 22 this year.

Among them were Shailesh Kalthia from Surat, and the father-son duo from Bhavnagar Yatish Parmar and Smit Parmar. The attack also dealt a blow to Kashmir's tourism economy.

"I am not denying that the Pahalgam terror attack had affected our tourism industry. Because it happened in the beginning of the peak season and everyone left the state overnight after the attack. But Kashmir is not empty and we have not come here in despair.

"We just want more people to visit Jammu and Kashmir. So don't harbour any misunderstanding. Lakhs of people have already visited Kashmir for Mata Vaishno Devi Yatra and for Amarnath Yatra

(after the Pahalgam attack)," he said.

"Gujarat, Maharashtra and West Bengal are our biggest markets. Our message to all of them is that Jammu and Kashmir is not shut for tourism. It is open. I invite people of Gujarat to come there and enjoy our hospitality," Abdullah said. When asked to comment on US President Donald Trump's announcement to impose 25 per cent tariffs on Indian goods, the Jammu and Kashmir National Conference leader took a swipe at the Modi government, saying even they do not have any idea about what to do in this situation. "The central government never called me to take my opinion on how they can deal with the Trump administration. Nor do I think they know what should be done. Because even the Americans do not know what to do with Trump saheb," he added.

"No one knows what mood Trump would be in the morning. Today, he imposed a 25 per cent tariff on us, tomorrow he will say it should be 15, then it will come down to 5. We cannot make any policy in such a situation. Let it go on as it is," he said. After his arrival here, Abdullah held a meeting with Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel in Gandhinagar on Wednesday. "The meeting focused on deepening inter-state relations, promoting tourism and sharing best practices for inclusive development," Abdullah's office said in a post on 'X' on Wednesday.

Chugh asks new...

swipe at the Omar Abdullah-led government, Chugh reminded the party workers that nearly a year has passed since the new dispensation took charge, yet not a single promise from their election manifesto has seen the light of day.

"People voted in hope. What they got is disappointment. From youth jobs to infrastructure, it has been all talk and no delivery," he said.

Chugh also called for full mobilisation of party machinery for the upcoming 'Har Ghar Tiranga' campaign, stating that it is a celebration of India's pride and unity. "This isn't just a

symbolic act. It's a message to the enemies of India that every home stands with the nation," he said.

Referring to Operation Sindoor, Chugh hailed the success of India's security forces and underlined that the Modi government has zero tolerance for terrorism. "Whether it is terrorists or their sponsors-India under Modi will not spare anyone. Operation Sindoor has demonstrated India's resolve, reach, and readiness," he said.

Opposition's abstention from...

Minister from May 2004 to November 2005 in the Mamohan Singh government, said he is always in favour of the smooth functioning of the Parliament.

Recalling his first term in the Parliament, Azad said then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi advised him not to disrupt the speech of opposition leaders in the Parliament.

"Indira called me and told me 'you have come to the Parliament to speak and not create ruckus'. She told me that one cannot become a leader by not allowing an opposition leader to speak," he said.

On the April 22 Pahalgam attack, the former chief minister of the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir said the Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha has owned the responsibility for the security failure and the chapter closes there.

"I think that chapter has been closed. The LG has already said something about it and he has owned the responsibility and with that the matter should be closed," he added.

On the recent Operation Mahadev in which security forces killed three terrorists responsible for the Pahalgam attack, Azad said he supports every operation by the forces but there should be no human rights violations.

"I have always supported every operation by the forces even when I was the chief minister. Security forces had full freedom, but, I only had one condition that operations must go on, but there should be no human rights violations or fake encounters," he said. On the future of his Democratic Progressive Azad Party (DPAP), the former Union minister said he will take a call on whether to continue it or not.

"There is a chronic disease that when someone becomes a minister, he wants to remain a minister till he is alive. So, he hops from one party to another, and he will continue to do that till he becomes minister," he said referring to senior leaders of his party leaving the outfit.

"But, those who were not (ministers) and were DDCs, BDCs, there has been a three-fold increase (in joining the party). I have to decide whether to continue running it (the party) or stop because the politics in Kashmir mostly runs on emotions.

"My politics is based on truth and non-violence. I speak the

same thing in election and otherwise, whether in Jammu, Delhi or Srinagar. People may want me to speak different at different places, but I cannot do that," he added.

On the claims of the US President Donald Trump of having brokered the ceasefire between India and Pakistan after Operation Sindoor, Azad said he has no reason not to believe Prime Minister Modi. "Unfortunately, Trump speaks so many things. So, it is very difficult. The PM has made it clear on the floor of the House that this was our own decision and no country interfered. He has also mentioned about his talks with the vice president of America, with that the chapter is closed.

"I think we have no reason not to believe our Prime Minister. He is the elected prime minister of the country," the DPAP chief said.

Subject: Order under Section 163 BNSS for regulated disposal of waste in the vicinity of Jammu Airport to prevent bird hit hazard.
ORDER
 Whereas, it has been brought to the notice of this office by the Indian Air Force Officers and corroborated by the Airport Authority of India that indiscriminate dumping of garbage, waste material, and food items in the vicinity of Jammu Airport is attracting a large number of birds;

Whereas, such bird activity poses a serious and imminent threat to the safe operations of both military and civil aircraft operating from the Jammu Airport, thereby endangering the lives of passengers and crew, and the security of vital installations;

Whereas, given the urgent need to enhance safety at the Jammu Airport, and mitigate the public nuisance caused by unregulated waste disposal, it is imperative on part of the District Administration to prevent further unregulated garbage dumping in the designated areas and ensure that the threat of bird hits is mitigated;

Now, therefore, in exercise of powers vested in me under Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023, I, Sachin Kumar Vaishya, IAS, District Magistrate, Jammu, in the interest of public safety and national security,

- Do hereby prohibit the dumping of garbage, waste material, or edible refuse within a radius of one-kilometer of the Jammu Airport/Airbase, including but not limited to Belicharana, Satwari, Miran Sahib, and Phallian Mandal areas.
- All commercial establishments, eateries, vendors, and residential colonies shall ensure safe disposal of waste and these shall not leave food scraps or refuse in open areas.
- The Jammu Municipal Corporation, Cantonment Board, and Jammu Development Authority shall ensure immediate removal of open garbage dumps and erect proper signages discouraging dumping near water bodies, drains, and public lands near the airport.

It is further ordered that:

- Jammu Municipal Corporation, Jammu Development Authority and Cantonment Board shall ensure strict enforcement of this provision and shall immediately devise and operationalize a plan for daily door-to-door collection of segregated solid waste.
- The Jammu Municipal Corporation shall devise a time-bound plan for scientific management and disposal of waste in the area to ensure no open garbage dumps.
- The Block Development Officers of Satwari, Miran Sahib, and Phallian Mandal shall conduct regular inspections to enforce this order in locations falling under their jurisdiction.
- All concerned authorities shall ensure strict compliance with this order and submit a weekly action taken report to this office.
- Anyone found violating this order shall be liable to penal action under relevant provisions of the law.

This order is issued *ex-parte* in the interest of public safety and security, and shall be widely published through print, electronic and social media.

This order shall come into force with immediate effect and remain in operation until further orders.
