Missing girl traced, reunited with family

Two drug peddlers nabbed with heroin

R S PURA: In a determined crackdown on drug trafficking and substance abuse, Jammu Police achieved one more success by apprehending a drug peddler and recovering approximately 5.48 grams of heroin (chitta) like substance near Gharani Ditch, Chakrohi, under the jurisdiction of Police Station R.S. Pura. Acting on routine patrolling duties, a police team from BPP Chakrohi led by PSI Majid Shafi, In-charge BPP Chakrohi, assisted by other police personnel and under the close supervision of SHO Police Station R.S. Pura, Inspector R S Parihar, spotted a suspicious pedestrian approaching from Gharani towards Chakrohi. Upon noticing the police party, the suspect attempted to flee but was swiftly overpowered and apprehended. The accused was identified as Sushil Singh @ Gabbar, son of Satpal Singh, resident of Balah, Tehsil Suchetgarh, District Jammu. On thorough search, 5.48 grams of heroin-like substance was recovered from his possession. A case FIR No. 170/2025 U/S 8/21/22 NDPS Act has been registered at Police Station R.S. Pura. The accused has been arrested. A police team of Police Station Gandhi Nagar, led by PSI Nadeem Akram assisted by police officials, under the close supervision of SHO Police Station Gandhi Nagar, Inspector Jai Paul Sharma while on routine patrolling duty, apprehended the accused person. The arrested drug peddler have been identified as Rohan Chidhe S/o Raj Kumar R/o Valmiki Colony, Jammu. In this connection, case has been registered at Police Station Gandhi Nagar FIR No. 182/2025 U/S 8/21/22 NDPS Act dated 16.08.2025. The accused person have been arrested, contraband seized and investigation is underway. The entire operation was carried out by SHO PS Gandhi Nagar, under the supervision of SDPO South, and overall supervision of SP South, Jammu.
