Prime Minister Narendra Modi said his thoughts and prayers are with all those affected by the cloudburst in Kishtwar district and asserted that every possible assistance will be provided to those in need.

In a post on X, Modi said, "My thoughts and prayers are with all those affected by the cloudourst and flooding in Kishtwar, Jammu and Kashmir. The situation is being monitored closey. Rescue and relief operations are underway."

"Every possible assistance will be provided to those in need," the prime minister said. Lt Gov Manoj Sinha condoled the loss of lives in the incident.

"Anguished by cloudburst in Chositi Kishtwar. Condolences to bereaved families and prayers for quick recovery of the injured. Directed Civil, Police, Army, NDRF and SDRF officials to strengthen the rescue and relief operations and ensure all possible assistance is provided to the affected," he said on X.

Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh, Kavinder Gupta, has also expressed deep sorrow over the tragic loss of lives and conveyed heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families and prayed for the speedy recovery of those injured. He also prayed to the Almighty for the safety and wellbeing of all residents in the affected areas.

"Words cannot lessen the grief of the families who have lost their loved ones in this calamity. My prayers and thoughts are with them in this hour of profound sorrow. I also commend the tireless efforts of the rescue and relief teams working in difficult conditions to save lives, the Lieutenant Governor said.

Immediately after the calamity struck Chositi on Thursday, Kishtwar Deputy Commissioner Pankaj Kumar Sharma, along with the senior superintendent of police, mobilised rescue teams and headed towards the spot to personally supervise the operations

The Jammu and Kashmir administration has set up a control room-cum-help desk to assist people and pilgrims following flash floods triggered by a cloudburst in a village in Kishtwar. While a large-scale rescue operation was already launched by NDRF, SDRF, police, Army and local volunteers, the authorities have mobilised more rescuers, including two fresh teams of NDRF from Jammu to to speed up the rescue efforts, officials said.

Army's White Knight Corps said efforts are on to safeguard lives and aid the survivors. "In the aftermath of a cloudburst at Chisoti (Chositi) village, Kishtwar, troops of White Knight Corps swiftly mobilised for rescue and relief ops (operations). Efforts are centred on safeguarding lives and aiding survivors. Search for missing continues. Relief stores, medical eams and rescue gear rushed to site. We Serve, We Protect," the corps said in an X post. Officials said the langar was packed with devotees when the calamity struck.

"A massive cloudburst in Chositi area, which could result in substantial casualty. Administration has immediately swung into action, rescue team has left for the site," Union Minister Jitendra Singh said in an X post. The minister said he also spoke to Kishtwar Deputy Commissioner on the matter.

SC seeks Centre's response on plea for restoring J&K statehood

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Thursday sought a response from the Centre on a plea seeking the restoration of statehood to Jammu and Kashmir, saying ground realities, includ ing the recent Pahalgam incident cannot be ignored.

"You also have to take into consideration the ground realities... you cannot ignore what has happened in Pahalgam," CJI B R Gavai said when counsel including senior advocate Gopal Sankaranarayanan sought an early hearing.

The bench also comprised Justice K Vinod Chandran.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Centre, sought dismissal of the plea and said in the past too, the court had imposed costs on such pleas.

"Elections are held, my lords are aware of the peculiar position emerging from this part of the country and there are several considerations which go into decision-making," Mehta said. The bench posted the plea, filed by academician Zahoor Ahmad Bhat and socio-political activist Ahmad Malik, for hearing after eight weeks.

Sankarnarayanan, appearing for Bhat, said it had been 21 months since that judgment was passed by the Constitution bench on issues including the abrogation of Article 370 of the

"There has been no movement partly because, my lords fairly trusted the Union when they made this statement before the court that they will implement the statehood, Sankarnarayanan said.

Referring to the judgment, he said the bench did not address the issue in view of the assur ance given by the solicitor general that the statehood to Jammu and kashmir will be restored Sankaranarayanan said the bench had merely directed that restoration of statehood at the earliest and did not set any timeline

DB grants final 4 weeks in PIL on LG's MLA nomination powers, Centre slams 'political stunt'

JAMMU: The High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh has granted the petitioner in a high-profile Public Interest Litigation (PIL) four weeks' time to file a rejoinder in a case challenging the Lieutenant Governor's powers to nominate members to the Union Territory'

A Division Bench Comprising Justice Sanjeev Kumar and Justice Rajesh Sekhri noted that the reply on behalf of the Union of India has been filed. On the request of the petitioner's counsel, the court allowed four weeks to file a rejoinder affidavit, if any, and listed the case for September 26, 2025, cautioning that no further adjournments will be granted for pleadings.

The PIL, moved by Ravinder Kumar Sharma, Senior Vice President and Chief Spokesperson of the J&K Pradesh Congress Committee, challenges Sections 15, 15A, and 15B of the J&K Reorganisation Act. 2019. These provisions empower the LG to nominate two women, two rep resentatives from the Kashmiri Migrant community (including one woman), and one member from the displaced persons of Pakistan-occupied Jammu & Kashmir (PoJK). Sharma contends that the LG must seek the aid and advice of the Council of Ministers before making such nominations, terming the current process "ultra vires" to the Constitution's basic structure.

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), in its affidavit, seeking dismissal of the petition as "politically motivated" and "devoid of any actual cause of action," arguing that the LG's nomination powers are a statutory function exercised independently, quoting Supreme Court rulings in K. Lakshminarayanan vs Union of India (2020) and NCT of Delhi vs LG (2024).

Rejecting the petitioner's fears, the Centre stressed that no manipulation occurred during the 2024 Assembly polls and that the 2023 amendments introducing these provisions aimed to give long-denied representation to displaced and underrepresented communities. The government also termed as "misconceived" the claim that such nominations breach the sanctioned strength of the Assembly, fixed at 119 members (114 elected, 5 nominated).

The case came before the High Court after the Supreme Court, on October 14, 2024 declined to entertain the petition and directed the petitioner to approach the High Court. The matter will now proceed after the rejoinder is filed, with the court making it clear that there will be no further extensions.

Problem of stray dogs due to inaction of local authorities, says SC, reserves order

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Thursday said the "whole problem" of stray dogs in Delhi-NCR was a result of the "inaction" of local authorities which did "nothing" in implementing the Animal Birth Control Rules on sterilisation and immunisation of canines

A bench of Justices Vikram Nath, Sandeep Mehta and N V Anjaria, which was constituted to hear a suo motu case and some other pleas concerning stray dogs, reserved its verdict on the interim prayer for a stay on the directions issued by the apex court on August 11.

A two-judge bench on August 11, among other directions, ordered the Delhi-NCR authorities to permanently relocate strays from streets to dog shelters.

The bench had acted in the suo motu case initiated on July 28 over a media report on stray dog bites leading to rabies, particularly among children, in the national capital. "The whole problem is because of inaction of the local authorities. You frame rules in

Parliament. The government acts, rules are framed but no implementation is carried out cre ating problem which is standing today," the bench said on Thursday. The top court added, "On the one hand, humans are suffering and on the other hand, the ani

mal lovers want the animals also to be treated with dignity.' Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Delhi government, referred to data and

said in 2024, India reported around 37.15 lakh dog bites cases -- nearly 10,000 per day. Mehta also referred to a media report and said the World Health Organisation, using govern ment and other authentic sources, reported 305 dog-bite related deaths last year.

The bench observed the Animal Welfare Board of India, local authorities and the government had done nothing. "NGOs make a lot of noise but they don't know what they should actually be doing. The

should have been here earlier for implementation of those rules (Animal Birth Control Rules) Nothing is happening," it added. Everyone, the court said, who came before the court and filed intervention would have to own

responsibility. On August 11, a bench of Justices J B Pardiwala and R Mahadevan asked authorities in Delhi-NCR to start relocating all stray dogs from streets to shelters and asked the authorities to initially start by creating a shelter to house 5,000 dogs.

It warned of strictest action against those who obstructed the exercise and directed immedi ate creation of dog shelters or pounds and report about it within eight weeks
