GANDERBAL: Two days after a 14-year-old girl's body was discovered by locals in Ganderbal district, her elder sister has been detained for the murder, police said.

According to police, the girl killed the victim in a fit of

The body was found on August 17 in the bushes at the Batsar-Sehpora area, triggering outrage among

Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP), Ganderbal, Khalil Poswal, said a case was registered and a special investigation team (SIT) was formed after the body's discovery

Forensic experts examined the scene and CCTV footage of the area was analysed which showed that the victim had gone out with her elder

The sister initially claimed that the victim was abducted by some people. However, upon thorough investigation it was found that her

Kishtwar cloudburst: Death toll rises to 65 with recovery of two bodies, search area extended

CHASHOTI: Two bodies were recovered in this cloudburst-hit village in Kishtwar district on Tuesday, taking the toll to 65, officials said, as the search operation was extended to cover a larger area on the sixth day.

The day started with the recovery of a mutilated body of a woman downstream, while sniffer dogs also helped trace a lower body part of another victim under the debris of a collapsed house, they said

Officials said that one more body and two body parts were recovered from different locations during the

However, the officials said the recovered parts are suspected to be of bodies that have already been recovered. The remains would be sent for a

The rescue teams are working at multiple locations, especially the major impact spot near a community



kitchen site, sifting through the rubble using heavy machinery, including earth movers, and sniffer dogs.

A cloudburst struck Chashoti, the last motorable village en route to the Machail Mata temple, on August 14, leaving a trail of death and destruc-

tion. Among the 65 dead, three are CISF personnel and one Special Police Officer (SPO) of the Jammu and Kashmir Police

A total of 167 people have been rescued, and 39 were still marked

Flashfloods in Poonch, Rajouri: Bodies of girl, boy recovered

JAMMU: The bodies of an eight year-old girl and a 20-year-old man, who were swept away in flash floods on Monday, were recovered in twin border districts of Rajouri and Poonch, officials said.

Massive operations were launched by the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), police, and locals to trace the minor girl and the man who were washed away in the rising waters of Suran River and Mubarakhpura Nallah in Poonch and Rajouri districts, they said.

The body of 20-year-old Atif Shah was recovered on Tuesday from Munawar Tawi at Kalhar-Dalogra, around 15 km downstream from the incident site, officials said.

Opposition announces former SC judge B Sudershan Reddy as VP candidate



DELHI: Former Supreme Court judge B Sudershan Reddy is the joint candidate of the Opposition parties for the Presidential polls, Congress Mallikarjun President Kharge announced Tuesday, as he called the upcoming election for the second-highest country's

office an "ideological battle". Reddy is a former judge of the Supreme Court and the first Lokayukta of Goa. He is also on the Board of Trustees the International Arbitration and Mediation Centre in Hyderabad.

Reddy will file his nomination on August 21.

The joint opposition would hold a meeting in the central hall of Samvidhan Sadan (old Parliament building) on Wednesday afternoon.

"All Opposition parties have decided to have a common candidate; the decision has been taken unanimously. I am happy that all opposition parties have agreed on one name. It is a big achievement for democracy," Kharge said. "Whenever democracy and the Constitution
