Former XEn penalized with Rs 21.85 lakh recovery for procedural lapses

JAMMU: In a departmental action, the Government has imposed a penalty of Rs 21.85 lakh on Rajinder Kumar Pandita, the former Executive Engineer of the Public Health Engineering (PHE) Division, Awantipora, for procedural violations and misuse of official authority in the award of construction works during his tenure between 2011 and

The action follows a longstanding caseVeri-HQ-ABP-32/2014 initiated on the recommendations of the Anti-Corruption Bureau (formerly Vigilance Organization), which alleged that Pandita had awarded works to preferred contractors without following mandatory tendering proce-

According to Government Order No. ISO-JK(JSD) of 2025, dated July 31, 2025, a detailed departmental inquiry confirmed that while no malafide intent could be conclusively established, the officer did act in violation of codal formalities, thereby eroding public trust in fair

The inquiry process, which included multiple reports and a change in the inquiry officer, revealed that works valuing Rs 218.50 lakh had been executed departmentally without proper approval and tendering. While the initial inquiry report suggested a minor penalty of five days' salary, the department, after further examination and financial review, found this insufficient.

The competent authority, Minister of the Jal Shakti Department, ultimately accepted the departmental recommendations and approved a penalty of 10 per cent of the assessed loss amount, i.e., Rs 21.85 lakh, to be recovered from the retired officer.

The government has invoked Rule-30(v) of the J&K Civil (Classification, Control & Appeal) Rules, 1956, allowing recovery from the pay of any pecuniary loss caused to the Government by negligence
