first goods train loaded with cement in Anantnag district of Kashmir is indeed an important and major achievement in the direction of transportation of goods by rail. Balbir termed the arrival of the freight train as a game-changer for the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir. He said, the reduction of transportation time from several days to just a few hours is not just a logistical feat-it is a lifeline for Kashmir's economy. Until now, Kashmir was dependent on expensive and long road transport for the movement of goods. But now that the railway line is available



for freight movement, local industries-especially horticulture and handicrafts-will get easy access to markets outside Jammu and Kashmir. He also said that the extension of the freight train to Anantnag symbolises the expanding rail network in Kashmir, which is part of the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) project. Rattan also said that shifting from road to rail transport would also benefit the environment. Less traffic on our highways means less pollution and safer roads. Reacting to the recent protest march by Congressled INDIA bloc MPs to the Election Commission over the revision of electoral rolls in Bihar, Dr. Chowdhary accused the grand old party of deliberately stalling the functioning of Parliament and diverting public attention from important legislative business.

"The Congress has reduced Prime Minister Narendra Modi remains committed to democratic processes and electoral transparency.

He criticized the opposition's allegations of "vote chori" and said that the Election Commission was an independent constitutional body whose credibility should not be undermined for political gain.

"The INDIA bloc is rattled because people have rejected them repeatedly. The EC follows due process, and instead of submitting their grievances in a constructive manner, Congress leaders are creating law-and-order issues in the national capital," remarked.
